



Someone is Watching and Wondering



Once again we come to the last Sunday of Advent where the focus is **LOVE**. In many cultures and languages there are different words to describe emotions, feelings, or expressions for our one English

word love. For example if I am expressing love for people in Spanish I would use *amo*, while to say I love an object or an action I would use *encanta*. In Greek the most commonly used terms are: *philia* referring to deep friendship, *eros* to romantic or passionate love, *pragma* a deep enduring love, *storge* familial love, *agape* selfless, unconditional, universal love. To express these meanings in English we might add an adjective such as "faithful love." As we look at today's focus, however, what is meant by **Love**?

A close friend recently recommended that I read The Road Less Traveled by M. Scott Peck, published in 1978. Although I previously read this book I forgot many of the concepts. Dr. Peck, in writing of love, traditional values, and spiritual growth states: "The experience of real love has to do with ego boundaries. When we extend our limits through love we do so. . .by reaching towards the beloved. . ." He further writes: "we must be attracted toward, invested in and committed to an [individual] outside of ourselves, beyond the boundaries of self. . .we also incorporate a representation of that individual into ourselves." Thus a gradual dying to self, living for the other, while also incorporating the other into my very being, I believe is what it means to love Jesus. My ego becomes less as Jesus grows within me. As a child, when my ego was small, I fell in love with

Baby Jesus. As an adult my ego grew and my need for Jesus seemed to diminish. Now as an elder, my ego seems less and less important and it is easier




and easier to allow Jesus into my life, be open to His will, and surrender to His unconditional, freely given **Love**. A day without Jesus as my center is a day without meaning, filled with doubts, dark emotions, and a sense of emptiness.

During this Advent Season and approaching Christmas I realize that God is incarnate within me, my soul rejoices in Jesus, and I know He loves me, the person created in the image and likeness of God, even when I fail to live as He taught.

Reflecting On The Manger



The story of the birth of Jesus, as told to us by Luke, is full of joy in the midst of great conflict and sadness - even irony and rejection. It prepares us for the scandal of the cross by helping us see, in such a beautifully told story, that Jesus' mission is revealed to us, in how he came to us - in poverty and humiliation.

There, in the hay, we begin to know. There, in the manger, we begin to understand. Our God is revealed to us by coming in the lowliest of possible places. It is a meditation for our whole lives.

This story is here to bring us light in the midst of any darkness, poverty, he comes, the Good News is also a rejection, emptiness, sinfulness we experience. By reminding us of where he where revelation of who we are. We are the "people who walk in darkness." We are people who experience parts of our lives as dry and unwelcoming as that hay. We are people who, on our own, not only fail to know

and understand; we are capable of tremendous infidelity and stubborn independence.

We get our word "manger" from the Latin (and so French, Italian, Spanish) root, which means simply "to eat." Jesus comes, into the greatest place of our poverty, not only to be "with us" but to nourish us. The manger can be the place we go this Christmas to be fed with the acceptance, love, and peace we need. There is no place of darkness in which we need ever feel alone. There is no situation, no loss, no tragedy that need ever leave us empty. There is no sin, no matter how selfish that will ever leave us apart from God's love.

We have prayed, "Come, Lord Jesus. Come and visit your people. We await your coming. Come, O Lord." Now, our eyes are opened to the wondrous joy of his coming to us in that manger 2,000 years ago, so that we will know and understand his coming to us in our hunger today, and ultimately so that we will long for his final coming to bring us to the banquet that has been prepared, to fill all our longing.

If you have a large mower, in good condition, and you are looking to donate it somewhere, then we want to hear from you.






