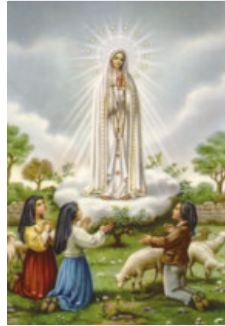
Mission Statement

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Depending on where you find statistical information you may obtain slightly different results, however, the

message is similar to this picture. If one hundred pennies represent the wealth of the world and four quarters represent the earth's population, then one quarter of the population controls 75-80% of the wealth, while three quarters of earth's population has access to/control of between 20-25% of the wealth available on earth. Wealth not only refers to money/financial security but also to property, products, natural resources, energy, and even food. For me, this is not only startling information but very disturbing. Looking deeper into the 25% who possess 75-80% of the wealth, reveals that somewhere around 1% of this population actually controls the largest percentage of the wealth. As for myself, retired and living comfortably in the United States of America, I am placed among that 25%. I own my own home, can pay expenses, possess an abundance of clothing, have excellent health care, have savings for unexpected expenses, a diet rich in fruits, vegetables, protein and yes sweet treats, clean drinking water, reliable transportation and ample opportunities to travel and visit family and friends. Conversely, 75-80% of the world's population survive at or below the poverty level, lacking sufficient wealth to insure adequate shelter, clothing, food, and health care for a safe, minimally comfortable existence. Being in the advantaged 25%, I am also part of the consumer society which utilizes the highest percentage of the earth's energy, and petroleum derived products. I am part of the throw-away culture, even though I consider myself a conscientious recycler; my trash bin contains waste products every week. I grow a tiny bit of food, but rely on others for most nutritional products. There are individuals involved in making sure electricity flows for my use, natural gas lines are safe, bringing energy to heat my home, water delivered through pipelines is potable, and yes my internet service is up and reliably functioning; I even carry a microcomputer with me at all times. Yet there are many among the 75-80% living below the poverty level, spread throughout the world, who have none of these things, who do not even have enough to provide for themselves and their children. Most days I feel frustrated with these great disparities, and unsure how I can make a difference. Jesus calls me to love and serve others, however, I wonder how I am I called. I try to consume less, share what I have, and am cognizant of how I use earth's resources. There are many ways each of us are called to serve, but first I believe we must acknowledge our own failures in ignoring our place as part of the global society. The problems I mention exist across the planet. Those of us who are part of the 20-25% can and must make a difference. Future generations depends on us and our faith calls us to act.

A Second Eucharistic Adoration Day is Being Planned For Wednesdays Sign Up Now

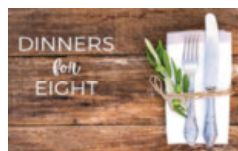

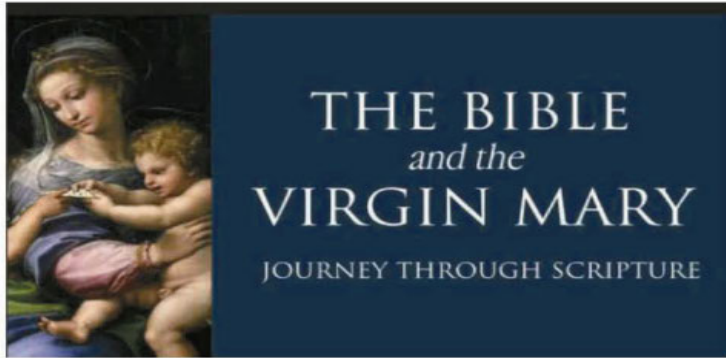
Dinners For Eight

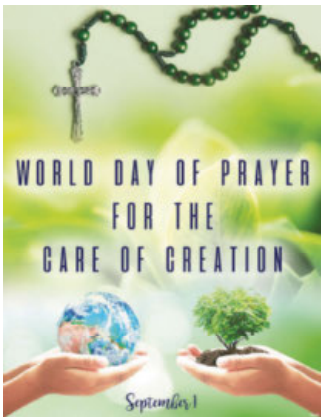
