


Someone is Watching and Wondering



Many of you will recognize this picture as one of the main characters from the musical "Phantom of the Opera," the phantom himself. For me, the phantom represents all of us, who at one time or another feel the necessity to hide behind a mask. The phantom, was hiding so much more than physical defects. He was hiding

from the ridicule and rejection of others. His experience and belief was that no one who saw his face could truly love him. He felt shame, anger, and great loneliness, his humanity rejected. In seeking solace, he lived in the lowest levels of the opera house, only emerging to hide in the darkness of a theater box, always wearing his mask.

I must admit having hidden behind a variety of masks: makeup, hair dye, clothes and jewelry, pride, smiles, solemn looks, intellect, fear, forced pleasure and gaiety, piety, and ego. While none of these are wrong in and of themselves, when used to hide my true self, in order to feel acceptance, and loved they are an abuse of God's gift, the uniqueness of my humanity. I tried for so long to fit the physical image of what I perceived from others as beautiful: what my outward appearance should be. I couldn't believe what I saw in the mirror was desirable. I had experienced bulling and rejection, and I wanted desperately to "fit-in."

When trying to change my physical appearance didn't work, I immersed myself in intellectual pursuits believing that if I was smarter, knew more, I would be accepted. Next I tried activities that seemed to bring others joy; always smiling even when I felt discouraged and left out. I immersed myself in religion, with my sense of egotistical piety, yet I felt empty, drained trying to be someone else. At some point I realized that while trying to discover myself, I was hiding from the reality of me. While I believed that God allowed me to be free, choosing to be what and who I am, to be real or unreal, true or false, I have come to understand that I cannot simply be, I must work with God in the creation of my own life, my own identity, and my own destiny. I cannot passively exist, replacing one mask with another so as to "fit-in" to my false reality of existence, I must actively participate in God's creative freedom in my life and in the lives of other. I must choose TRUTH as revealed in Jesus' words, proclaiming a loving father whom I dare to call *abba*. To work out my identity requires risk, anguish, and many tears. The secret of my identity is hidden in God. God makes me who I am. Finding my true identity is finding God, calling me to give my love to abba.

Senior Real Estate Property Tax Relief Program



Senate Bill 190 allows counties and municipalities to implement a property tax freeze for Social Security-eligible recipients. For Residents of Clay County, March 31 is the deadline for enrollment in the program that effectively freezes property taxes at the 2024 level starting in 2025.

NOTE that the March 31st deadline applies only to Clay County. Residents of other counties should contact their county courthouse for deadline information.

Enrollment in Clay and Jackson counties can be made in person at the County Courthouse or on-line.

Who is eligible?

- Is a resident of the county.
- Must turn or be Is 62 years or older in 2025
- Is the property owner or has a legal or equitable interest in the home.

- Is liable for the payment of real property taxes on the home.
- Occupies the property as only primary residence.
 Documents Required To Prove Eligibility

Proof of County Primary Residency and Age.

- Proof of all taxes paid
- If applicant is not on the deed, documentation proving legal interest in the property

A Workshop for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Cosponsored with the Liberty Ministerial Alliance

In these times, more than ever, we need to find and emulate individuals whose lives bear witness to the unity that God wants for God's family.

Today we will hear three stories about individuals who have stepped up and made genuine efforts to understand "the other" and helped others to live in harmony and peace.

Their stories — two Northern Irish women, a Muslim and a Catholic ministering among non-Catholics — will challenge us to move beyond wringing our hands at circumstances that divide us and seek out "the other" as a first step to clearing up misunderstandings and healing divisions.

We'll hear from and about:

1. Betty Williams and Mairead Maguire who received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1976 for their efforts to peacefully resolve the violent conflict between Catholics and Protestants in Northern Ireland.

2. Eyyup Esen, a Turkish Muslim who as leader of the Dialogue Institute of Kansas City and the Raindrop Foundation has bridged religious, cultural and ethnic divides.

3. Glenmary Brother Craig Digmann whose decades of work in rural Appalachia has broken down barriers between Protestant and Catholic communities.

After hearing these stories, we will discuss what we can learn from them and apply it to our own present divisions. We will discuss how we motivate ourselves and our congregations to work for great unity.

St. Agnes ~ Virgin and Martyr Feast Day January 21



St. Agnes of Rome was born in 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after, and she had many high ranking men chasing after her. However, Agnes made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her love

for the Lord was great and she hated sin even more than death!

Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse."

According to legend, the young men she turned away became so angry and insulted by her devotion to God and purity that they began to submit her name to authorities as a Christian follower.

At each refusal, she continued to say "I am already promised to the Lord of the Universe. He is more splendid than the sun and the stars, and He has said He will never leave me!"

Ultimately because of her refusals, powerful men condemned her to death. She died a virgin-martyr at the on January 21, 304.

St. Agnes is widely known as the patron saint of young girls. She is also the patron saint of chastity, rape survivors and the Children of Mary.

She is often represented with a lamb, the symbol of her virgin innocence, and a palm branch, like other martyrs. She is shown as a young girl in robes holding a palm branch with the lamb either at her feet or in her arms.
