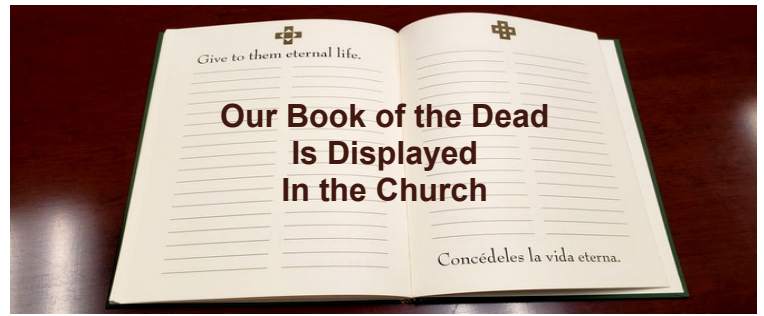
Mission Statement

From the Pastor's Pen

Our Catholic Church dedicates each month to a particular theme or intention. For example, the month of July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. In November our prayers are especially for those who have gone before us in death. Yes, our separation from those we love brings hurt and grief. Yet we have the consolation of the promise of Jesus: in the power of His resurrection the faithful have eternal life and peace. After our earthly life has ended, what comes next? There is controversy among Christian believers.

For some Christians, what comes after death: eternal reward or eternal punishment. There is no in-between. That is the common Protestant view. Catholics have a different doctrine. What does it mean to be worthy of eternal reward? The Scriptures seem to indicate that nothing defiled can come to eternal glory (*Rev. 21,27*). If there is some imperfection, some stain, some unforgiven fault that remains after death, some words or actions contrary to the great law of love, there must first be a cleansing, purification in order to be made ready to take one's place in the Kingdom of God. That is the meaning of the belief that Catholics call "purgatory."

We don't know the state of the soul of those who have died. The presumption is that for some of the deceased, love is not complete, full, honest. A cleansing is necessary. That is the purpose of prayers for the dead: to assist them in the journey to the fullness of the Kingdom of God. We have the Catholic practice of offering prayers for the dead, known as "suffrages." The remission of sins motivates the practice of offering Masses for deceased loved ones. Sometimes our prayers are more general as we pray for all the souls in purgatory. During this month of November, I commend to you prayers for the deceased.

This is also the beginning of National Vocations Awareness Week. Please beg the Lord for an increase of vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

During this year of endless campaigning, anger, frustration, and disagreement, I remember an individual running for state office coming to my door and asking



me what issue was most important to me. My answer was "**KINDNESS.**" When pressed further, I gave the same answer, "**KINDNESS.**" I think the candidate finally understood what I was meaning, and agreed that if elected officials were more open to one another, leading through respectful dialogue, offering different options based in fact, refusing to rob others of their dignity with cruel, slanderous remarks, working together, and searching for solutions for the common good, perhaps, just perhaps, legislation could be passed that embraces lasting social equality, freedoms, and justice for all. This is what I believe is inherently meant by kindness. I cannot speak for anyone but myself, in saying I am tired of name-calling, false accusations, casting blame, and stalemate which seems so pervasive in our local, state, national, world, even our church leadership; actions equally expressed by good, honest, ordinary people in their day to day living and decision making.

Are humans born kind, or is kindness a learned behavior? Many assume that kindness is something children pick up by "osmosis" because we love them. In a similar fashion we often assume and expect people to be kind without ever talking about it. We assume because someone appears to be moral, they will also be kind. Research in the field of psychology, however, has shown that kindness is complicated. Although we are wired at birth for both kindness and cruelty, choosing altruism is not inevitable. Rather altruism is a skill, a formed habit, for which we have the power and responsibility to foster, in ourselves and others, one good deed at a time. Jesus lived and taught his followers this message. Jesus touched and healed lepers, drove demons from those possessed, touched the blind, deaf, and mute relieving their suffering, lifted the lame to walk, embraced sinners offering love and forgiveness, calmed storms replacing the fear of his disciples with awe and wonder. Jesus continues to offer healing, forgiveness, compassion, and love to people today, but there is a cost to those who answer his call, as disciples: "love and serve one another, even as I love and serve you." Are these words not a call to each of us who profess Jesus as our Lord, to **move** away from our selfish, self centered ways, our need to always "**BE RIGHT/JUSTIFIED,**" striving to satisfy our own wants and desires while neglecting the needs, rights, and freedoms of others? How is it possible to follow Jesus in faith without compassion and care toward others? My understanding of sacred scripture is that our faith is evidenced not through self-centered piety, and isolation within the church, but through living in Christ and being open to following God's will in our lives.

As a young child in Sunday School I was taught and required to memorize these words of Jesus: "Treat others as you want others to treat you." Even then I knew in my heart that others meant everyone, all, not just my friends and family. I truly believe our world can be a better place, if we, who embrace Jesus, also follow him.

Parish Religious Education

PreK-5th Grade

This past weekend, many of the classes spent time learning about All Saints Day and All Souls Day. Our second and fourth grade participated in games as part of their learning. Our third-grade class is working on learning the Apostles Creed. Parents – please help work at home with them to memorize and understand the meaning of this prayer.

Mornings are a little cooler, so please be sure your child(ren) are dressed to go outside. We are finding many of them enjoy the outdoor learning classroom.

Did you know? October was the month of The Holy Rosary, but it is an opportunity to strengthen our family and to get in touch with the deepest desires in our souls for God. So, how do we pray the rosary? Begin on the crucifix and make the sign of the cross and then pray the Apostles Creed. On the next large bead, pray the Our Father. On the following three small beads, pray three Hail Mary's. On the chain, pray the Glory Be. On the large bead, meditate on the first mystery and pray the Our Father. Pray a Hail Mary on each of the 10 smaller beads. On the chain, pray the Glory Be and the Fatima Prayer. Repeat each decade, until you reach medal in the center. Finish by praying the Hail, Holy Queen and closing prayer.

Middle School



Our youth had a great time starting class with only using one word each, in a circle, to create a story about Kansas City, cheese, and eventually to

telling the story of Noah's Arc, as well as Abraham and Isaac.

We had a great discussion around Christianity, and if we were asked to explain what we believe in, what would that be? This led to a discussion of the Nicene Creed and breaking it down to our profession of faith.



Parents, please work on this prayer at home with the kids. Show them where it is in our books at Mass. Talk to them about the many things in our sanctuary that remind us of these beliefs every time we attend Mass.

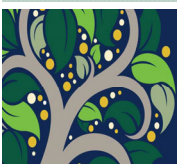

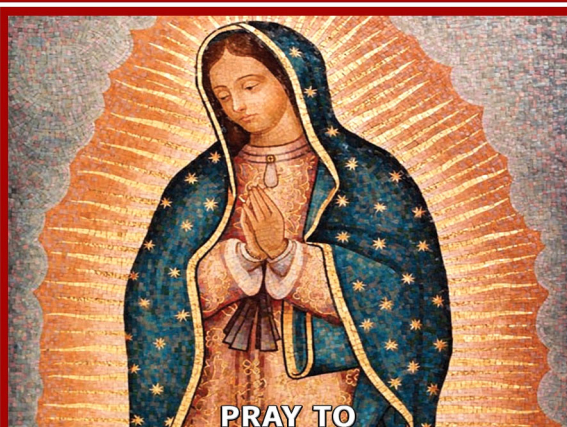
