

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Until very recently I really had not given much thought to my catechetical/faith formation/spiritual direction methodology. While revisiting my affective/personal

prayer life, however, I have come to realize that working with others seeking a deeper spiritual life I rely on *Lectio Divina*. As a form or prayer, *Lectio Divina* translates as sacred or holy reading, and involves the following: 1. reading/listening to God's voice found in sacred scripture, 2. reflecting on the meaning (particularly on a word or phrase which resonates in your mind and heart, 3. responding to God in prayer, 4. resting in God's presence, and 5. responding in action by remembering the word or phrase throughout the day, as you go about daily labor/tasks. In practicing *Lectio Divina* each day becomes a prayer, a centering of the day in God's love and mercy, complete trust in God's presence.

As I read/listen to God's word, I feel God is speaking directly to me. One of the scripture passages I continue to return to in *Lectio Divina* is Psalm 46:10: "Be still and know that I am God." Beginning my day with these words surrounds me with a calmness and knowledge that God is not only with me but somehow in control of my life. Although hard to completely understand, especially when things seem to be going wrong or life is full of confusion, I still find comfort in these words, resting peaceful in them, and I am able to continue/work through my day and whatever presents itself. This isn't to say that I don't feel angry, exasperated, or discouraged at times, but when I pause to remember to be present with God, I get feel calmed.

In catechesis and faith formation I encourage individuals to let their Bibles fall open in their lap and read what is on the page which catches their attention. It isn't necessary to read an entire chapter for understanding, but rather to meditate on the words which seem to be speaking to them. Together, we may discuss what they read or heard from God, and why or how the words resonate in their life; what do they feel God is calling them to do or change. Perhaps a scholar, practitioner, or theologian in Lectio Divina would challenge my rather simplistic approach to this form of prayer, however, I know its positive impact on myself, children, teens, and adults. Over my years of prayer and working with others I have seen so much growth in love and understanding of how Jesus calls each of us to fullness in life. There is no magic in a life of prayer, but there is direction, hope, and peace through an awareness of the loving presence with God, discovered in listening to God's voice.

Historically, Americans began celebrating George Washington's Birthday just months after his death, long before Congress declared it a federal holiday. It was not until 1879, under President Rutherford B. Hayes, that Washington's Birthday became a legal holiday, to be observed on his birthday, February 22.

Almost one hundred years later, in 1971, the US Congress changed the date for Washington's birthday celebration to the third Monday in February. Congress never changed the name. While we call this day President's Day, federally, the holiday is still called "Washington's Birthday."

The holiday has only been celebrated on a Monday since 1971 when the US Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act to create a long weekend. The act moved three federal holidays from their original dates to a Monday to create three long weekends: Washington's Birthday (originally February 22), Memorial Day (originally May 30), and Veterans Day (originally November 11, and moved back to that date in 1978).

Because it is a federal holiday, federal services, such as US Postal Service post offices, banks, and the stock market are closed on Presidents' Day.

While originally meant to honor the birthday of George Washington, today it is understood as a day to celebrate the birthdays and lives of all United States presidents.




