



Someone is Watching and Wondering



Once again this year I feel great sadness that although people throughout the world are praying for an end to violence and war, peace seems to remain elusive. Perhaps.

The **PEACE OF ADVENT** is something different. Following the Lord's prayer in the liturgy of the Eucharist, the priest proclaims, "The peace of the Lord be with you always." We respond "And with you Spirit." The priest or deacon then says: "Let us offer each other the sign of peace." Since 2020 this sharing of peace has taken many forms, many deviating from the traditional sign of peace: a handclasp or handshake, which is an expression of peace, communion, and charity. Note the last words: an expression of peace, communion, and charity. In other words we are not only asking for but sharing the grace and reconciliation of God which Jesus gave to us through His teaching and example. The peace we offer and accept comes only through our relationship with Jesus, our understanding of communion with other human beings, and our willingness to share God's charity through our actions, behaviors, and thoughts. If we become active seekers of His Peace, and willingly share it with all humankind, then perhaps the end to violence and war for which we pray will become a reality. Unfortunately, the **Peace of Jesus** seems all too often to interfere and conflict with my thoughts, actions, and words toward those with divergent thoughts, actions, and words. How is it possible to offer the Peace of Christ to someone who appears to me to be misquided? Yet, that is what Jesus asks me to do. I need to reconcile with my brothers and sisters, seek common ground, and work for social justice. This doesn't mean all differences will disappear, but it does suggest that compromise is possible if we act in love towards one another as Jesus commanded: "Love one another even as I have loved you. Coming together in love and understanding, in my humble opinion, is the only way in which we can experience the **Peace of Advent**, an inner peace which strengthened by the Holy Spirit abides within our hearts. I believe reconciliation and peace are steps which I must take so that my "soul is healed." I can seek God's healing, but I realize that I also must change; I have to open myself and be diminished so that Jesus can increase within me. I also believe my relationship with Jesus is more important than acquired brain knowledge of Jesus. I have known people who claim to be atheists, who have an amazing knowledge of scripture, especially concerning Jesus and His teachings. They, however, lack a willingness to let go. Their ego is stronger than the desire for inner peace and a loving relationship with Jesus. I have walked this dark path myself, but through the persistent call of Jesus, I have a new sense of His light and love leading me to peace and fullness of life.

The Meaning of the Advent Candles



Each of the four colored candles in the Advent wreath represents a week leading to Christmas. Traditionally, three of the candles are purple, and one is pink. The final candle is white and is located in the center of the wreath. It is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

It was once a tradition for

the pope to give someone a rose on the fourth Sunday of Lent before Easter to "liven up" the somber tone of the season. Before the mass commercialization of Christmas, Advent was also a solemn time, as people fasted to prepare for the holiday. The rose custom became part of the third Sunday of Advent. Eventually, the third candle turned pink as well.

The candles are traditionally lit in the following order: purple, purple, pink, purple, white.

The first is called the "Prophecy Candle" and represents Hope. It reminds us of the hope the prophets and the people had for a savior.

The second is called the "Bethlehem Candle" and represents Peace. It symbolizes the peace that Christ's first Advent brought to mankind that fateful night in an almost forgotten stable in Bethlehem.

The third is called the "Shepherd's Candle" and represents Joy. It reminds us of joyful anticipation of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the wise men.

The fourth candle, the "Angel's Candle," represents Love. It reminds us of the ultimate love of God that He might send His only Son for us.

The "Christ Candle," the white candle in the center, stands for Jesus Christ himself.



What Is The Immaculate Conception?



On December 9, we honor Mary, our Mother. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a Catholic feast celebrating Mary's conception without sin. Even though this feast day occurs in the liturgical season of Advent, which prepares for the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Immaculate Conception refers to the conception of

Mary in the womb of her mother, St. Anne.

The Immaculate Conception should not be confused with the perpetual virginity of Mary or the virgin birth of Jesus. It refers to the conception of Mary, by her mother, St. Anne.

The dogma of the Immaculate Conception asserts that, "from the first moment of her conception, the Blessed Virgin Mary was, by the singular grace and privilege of Almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of Mankind, kept free from all stain of original sin.

The observance of this feast began with a Papal encyclical by Pope Pius IX, when he formally defined the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, IN-EFFABILIS DEUS, on December 8, 1854. Several years later, in 1858, the Blessed Mother gave her name to St. Bernadette at Lourdes stating, "I am the Immaculate Conception."






