Someone is Watching and Wondering



Perhaps you are breathing a sigh of relief when I state this is the last day in which I will share my prayer life with you. This final Sunday before the beginning of Lent, I offer my thoughts on service to others as a way in which I pray. This is a pathway in faith through action and is evidenced by the lives of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Father Damien, St. Francis of Assisi and St. Thérèse of Lisieux. Not for a single moment do I equate my service with any of these individuals, however, in a similar manner I try to observe the needs of others with empathy and understanding, recognize practical solutions and approach them with courage. I strive to deal with facts and real problems, and serve others by using the gifts and abilities God has given me through grace. I feel the only way to love and serve God is to lovingly serve others and I believe loving service is a form of prayer through which I recognize the presence of God. I feel God's loving touch on my shoulder encouraging me to respond and guiding me forward. I also have a greater awareness of the face of Christ in those I serve. Some refer to this type of prayer through service as the Franciscan way of living in the presence of God.

Rereading the life of St. Francis I realize how free and unconfined he was; following his inner spirit, not tied down by strict adherence to rules, in order to faithfully serve the forgotten ones; strangers to him, who had been cast aside, voiceless, and without hope. Francis offered hope by sharing his love and devotion to Jesus, embracing and ministering to those he encountered. The Franciscan way is flexible and makes full use of the five senses, bringing about an enhanced, spirit-filled prayer. St. Thérèse of Lisieux carried out "little acts" of service in harmony with the world in which she lived. She didn't hide from truth, rather she embraced reality as experienced through what she saw, heard, tasted, smelled, and felt, carrying out simple tasks of daily living with complete focus on her hands doing God's work. St. Therese of Calcutta served the poorest of the poor and prayed with five fingers: "You did it to me!" remembering that serving others was her way of serving Christ Jesus. Father Damien spent his life, not in a safe parish church but in living with the lepers of Molokai. Isolated and alone from his fellow priests, he did not hesitate in God's work.

My acts of prayerful service are centered in my ministry of teaching and listening to individuals struggling with who they are and the meaning of their life; walking with anyone facing life changing events yet seeking to understand God's presence and unconditional love. I too am a sinful seeker, not a saint, but I am learning to listen, trust, love and serve. Still, sometimes I try acting without first listening to God.

Danny Baker, We'll Miss You ~ Godspeed!!

Who at St. James doesn't know Danny Baker! And if you don't "know" him personally, you've seen him and heard his amazing voice at weekend Masses.

On a recent weekend, Danny sent shock waves throughout the church as he announced that he was leaving St. James the first weekend of March to pursue other opportunities. He explained by quoting scripture from Ecclesiastes 3:1-2, "There is a time for everything and a time for every affair under the heavens", and he explained that this is his time to leave.



Danny joined the St. James Parish staff in July of 2007 as Director of the Liturgy and Music Ministry, bringing with him a wealth of knowledge and experience. He grew up in Raytown. Following high school, he studied music at Northwest Missouri State University. There, his primary focus was vocal performance and piano. During his time at NWMSU he served as a student accompanist in 5 voice studios giving him wonderful exposure to a wide variety of styles and methods of teaching voice.

When Danny arrived at St. James, our music was typical of what most catholic churches had at the time. As one who strives for only the best, his hard work, talent and leadership has turned our music program from mediocre into extraordinary. He plans the music for all Masses including Feast Days, Holy Days, Prayer Services and other special occasions, such as weddings and funerals.

He not only plans the music, he also schedules musicians for each Mass, providing tools and recordings for at-home practice and schedules in-person rehearsals as needed. He directs our numerous musical groups including the Parish Choir, Handbell Choir, Music Group and Teen Choir. Recently he created a new choir especially for singing at funerals.



Danny works hard to recruit new choir members, not only by word of mouth and recommendations, but also through a series of "clever" bulletin articles touting the benefits of singing in a choir.

Danny's focus is not only about the music itself, but also our parishioners. During Covid, while public Masses were forbidden, he was able to develop the plan to livestream Masses for those at home. This plan has expanded to livestreaming the Sunday 8am



Mass as well as funerals and weddings with two cameras that allow those at home to see the entire church, rather than just the altar. He saw the need to provide special hearing assistance devices for those having difficulty hearing. Most recently, he installed an electronic

device on the choir wall indicating the hymn being sung. In the two years recovering from the effects of Covid, he instituted a weekly "lunchtime Recital Series," bringing in talented musicians from within and outside the parish to perform.

He also has hosted a variety of live choir performances including local and traveling community choirs from across the country, most recently the Holy Mountain Singers.

His responsibilities didn't end with the music. He oversees all liturgical ministries at St. James to ensure that all individuals who play a part during the liturgies know and understand their role.

These include Sacristans, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers, Greeters and Servers.

He also oversees the art and environment of St. James, gathering volunteers to decorate the church for every liturgical season according to the guidelines set by the Catholic Church.

He takes care of all items used in our liturgies such as candles, incense, wine, etc. and serves on the Diocesan Liturgical Commission.

Other responsibilities include managing our Social Media accounts on Facebook and Instagram and hosting and coordinating community concerts and ecumenical services at St. James.

During the building of this church, Danny worked on the design team, helping to select the mural, crucifix, floor medallions, statues, altar vessels, a new organ and other liturgical furnishings that have created the beautiful church we have today.

Outside of St. James, Danny shares his amazing talents with other groups as well. He serves as the music director of the Northland Summer Singers, and performs frequently with the William Baker Festival Singers Foundation. He is a member of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians, and was the chairman of their national convention held in Kansas City last July. Oh, and by the way, it's not only liturgical music he loves, he loves show tunes and for the past several years has served as the assistant music director at Worlds of Fun for their live entertainment summer season.



As mentioned at the beginning of this article, Danny has an amazing voice. But as you can read in this article, it's not only his voice that's amazing - it's the man himself.



As Fr. Mike said in his Pastor's Pen article recently, "We are saddened by Danny's announcement that he is moving on to 'new ground'. We are certainly grateful for his seventeen and a half years of coordinating our Music and Liturgy. We have been blessed by him sharing of his gifts and talents in so many

ways and wish him the best as he moves on."

You may be wondering who will replace Danny. Fear not! St. James will hire a new liturgist and music director, but that person will never "replace" Danny. There is only one Danny Baker and we've been blessed to have him for seventeen and a half amazing and wonderful years.

And, so we wish Danny "Godspeed" in all his future endeavors. We will miss you.

Lenten Observances for Fast and Abstinence

Abstinence From Meat: Every person 14 years or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting: Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Exceptions: Those who are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.
