



### From the Pastor's Pen

One of the very good Catholic magazines is "America, a Jesuit Review of Faith and Culture." Often provocative issues are featured which challenge the reader to analyze and reflect on Church liturgy and issues, facets of culture, and book reviews.

The October 2024, issue featured an interesting article, "How Can We Make the Liturgy More Reverent?" In fact, one of the recommendations of the first meeting of the Synod on Synodality was to explore the quality of liturgies in our Catholic Church. It is a somewhat controversial topic. What one person judges to be an indication of reverence may be entirely different from how another person evaluates the quality of liturgy. The basis for judgment really should be the "Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" document of the Second Vatican Council. A key sentence from the document says: "Mother Church earnestly decrees that the faithful be led to a full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy...a right and obligation by reason of their baptism." In the article, two Catholics reflect on their experiences and expectations and share in conversation with much agreement but sometimes with a different point of view.

There are, of course, different opinions about what makes a liturgy, especially the Mass, a reverent experience. The heart of the liturgy is praying together, as opposed to private or devotional prayer. The liturgy includes communal prayer, music, gestures, words, actions, symbols, rituals. To be "reverent" means that full attention be focused on God, true devotion, respect, awe, honor, homage, praise.


When we are reverent, we try to avoid distractions, remain focused, act not to draw attention to ourselves, but to keep God at the center of the words, actions, and times of silence. We are not merely "going through the motions," but with sincere and genuine attention. We strive for that reverence.

We ask our entire parish family to add these children and their parents to their prayers, asking that in the sacrament they are wrapped fully in God's loving mercy.

### Someone is Watching and Wondering



Please be patient with me as I continue to share my faith journey. Perhaps I left the impression with last week's writing that I am entering into or leaning on my Christian belief in the eschatological future. I do not believe this is the case. For me to do that would be a form of spiritual escapism, a delusion that looks for relief from my present condition or situation, on a future where everything will be exactly as I envision, with God in Heaven. In fact this is a denial of authentic Christian teachings which demands something on my part. Knowing God in the present insists on the inclusion of my difficult uncertainties, confusions, and seeking of truth.

In the "Constitution on the Church in the Modern World", Gaudium et Spes, the Second Vatican Council made clear that the primary purpose of civil governments is the protection and promotion of the common good. This document further states that those who disregard earthly responsibilities to our neighbors, especially the most vulnerable, because of distorted focus on the next life, are not living out their Christian faith appropriately.

"They ARE mistaken who, knowing that we have here no abiding city but seek one which is to come, think that they may therefore shirk their earthly responsibilities." I cannot, therefore, as I move from personal darkness into Christ's light, naively hope for something better in the world to come. I must embrace my earthly responsibilities, seeking truth and working for the common good of all people. It is in seeking and trying to understand how God is calling me that I currently find myself confused. I have written about kindness, compassion, and empathy over the past few weeks, and I try to embrace these qualities. I feel, however, that I am being called to more. For many years I have walked with others on their journey of faith; I have listen to people share their grief, sorrows, disappointments, frustrations, and concerns. I have served to educate others about the sciences, facilitated trainings to provide safe environments for our children and youth, lead Bible studies, prepared many to receive the Sacraments, and offered spiritual direction to fellow seekers, yet I still feel God is calling me to do more. As I let go of an attitude of knowing my own path, I ask each of you to pray with me for direction and guidance. I offer myself in service to God and dare to address God as "Our Father, abba. We are all joined as sons and daughters of God, therefore, let us work together for unity and understanding.

This week we are highlighting six organizations:

Liberty Women's Clinic (LWC). Since 2002, LWC has been serving the needs of young women and families in our community by providing free pregnancy resources in a safe, accepting environment. LWC's objective is to help women make informed, life-affirming choices. LWC does not refer nor provide abortions. Your donations will continue to support LWC in its efforts to help needy mothers during their pregnancies.

Journey to New Life (JNL). JNL was founded in 2013. Its mission is to maximize quality of life for men and women returning to the community from prison. JNL helps these individuals reintegrate into the community, providing a welcoming place that offers respect while assisting with basic necessities, hous-

ing, and job assistance. Each year JNL serves approximately 2,000 people, including individuals with substance abuse and mental health conditions. Your AGT donations will continue to help provide funding for these valuable services.

Kansas City Indian Center (KCIC) operates as the metro area's only social service agency for American Indians. KCIC's mission is to encourage social, educational, and economic advancement of the American Indian community by promoting traditional and cultural values. Your AGT donations will continue to help support KCIC's food pantry and emergency assistance program.

Love, INC is a partnership of local Christian churches that have joined together to provide volunteer and financial support to the poor. Love, INC provides families with financial assistance and monthly care plans, and in many cases provides emergency rent or utility assistance. This year, AGT will again provide Hope gift cards to assist Love INC in creating gift bags that include fun Christmas items, as well as gift cards to help families purchase food or clothing.

Avalon View Health and Wellness (Avalon View) is a senior living and rehabilitation center in Liberty. Last year, through AGT, we used your donations to purchase small essentials, as well as some fun items for residents. The 87 residents were allowed to choose items they needed or wanted through a "Christmas shopping experience". This approach was well received, and we plan to do it again this year.

**Cedars of Liberty** is a retirement and assisted living facility in Liberty. As with Avalon View last year, we used AGT donations to gift 100 Cedar residents with small essentials and some fun items. Residents loved this approach, and we plan to do it again this year.

### St. Cecilia Feast Day ~ November 22

For centuries St. Cecilia has remained one of the church's most beloved saints. However, all we know about Cecilia comes from a fifth-century legend that

has no historical evidence to support it, except that the two young men featured in the story, Valerian and Tiburtius, were known to have been martyred in the third century and buried in the catacombs. However, no catacomb grave or contemporary writer validates the fascinating tale of St. Cecilia.



According to the story, despite her vow of virginity, she was forced by her parents to marry a nobleman named Valerian. During the wedding, Cecilia sat apart, singing to God in her heart, and for that she was later declared the saint of musicians. When the time came for her marriage to be consummated, Cecilia told Valerian that she had an angel of the Lord watching over her who would punish him if he dared to violate her virginity but who would love him if he could respect her maidenhood.

When Valerian asked to see the angel, Cecilia replied that he would see the angel if he would go and be baptized by Pope Urbanus. After his baptism, he saw an angel standing by the side of Cecilia, and crowning her with a chaplet of roses and lilies. Valerian's brother, Tiburtius, also converted. Because this was during the time of the Roman persecutions, the two new Christians were caught and beheaded for burying the bodies of those who had been martyred.

Cecilia was condemned for refusing to worship the gods. An attempt to suffocate her in her own baths failed. So a soldier was ordered to behead her, but he bungled the job. Cecilia lay dying for three days.. She is said to have perished in Sicily under the reign of Marcus Aurelius between the years 176 and 180.




## COUNSELING / SPIRITUAL DIRECTION
