

From the Pastor's Pen

Infant baptisms are so special to parents, grandparents, and other family members and friends. Nearly all Catholics parents, whether active in the practice of the faith or not, recognize the importance of the sacrament. In the gospel of John (3,15) we read the words of Jesus: "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and the spirit." You may ask: "What about those who lived before Jesus or those who have no opportunity to hear the word of God?" We will leave that discussion for another time

As we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of Jesus today, the crucial question might be: "Why did Jesus, sinless and the very Son of God, request baptism? Even John questioned: "I need to be baptized and you come to me?" (Mt. 3,14) Several reasons are given. First, by baptizing Jesus, John was declaring that Jesus was the one the people of Israel were awaiting. Second, when Jesus entered the water he identified with the people, declaring himself to be one of them. Third, it showed that Jesus approved of John's act of baptizing. Fourth, his baptism was the occasion of testimony of the Heavenly Father that Jesus truly was the Son of God.

So we come back to the question of infant baptism. Babies can't decide to be baptized. Parents must make and accept responsibility for the decision. I'm not sure that all parents understand the full implication of their decision. It's not a matter of going through the motions, of doing something you're supposed to do. What really matters is that the infant is re-made in the image of Christ, and that the infant is initiated into the Christian community. It doesn't make much sense to go through the ritual without sincerely pledging to raise the child with the knowledge and values of the faith. Such knowledge is best shared by example, by striving to live the life of discipleship. If the child is initiated into the life of the Church, then the parents must value and live the fullness of life in the Christian community.

Much more needs to be said about adult baptism, but that, too, will have to wait until another time.

Jubilee 2025 ~ Pilgrims of Hope



The theme for the 2025 Jubilee Year is "Pilgrims of Hope".

The year that began on December 24, 2024 and ends on December 23, 2025 is a period of economic, cultural, environmental, and communal reset; forgiveness of sins,

reconciliation between adversaries, conversion and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and solidarity, hope, and justice.

The Jubilee year logo pictured above shows four stylized figures to indicate all of humanity from the four corners of the earth. They are each embracing another, indicating the solidarity and brotherhood that must unite peoples.

The logo has multiple meanings, including:

Solidarity

The four stylized figures in the logo embrace each other, representing the brotherhood and solidarity that should unite all people.

Faith and hope

The figure in the front of the logo holds onto a cross, which is a symbol of faith and hope. The cross is shaped like a sail, which is another sign of hope.

Pilgrimage

The choppy waves under the figures symbolize that life's pilgrimage is not always calm.

Anchor

The lower part of the cross is elongated and turned into an anchor, which is a metaphor for hope. Anchors bring confidence and security in life.

Communal journey

The image itself shows how the pilgrim's journey is communal, with the signs of a growing dynamism that moves more and more toward the Cross.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Perhaps when reading my words over the past month or so, you have picked up on my feelings of discouragement in searching for new direction and goals for this period of my life. I sensed a darkness surrounding me and yet I also felt blessed and loved by God. I believe God will

show me whatever I need to know, while also realizing that I must be patient and not sink into hopelessness and despair. (Patience and trust do not come naturally for me; I think I must be active and achieving all the time.)

I spent part of Advent on a seven day retreat with Thomas Merton. The redings and reflections seemed to be directed at my inner most feelings and provided time for discernment. Following that week long retreat, I returned to reading his words in New Seeds of Contemplation. Once again it seemed that Thomas Merton was answering so many of my questions: "In order to become myself I must cease to be what I always thought I wanted to be, and in order to find myself, I must go out of myself, and in order to live I must die [to that old self]." At the same time I was reading Merton's words, Pope Francis announced the 2025 Jubilee, "Pilgrims of Hope," and stated: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, and trusting heart and farsighted vision." I feel Pope Francis is saying, "Sandra, wake up and get with the program. You are part of God's human family, never forgotten, never alone. Not through division, but in unity you must fulfill your role as a member of Christ's body, living and working within creation toward the common good." (Notice the use of Sandra, the name which my mother used when she wanted to get my attention.) There doesn't seem to be anything in these messages leading me to private piety, spiritual pride, or a path that doesn't involved others who are also searching for meaning, direction, and hope. Thomas Merton wrote: "I must look for my identity, somehow, not only in God, but in other men. I will never be able to find myself if I isolate myself from the rest of [humankind] as if I were a different kind of being." There is such beauty in diversity and individuality, however, this beauty is only apparent through embracing and celebrating the diversity and individuality of one another. Hope is not found in division and hate. Hope is found in love and celebrating our bonds as God's children.
















The Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord January 12



This feast brings to an end the season of Christmas. At first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem an odd feast. Since the Catholic Church teaches that the Sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remission of sins, particu-

larly Original Sin, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. Therefore, He had no need of the sacrament, as we do.

In submitting Himself humbly to the baptism of St. John the Baptist, however, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If even He should be baptized, though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be thankful for this sacrament, which frees us from the darkness of sin and incorporates us into the Church, the life of Christ on earth! His Baptism, therefore, was necessary - not for Him, but for us.

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin.

Why We Dip Our Fingers Into the Holy Water Font and Make the Sign of the Cross



When we dip our fingers into the holy water font at the entrance to the church and make the sign of the cross we are touching our forehead (our mind), our shoulders and our heart. It is a way of recalling our baptism.

It brings us back to what has brought us there in the first place. It is a reminder of who we are, and to whom we belong.



Join Us In Prayer Rosary For Healing Thursdays at 6:30pm



Did you know that there are many in our parish who are struggling with serious health issues? Some are on our prayer chain. And then, there are others we don't know about - they prefer to keep their health issues private.
