





Someone is Watching and Wondering



In the nearly 30 years that I have accompanied people on their "Faith Journey," there are several common stumbling blocks; one is prayer. Some indi-

viduals ask "How do I pray as a Catholic," or state "My prayer life feels empty." Others are looking for methods of prayer (such as centering or contemplative) and still others question why their prayers remain unanswered. Please be tolerant with me as I share a few responses.

First the way **ALL** Catholics pray is through attending and actively participating in the Mass, the most common, communal prayer of the Church. We begin and end the Mass in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, therefore the Mass itself is one continuous prayer, with many other prayers embedded in it. For example, prayers seeking forgiveness, intercessory prayer, and the great Eucharistic prayer, and of course our prayer of the Mass ends by sending each of us, who have been nourished as a community through the sacred word and meal, forth into the world to share the truth of Jesus Christ. Go to Mass and you will pray like and with all Catholics throughout the world.

Second, if your prayer life feels empty, maybe you are saying too much and listening too little. I can honestly say that my prayer life feels rich and rewarding when I take the time to simply be with God, to experience God in the beauty and fullness of creation, whether being in nature, watching children playing, or sharing experiences, joy, and sometimes tears with others.

Third, I believe it is important to find a prayer life for which you take ownership. I do not believe it is necessary to copy or strive to pray in any particular, way in which you feel more stressed by the methodology and less aware of your connectedness to God. My prayer seems to change depending on how I feel, physically, mentally and emotionally, what is troubling me, and what I am seeking. Sometimes I pray with music, scripture, a piece of literature, a work of art, or by looking inward and sharing exactly what I feel with God. I find great help in this simple acronym: G.I.F.T. (A Well Built Faith by Joe Paprocki).

G - give thanks, **I** – identify needs, **F** – forgive and seek forgiveness, and T – think of others.

Finally, if you feel your prayers go unanswered there are two things to consider: 1. are you telling God what needs to happen or are you seeking God's will to help you through whatever is happening in your life, and 2. are you patient. Do you expect immediate results or are you willing to live within God's time. I confess I am not a patient person, but I am learning to trust God, knowing God loves me unconditionally and is always hears me.

As Catholic Christians, respect for ALL LIFE is a great part of our faith. Each October, Catholics nationwide celebrate Respect Life Month.

Respect for life is all encompassing. One of the misconceptions people have about respecting life is that it only applies to the unborn. Certainly, much of the work of Respect Life groups is devoted to protecting the most innocent lives from abortion, but respect for life doesn't stop with them.

As Pope Francis reminds us, "the innocent victim of abortion, children who die of hunger or from bombings, immigrants who drown in the search for a better tomorrow, the elderly or the sick who are considered a burden, the victims of terrorism, wars, violence and drug trafficking, the environment devastated by man's predatory relationship with nature are all issues. At stake in all of this is the gift of God, of which we are noble stewards but not masters."

The Respect Life Ministry shares this conviction voiced by Saint John Paul II, "A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world" and knows that leading and promoting prayer for life is our most important task. An anti-life culture can only be defeated by the God of Life.

What can we do in our daily life to respect life?

- Become informed about the issues and share your knowledge with relatives, friends, classmates, teammates and neighbors. Visit <u>www.usccb.org/</u> or <u>www.humanlifeaction.org</u> for federal and state voting records of your elected representatives.
- Fast one day a month in reparation for sins against human life.
- Commit to one hour a week in prayer for the sanctity of human life at Eucharistic Adoration.

- Join the St. James Respect Life Ministry that meets the second Monday of each month at 6:30pm in the Parish Hall (lower level of the church)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Missouri has strong pro-life laws protecting preborn children from harm or death, and women and families from the deeply emotional, spiritual, and physical wounds of abortion. On November 5, you will be asked to vote on Amendment 3 which aims to strip away these protections and enshrine an absolute right to abortion in our Missouri state constitution.

There are many alarming consequences to this extreme amendment, including:

- abortions for any reason before viability (usually in the sixth month of pregnancy) even when a preborn child
 is old enough to feel pain, resulting in extremely late-term surgical abortions;
- no parental notification or consent for any reproductive healthcare decisions;
- new health risks for women any "health care professional" could legally perform an abortion including a nurse, physician assistant, dental hygienist, or pharmacist;
- no civil or criminal recourse against negligence resulting in harm or death of a mother receiving reproductive healthcare or a wanted child during delivery;
- · an open door to force taxpayer funding of abortion, as is now happening in Michigan.

Pray

I believe the magnitude and gravity of the current moment requires a fervent spiritual response. For, to be honest, the present odds appear to favor the culture of death. Go to Mass and pray that God will save Missouri; pray the Rosary daily through November 5; invoke the intercession of St. Joseph who protected the infant Christ against the wickedness of Herod, and if you're able, practice fasting on Fridays.

Vote

I am urging you to vote "no" on Amendment 3 so that women and preborn babies continue to be protected in Missouri from the trauma of abortion and that Missourians will not surrender their rights. Share the facts about this alarming amendment with others.






