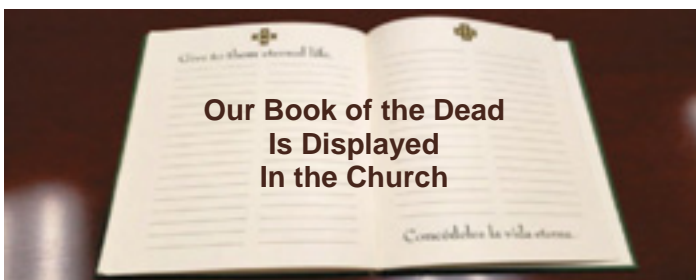

This month our 'Book of the Dead' is displayed near the Baptismal Font at the back of the church with the names of loved ones who died and have been buried from St. James this past year.

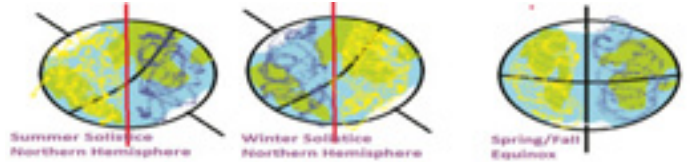

Honoring all who served

Someone is Watching and Wondering



If my writing has seemed a bit dark the past few weeks, I apologize to each of you. Please also stay with me today as the science geek side of me takes over my thought processes. Perhaps I can explain myself, my current mental state, and emotions.

I know it is no surprise to anyone that the days are getting shorter and with a return to standard time, perhaps you also have the sense that the sun is present for fewer and fewer of your waking hours. In reality it wouldn't matter how we count or record time, daylight is shorter. What is true is the tilt of our planet continues to change on a regular, daily pattern such that as winter approaches the hours of daylight do become shorter while the hours of darkness increase. In our hemisphere, the longest night or Winter Solstice will occur this year on Saturday, December 21. The word "solstice" is derived from two Latin words: *sol* for sun and *sistere* - to stand still. At the solstices, the sun as it appears from earth seems to stand still before reversing its tilt. After the winter solstice, therefore, the hours of daylight will be ever so slightly longer each day. Do my feelings reflect this increasing darkness? Perhaps, but I believe something more powerful is happening to me.

I write these words one week before "Election day" and have no idea who will become our new leaders. In truth I have concerns not only about the direction in which our country will move but also about the divisions that appear to separate and divide us. I am concerned about many things, both personal and universal such as never ending violence, global warming and climate change, homelessness, people living in hunger, fear, and pain, and children without educational opportunities. Even these issues, however, do not fully embrace my current state of being. I feel my life, self-centeredness, and ego are somehow falling into a dark pit, as I am being challenged to surrender to the true light, Christ Jesus. I am at a point where I can honestly state: "I don't know; I don't have the answers; I cannot fix everything or everyone; I need to let go." These words do not imply that I am losing my mind or the ability to solve problems or interact with others on a spiritual or intellectual level. What I am trying to convey is that I am seeking to trust God enough, to be God; that through God's love and grace I may draw nearer to an honest, open relationship which allows me to put my life in God's care. I cannot see or know God except through my experiences and understanding of creation, those who have touched my consciousness, and though the vague and incomplete images that exist in my mind. What I am discovering and calling "my darkness of unknowing," is that my relationship with God is painfully, yet steadily increasing. I sense God's presence and my eyes seem to be seeking the eyes of Jesus. I am drawn to His light, much I am drawn to look at the sun; yet in looking directly at the sun, only darkness surrounding me. I seek Jesus in my darkness.

Hillcrest Hope (HH). Hillcrest Hope's mission is to empower the homeless and working poor to achieve personal independence through transitional housing, accountability, education, and community support. Veterans Day, observed annually on November 11, is a tribute to military veterans who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. This is not to be confused with Memorial Day, which honors those who died while in service, Veterans Day honors all military veterans, including those still with us.

Veterans Day, originally celebrated as Armistice Day, was first issued on November 11, 1919 by President Woodrow Wilson a year after the end of World War I. The purpose of Armistice day was to honor the fallen soldiers of The Great War for their sacrifice and bravery. Seven years later in 1926, Congress adopted a resolution requesting President Coolidge issue annual proclamations on November 11, making Armistice Day a legal holiday.

At this Sunday's 10:30am Mass there will be a presentation of the Fr. Capodanno Service Award and a blessing upon all veterans and their families.

Following, all are invited to the Parish Hall for refreshments and mingling.

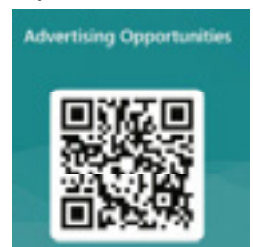

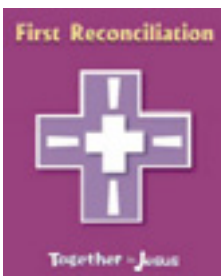
