

From the Pastor's Pen

In the mid 1800s, Catholics in larger cities in our country began to establish their own parochial school system. It was a reaction to the fear that indoctrination by Protestant teachers in the public school system would lead to a loss of faith by Catholics. Maintaining Catholic school was, of course, a burden for Catholic parishes, but having religious Sisters receiving very low wages made it possible. For many years, the Catholic School System thrived, not only on the elementary level, but also on the high school and college levels. In recent years, with increasing expenses there has been a decline in the number in the Catholic School System. However, Catholic schools have continued to be a great benefit for families and parishes.

This week we celebrate Catholic Schools Week. The theme chosen for this year's celebration is "Catholic Schools: united in faith and community: Alive in Christ." The motivation for the support of Catholic schools is not just a superior education, not just a safe environment, not just to involve parents in the schooling of their children. Rather the key motive is to support parents in living the Catholic faith and remaining true to the traditions of the Catholic Church. Our Catholic schools aim to be places of prayer, charity, and faith formation. Every activity of the school is directed toward being "Alive in Christ." Students are urged to find the presence of Christ in every other person and to treat each person with reverence and respect.

Let me recall for you the mission statement of our St. James School: "The St. James Catholic School community, a ministry of the parish, empowers students to achieve their full potential, become prayerful, lifelong learners and good stewards of God's gifts." If our school is a ministry of our parish, then the school should receive the support and encouragement of all the parishioners. I thank the St. James School administrators, teachers, and support staff for their excellent work.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Although it seems impossible, this year I will celebrate my 28th year as Director of Adult Initiation. Each year has been different yet there are many similarities with each group of peo-

ple seeking to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. One common question from every group is: "How do Catholics pray?" or "When will we learn Catholic prayers?" My answer hasn't changed very much: "Attend and participate in the Mass and you will be praying with the universal church in the Roman Catholic tradition." I know this is unsatisfactory for many people, yet the Mass is the most common prayer of the Church. After all, prayer is first and foremost, lifting our hearts and minds to God.

There are two types of prayer in the Christian tradition: priestly/liturgical prayer and affective/personal **prayer**. You may be thinking that any time you pray alone it is affective/personal prayer, likewise praying with others is priestly/liturgical prayer. This is not true nor is it an accurate statement. Priestly prayer is not about me (us), it is about the world and for the world. Priestly prayer is the prayer of Christ through the Church, for the world. Thus it is universal in scope and intended for the needs of the world. Priestly/liturgical prayer is also not restricted to the ordained clergy since we are all priests by virtue of our baptism and through baptism we make a commitment, as adults, to pray habitually and continuously for the world, through the liturgical prayers. For example, there are times I pray the "divine office" alone in my home, yet this is still a priestly/liturgical prayer and not a affective/ personal/private prayer. The divine office are prayers through which I take on a universal voice. I pray as a baptized adult, as priest, invoking God's blessing upon the world.

On the other hand affective/personal prayer is focused precisely on bringing me (us) and my (our) feelings to God. Affective/personal prayer has a single purpose: to draw me (us) and my (our) loved ones into deeper intimacy with Christ. As such, affective/private prayer tries to open me (us) up, so that I (we) can hear God call me (us) by name and hear God say: "I love you." These words of God are the most important words I can ever hear, because without hearing them I feel that something is truly missing from my life. I feel incomplete as though nothing is right in my life. Once I hear God speak them to me, however, I feel at the deepest level that I am worthy, and it is right for me to exist. The greatest gift I will ever receive is my life as a child of God. Silently, looking to heaven I hear God's voice.

Council members will be available after all Masses next weekend to provide more information and answer any questions you may have.


Military Outreach Ministry
