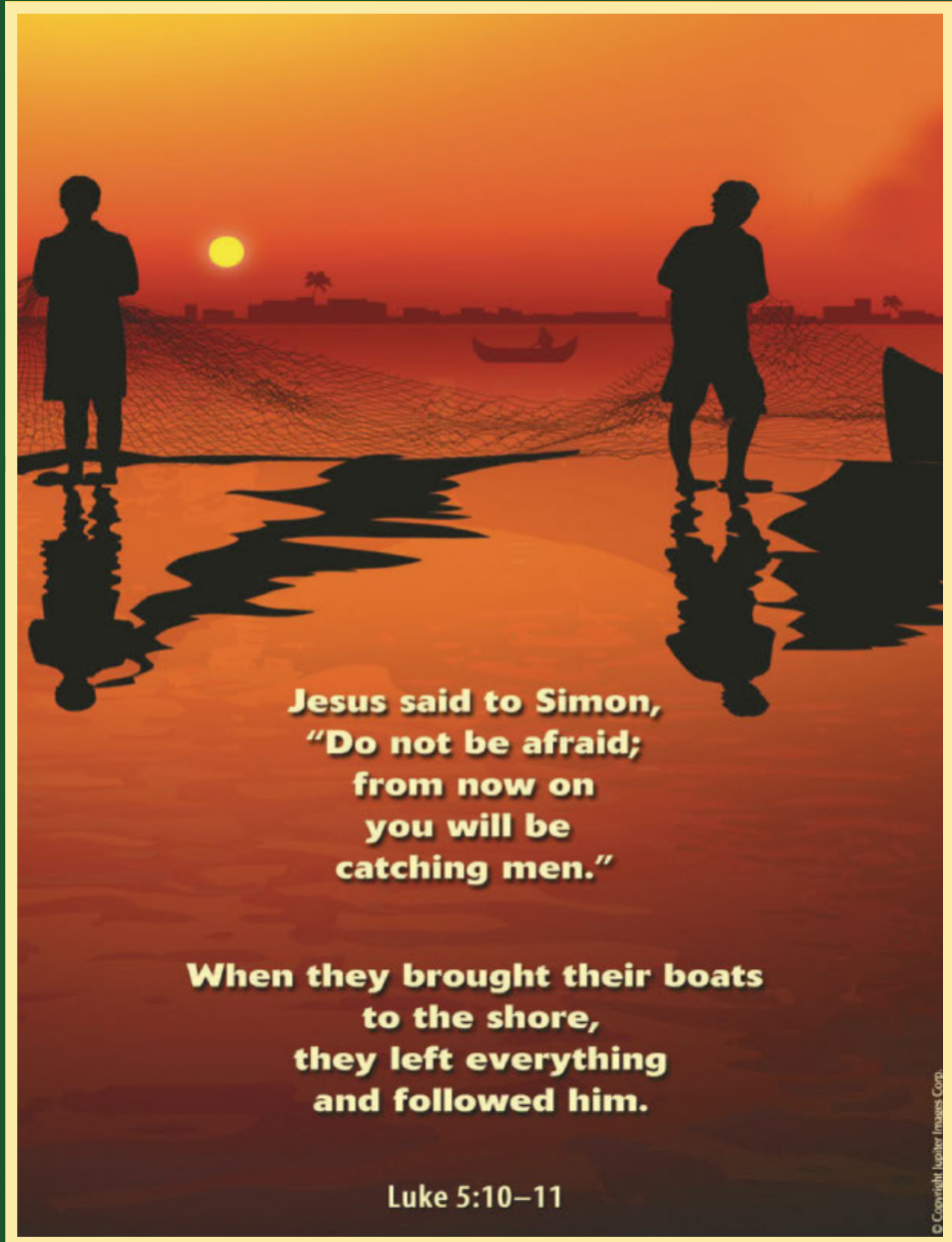
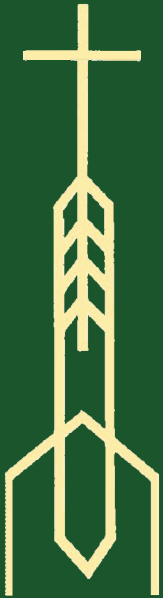

From the Pastor's Pen

Three special themes highlight this week. Today, February 9, is designated as "World Marriage Day." Tuesday, February 11, is named as "World Day of the Sick." As a nation, we also celebrate the birthday of Abraham Lincoln on Wednesday, February 12. Let me make a brief comment about each of these celebrations.

World Marriage Day has its roots in a movement called "World-Wide Marriage Encounter," which can be traced back to Fr. Gabriel Calvo, who developed a series of presentations designed to help married couples deepen their relationship through honest and intimate conversations. In 1981 this group created World Marriage Day, a day celebrated around the world. This day honors husbands and wives as the foundation of the family. In our area, Fr. Ron Will has been very involved in promoting this movement and giving presentations. He invites all couples to explore its potential for them.

The World Day of the Sick was founded in 1992 by Pope John Paul II, a year after it was discovered that he suffered from Parkinson's Disease. The purpose of the Day is to instill in all people compassion for the sick and to share in their suffering through prayer. Those who suffer are asked to offer their suffering for the good of the Church and of humanity, reminding us to see in our sick brothers and sisters the face of Christ. Appropriately, it is celebrated on February 11, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes because of the association of the shrine and its visits from the sick and the prayers for healing. All of us are asked to observe the World Day of the Sick by joining our prayers to theirs.

Finally, we celebrate the birthday of President Abraham Lincoln on February 12. Lincoln as not only a great statesman, bringing slavery to an end with his Emancipation Proclamation, but also was a man of faith who believed in the dignity and worth of every human being. We pray that our present President would have this belief and act on it.

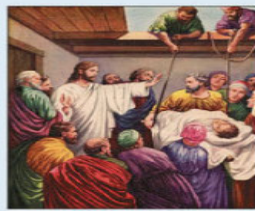

World Day Of The Sick February 11



February 11 is World Day of the Sick, an observation initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

People around the world take the time to pray for the sick and for those who work very hard to alleviate the sufferings of the sick on this day. Faith organizations mark this day especially to provide the sick with medicines, food, and spiritual guidance.

Every individual can do their bit on this day by praying for the sick and their caretakers. Visit the sick in local hospitals, old age houses etc., pray for them and volunteer to help them. One can also provide food and medication to the less fortunate. Do your part. Make a difference.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



When the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray he gave them these words which are so familiar to Christians: "Our father in heaven, holy is your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; protect

us from all temptations and deliver us from all evil. Amen!" I pray these words daily and this is one of the communal/liturgical prayers within the great prayer of the church, the Mass. Sometimes I wonder if I truly pray and live these words, or if I speak them only from memory; a passing moment required before I get on with my day. Amen is clearly a statement of my belief that these words are true, deeply rooted in my faith, but do I actually follow Jesus and this His prayer.

For example, do I believe in a loving Father/God who reigns in all the universe, equally present to myself and others, or do I try to capture God into my particular time and place? How do I understand the love of our Father? Is it caught up in some sentimental notion of romance or is it a love of mercy and forgiveness for me and our sin-filled world? Do I reverence God as the holy one and do I accept God's will be done? This implies that I must put aside any tendency to put myself in God's place, asking that my will become reality, not only in my life but in the lives of others. Believing in this prayer, I accept that God will lead me to use my gifts, received through grace, to do **God's will**. "Give us this day our daily bread," opens my mind to the reality that everything I have is from God, working through the hands and labors of so many people. I am dependent on God, while interdependent on others. I do not, nor do I desire to exist as a single entity unto myself, rather I desire to live within the diverse, vibrant community God created. As such I am called to forgive as I seek forgiveness. Can I forgive as I ask to be forgiven? Not an easy task on my own. Finally resisting temptation is my constant battle. I believe, as I pray Jesus' words that I will continue to succumb to evil and sinfulness without trusting in God's faithfulness, grasping my Father's love, constantly seeking strength through the Holy Spirit, and embracing Jesus in His words and sacraments.

Meditating on these words, I have come to realize how this prayer is an expression of my faith, but how difficult it is to live His teachings; yet how wonder-filled it is to place my life into my Father's hands.

Prayer Changes Everything

Our Lady of Lourdes Feast Day February 11



On February 11, 1858, Mary appeared to Bernadette Soubirous – the first of 18 visits.

When she asked the Lady’s identity, she replied, “I am the Immaculate Conception.” The Blessed Virgin, through Bernadette, had come to call sinners to a change of heart.

Her message was a request for prayer and penance. She also said that a chapel was to be built on the site and processions held. On Feb. 25, the Lady told Bernadette to dig in the dirt and drink of the stream. She began to dig and found water to drink.

In 1865, after a thorough investigation, the apparitions were approved for devotion by the Catholic Church. A shrine was built there, which remains a popular place of pilgrimage. The latest (and 69th) approved miracle involving a healing in the water of Lourdes took place in May 1989. After extensive investigation the Church approved it in July 2013.

The water continues to flow from where she had dug with her hands until it was producing over 32,000 gallons of water a day – as it still does. Over 2 million people Lourdes visit each year.

Bernadette died in 1879 at the age of 35, and was later canonized. The body of the blessed Saint can still be seen in its glass coffin, intact and incorrupt, looking like a young woman asleep .

St. Valentine's Feast Day ~ February 14



The history of who St. Valentine really was is cloaked in mystery. He is known to be a real person who died around the year 270.

But who he really was remains an enigma. In fact, enough confusion surrounds his true identity that the Church discontinued liturgical veneration of him in 1969, though his name remains on its list of officially recognized saints.

One legend says that he was a priest in Rome during the reign of Emperor Claudius II who decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families and outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of this decree, continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret and thus was condemned to death.

Other stories suggest that he was killed for helping Christians escape persecution. Yet another describes Valentine as the Bishop of Terni, also martyred by Claudius. Whatever the case, he was beaten with clubs and stoned and ultimately beheaded on February 14.

Another legend says, while waiting to be executed, Valentine restored the sight of his jailer's daughter and, on the eve of his death wrote a farewell note to her, signing it, "From your Valentine." In the year 496, Pope Gelasius I questioned his true identity. However, because the similarities of these accounts led him to think they may refer to the same person, he referred to the martyr and his acts as "being known only to God" and declared February 14 as St. Valentine's Day.

The truth behind the Valentine legends is murky but the stories all emphasize his appeal as a sympathetic, heroic and, most importantly, romantic figure. And, because the heart symbolizes love, it has also become symbolic of Valentine's Day.
