

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Discernment continues as part of my Lenten journey; specifically how and from what should I FAST? In past years my fasting has been focused on food; eat-

ing less, smaller meals, eliminating snacking and specific foods. Other years my focus was on fasting from harmful behaviors, and ingrained (not life-giving) habits. There have even been a few times when my Lenten fast centered on replacing negativity with positive thoughts and actions. Given the current state of our world and what I am feeling this year, my fasting is deeply rooted in solidarity with the poor and God's forgotten children; discerning what I should change to live a simpler life .

Thanksgiving 2024 Michael and I spent our day serving people at St. Mary's. This was the first holiday that we weren't with family, sharing a bounty of food. The experience was humbling. So many people thanked us and offered blessings to us. Some we served were obviously homeless and carrying their few possessions in small backpacks. On our drive home, Michael and I shared our experience and feelings with one another, and we both realized that we received more that day than what we gave. Since then I have realized that my life is marked by excess: a nice home which is seasonally warmed and cooled, food anytime of the day, entertainment at the click of a button, medical care, money for pleasures (mostly books, music, and garden supplies), and a modest level of security for the future. My home is witness to excess of possessions: collectables, clothing, seasonal décor, and items for personal comfort. Yet, those we served on Thanksgiving, often with eyes downcast, guietly thanked and blessed us.

Over the years, I have justified my life style: I worked hard, saved, and took care of myself (at least from age 18). I give of my time, limited talent, and treasures to help others. At the end of the day, however, I rest in a comfortable bed, in a safe, secure home, protected from the elements, without hunger pains. Sorry to say, I don't have great answers that satisfy my need to do more and live with less. My Lenten Fast, 2025, however, is centered around surrendering myself, my ego, my selfish wants and desires to God. I pray that God will lead me and provide guidance on what I should be doing to live more fully in solidarity with my brothers and sisters. I desire to fast from instructing God with my needs, to trust in the love and grace which Jesus' gave through his life, death, and resurrection, and to pray that I can continue this fast, long after this Lenten season passes; turning from sin and being faithful to the Gospel.

On the second Sunday of Lent each year, we hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration.



## **Confirmation ~ Receiving the Gifts of the Holy Spirit**



is a very important part of our spiritual growth. The Catholic Church believes that our souls need to grow in maturity in our life of grace.

The Sacrament of Confirmation completes the process of our initiation into the Christian community confirming what was begun in Baptism and nourished in the Holy Eucharist.

Our souls are given the grace, power and energy to go forth and become soldiers of Christ. We are given the spiritual duty to fight the war between good and evil, light and darkness, between the human race and the powers of Satan and hell.

Being confirmed In Confirmation we are given the same 7 gifts: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord and 12 fruits: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, forbearance, gentleness, faith, modesty, self-control and chastity that were given to the apostles and Mary on Pentecost (See Acts 2:1-4.)

> The 7 gifts are supernatural graces given to the soul, while the 12 fruits are human qualities activated by the Holy Spirit that give us the courage to practice and live our faith as disciples of Christ.

> It is in and through Confirmation that we accept responsibility for our faith and our spiritual destiny and we acknowledge that we want Christ to be the center of our lives.

Our second group of students in our Confirmation program will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Friday, March 21.

#### **PreK-5th Grade**

This past weekend, the youth in 2nd-5th grades began the Lenten season by going to reconciliation during class. While there they continued to practice to receive communion, walked the Stations of the Cross, or looked around the sanctuary for the sacramental oils, the Baptismal font, and other symbols of our faith.



Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man who had total devotion to and trust in God.


He feared nothing, not even death, so complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission.


