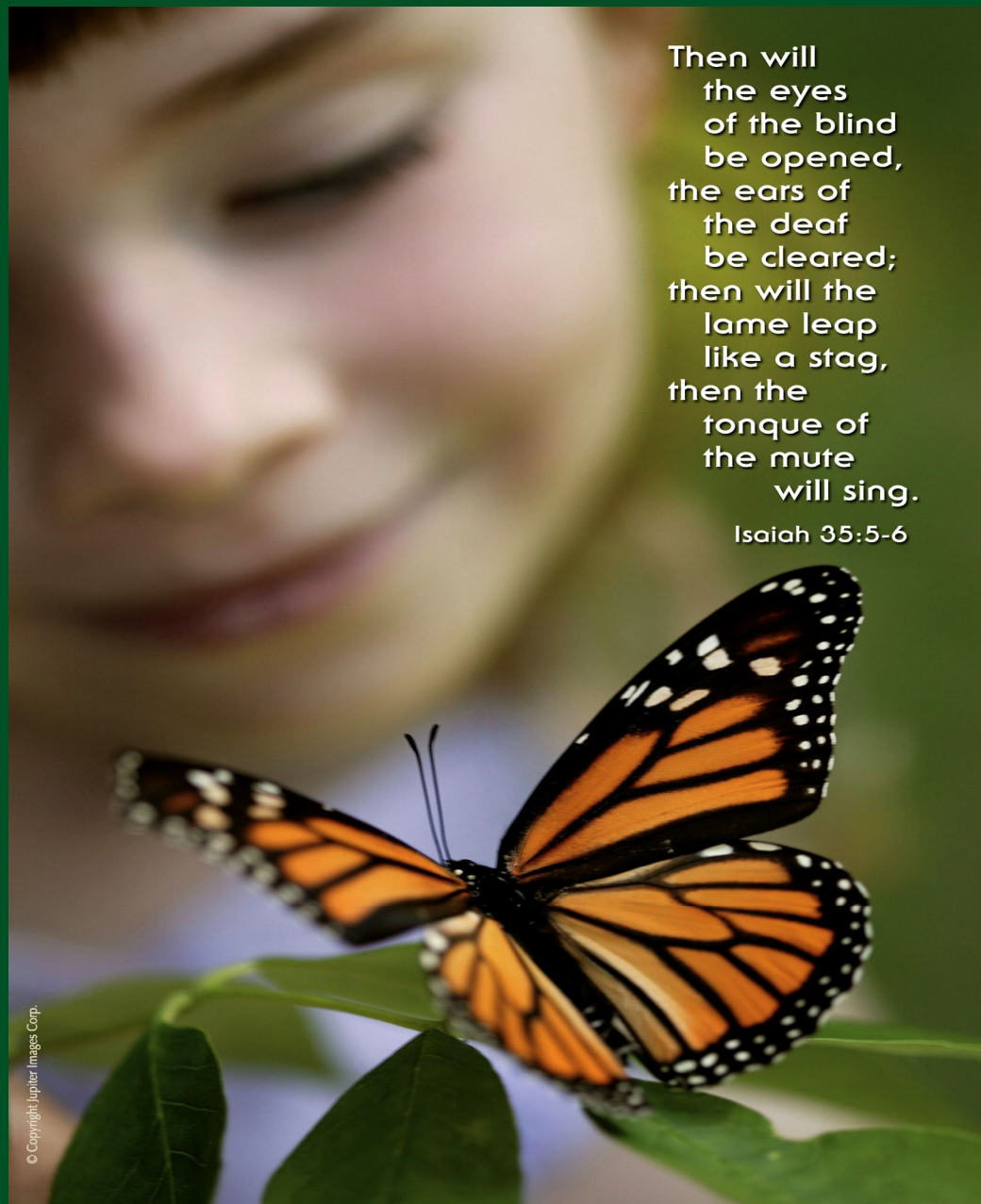

From the Pastor's Pen

On June 29, the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, Pope Francis stood on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica to lead the large crowd in the Angeles and to give a short talk to the people. He told the crowd: "The mission that Jesus entrusted to Peter is not that of barring the doors to the house, permitting entry to a few select guests, but of helping everyone to find a way to enter, in faithfulness to the gospel of Jesus. Heaven is for everyone, everyone, everyone. Everyone can enter." The keys that Peter received from Jesus should not be considered as a way of locking people out, but rather of opening the doors to them.

In a sense, every disciple of Jesus is a gatekeeper. Our mission is not to make it difficult for people to live as disciples, to be a part of the Church family, but rather to do everything we can to help people feel welcomed and wanted. We cannot force people to believe as we do, cannot use force or spiritual threats to make the choice of being disciples or being part of the family of the Church. Each person must make that choice freely. But we can influence others by our example and by our acts of kindness and welcome.

Our role is to be models of faith, to live the values of the gospel, and to always treat others with a spirit of welcome. That doesn't always happen. Let's say a two-year-old child is misbehaving during Mass. The mother sees people glaring at her. A lady behind her taps her on the shoulder and asks her to take the child to the cry room. Leaving her place, she feels embarrassed and hurt. It took a long time for her to return to Mass. Another person was new to the parish. Months passed and no one ever welcomed her or invited her to participate in parish organizations. Often we sing that popular hymn, "All Are Welcome," but sometimes those words ring hollow when people are not welcomed. With St. Peter let all of us be good gatekeepers of welcome. Everyone, everyone, everyone.

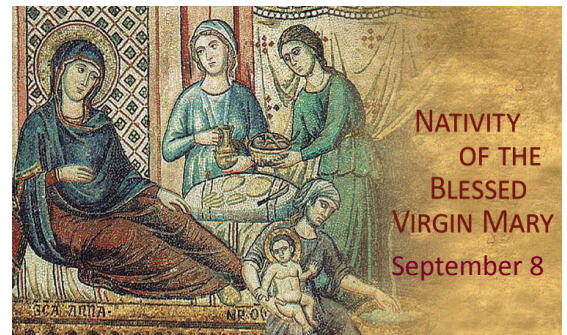

Someone is Watching and Wondering

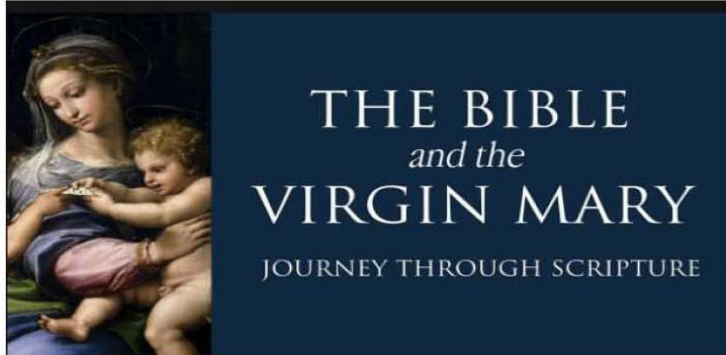


I do not know if my feelings are part of the aging process or simply the way my mind works, but recently I feel that I am living in two

worlds. I know there are many differences between the way I look at the world and my grandchildren's views. I know I differ from other adults of my generation regarding the role of government, gun control, health care, and educational opportunities. I realize, all too well, how my adult children are pulled in opposite directions and I often find myself caught in the middle. Reading reports on current events I wonder how much is true vs fabricated. Even in my church I feel conflicted between those with ideas for moving forward and facing challenges of our century and trying to understand others who seem to have a desire to return to "tradition," whatever that means. I feel discouraged by one world where hate and fear seem to motivate people, while at the same time encouraged by those who motivate and challenge me to understand and welcome diversity in all its many forms; to be part of a society that works for the common good, where kindness, compassion, empathy, and love are benchmarks.

On a spiritual level I feel there is the world of the present and the world of eternity. I speak to many people that tell me as a Christian I should live for salvation and my life in Heaven. My late husband Gene once wrote: "Over and over I would meet someone who told me I needed to be 'saved' and that as a Catholic I couldn't be saved." I know this was a challenge to Gene in much the same way my conflicted feelings of living in two worlds is to me. Gene further wrote: "To follow the way of Christ is to risk change in an adventure of faith. The better we get to know ourselves, the easier it becomes to know [love] and understand our creator." In reading Gene's words, I realize the God calls each of us in different ways to follow a unique path. I feel called to follow Christ through my interactions with so many people, especially (though it is not easy for me to admit this) people with different understandings, beliefs, ways of thinking, and ways of expressing their faith. Like Gene I have come to realize that my call has not been a single event but rather a life-long journey of conversion rooted in trusting a loving God to lead me in holiness; to show me the way in which I can love and offer the only thing I can, myself as self gift to others. My call involves change, sometimes moment to moment, adapting not to my self centered wants and desires but to the needs of those whom I encounter. God lives and acts through people. At times this is obvious while at other times more obscure. This is not only the God of creation, who gave us the son of salvation, and the Spirit of life but also the God who permits me to use the endearment, *Abba*.

Fees:

If you have not paid your fees, these can be paid at the parish office or placed in the offering basket at Masses. If placed in the offering basket, please use the RE envelopes or clearly mark the payment is for RE fees.

If you have children in multiple programs, all can be included in one payment. These are used to cover the costs of the materials used within the classroom throughout the year.
