From the Pastor's Pen

The most basic action of our discipleship is the teaching of Jesus: "Love one another as I have loved you." (Jn 13,34) Jesus is not talking about love in a romantic sense, but love which sees each person as a child of God and striving to love that person as God does. It is not a love that is about feeling, but rather about a decision to want goodness for each person we encounter. Sometimes we find it so very hard to follow this commandment, especially if the other is vicious, mean, heartless, and criminal. Still we must see the other as a child of God, deserving of and in need of our prayer, as well as our love.

There is a situation happening in our country today which badly needs our love. Mass deportation efforts are underway across our country. Yes, criminals and perpetrators of violence must be apprehended and returned to their country of origin. But the executive order has been extended to all undocumented persons who have come into our country, many who have been here for a number of years and whose children are born here and know no other way of life. The decree has included ending birthright citizenship. U.S. Immigration and Customs officials (ICE) have been arresting immigrants across our country.

Yes, immigration is a very difficult and complex issue. Many immigrants have come to our border for circumstances beyond their control: dire poverty, violence, no work opportunities, vicious acts by the military. They live day to day in fear and anxiety. They have nowhere to escape and feel forced to seek protection and a better way of life. The Catholic Bishops Conference in our country have call for humane immigration reform, governed by mercy and justice.

If we take seriously the word of Jesus, "Love one another as I have loved you," then we must be concerned about what is happening to our brothers and sisters. The great law of love extends to them just as it does to our neighbors and fellow citizens. We need to cry out against abuse and neglect.

My prayers are with you each day.



Someone is Watching and Wondering




My journey as a Catholic began as a teenager, many years ago, when I read *The Loyola Book of Poems*. I enjoyed reading these poems, however, I did not realize at that time the in-

fluence this reading would have on my life. Years later, when I began my journey as a candidate seeking full communion with the Roman Catholic Church, my formation was grounded and influenced by the spirituality of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, but when I had the opportunity to complete a Master's degree in Pastoral Studies, from Loyola University-New Orleans, I jumped at the chance. The influence of the Jesuit and the Precious Blood communities continue to lead me in my journey of loving service and faithfulness to the teachings of Jesus.

As I have written over the past several weeks, my daily prayer life is diverse, taking on many different forms. One type of prayer that draws me closer to God, especially during Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter is the "Ignatian Prayer." To begin this form of prayer, I pick a Bible story, and try to imagine myself in that story. Ignatian prayer directs me to use my senses (and my imagination) asking the question what do I hear, see, feel, touch and smell? The second question: Who would I be in this story? Finally, if I were Jesus in this story, what would I be thinking or feeling? This form of prayer goes back, almost 3,000 years, to the way our Israelite brothers and sisters prayed, and it is written that St. Ignatius mediated/prayed on the Nativity, in this way. When I pray as Ignatius, I often find myself as an outsider, standing on the fringes watching the story unfold. I see crowds of people, catch the scent of animals, and sometimes feel trapped in the narrow streets. During Advent, my prayer turns to the similarities I feel with Mary at carrying and feeling the movement of my first child, while also being somewhat fearful of the birthing process. I try to imagine what she must have felt when giving birth in a stable. During Lent, I feel anxious as one of the disciples as Jesus tells of His impending death, moving closer and closer to Jerusalem. Reading and meditating on His walk to Calvary, I am again a bystander, watching in horror at the events taking place. I cannot stop my tears from falling and I feel my heart beat faster as I follow Jesus to Golgotha. I see his beaten body and watch the blood flow from his wounds. I feel helpless and drained. Even though I know how these stories end, I am immersed in the moment where my senses take over. Ignatian prayer overtakes my senses and allows me to embrace Jesus' life in the present.

Preparing For Lent



How do you want to be during Lent this year? More quiet and thoughtful? More open to God's desires? Better able to sit with people who need you? More attentive to sacred readings, whether in church or in private? Do you need to be more compassionate toward your own fears and failings? Do you need to become more courageous about using the gifts God has given you?

In the days prior to Lent, try one or more of these suggestions.

Ask God, every day, "What does my soul need?" Just ask, and wait quietly. Because we're very good at fooling ourselves about how we're doing, it might take several days of praying this question before we're truly open and humble enough to know the answer.

Ask God, every day, "What about my life makes you happy?" Yes, when God looks at your life, some parts of it – perhaps many aspects of it – bring joy to God's heart. Think of how your children or grandchildren or other people close to you make you happy. God is in relationship with you, which means that your sins grieve God's heart, but also that your growth and love and freedom and kindness bring joy to God of the universe. Again, you will probably need to pray this a few times before you are willing to consider that you give God pleasure, that you make God happy in any way. Stick with this little prayer and keep listening.

Tell God, and yourself, every day, "I want to be open to the graces of this Lenten season." Maybe you're not open right now, or you're not as open and willing as you'd like to be or think you should be. What else is new? We can always open our lives a bit more, let go of more stuff, listen better, and do more quickly and passionately what we know helps nurture God's kingdom on earth.

This is a beginning: three short and simple prayer starters to ready yourself for the holy season.


