

Meditating Moments



Perhaps like many of you, I am a creature of habit: routine without abrupt change, peaceful solitude without noise, uninterrupted meals, relaxation without worry related to pressing tasks, conversation without turmoil. As such, my days follow a distinct pattern: morning coffee, a comfortable chair, reading scripture, contemplation and

prayer. The time I rise from sleep may change, but this routine does not. In those first quiet moments, I am alone with God. There are times when I read commentaries on the scripture, spiritual writings, or simply listen to the sounds of nature. Within these moments (which at times stretch into an hour or more) I feel the Holy Spirit somehow united with the beating of my heart, sense the Father's embrace, and hear the voice of Jesus offering me grace, love, and forgiveness. These sacred moments alone with God help to guide me through the day's challenges and events.

Some days I attend Mass, work in my gardens, mow the lawn or shovel snow, lead others in spiritual formation, relax with friends, take a walk, clean the house or do laundry, cook/bake, attend a seminar or training, knit, or occasionally relax with a new book. As I write these words, I realize how difficult it is for me to be inactive; I truly enjoy working and feeling productive, but without my morning with Jesus, I simply push through the day without joy.

I am sure you noticed the change in the name of this column, which I feel is a reflection of decisions I made this past year: to resign as director of the OCIA, to search for a new ministry, and my dreams of sharing the tranquility and hope that I find spending time with Jesus. I will admit my journey can be challenging, especially acknowledging that I am not a patient person, I hold strong beliefs and opinions, and I feel passionate about my call as a Catholic Christian to serve others, seek justice, and preserve our planet which God lovingly created. In discovering the presence and power of God's mercy, I feel called to share this with others. In the weeks ahead I will be sharing my call and vision to new ministry. I invite all who wish to make this journey, "Emmaus People—Responding to God's Call." to join me. As has happened so many times in my life, I do not know where my path will lead, but I do know that God is opening new doors and will be with me on this journey. I pray with you and will be available to assist in what ever way I can, as you journey in loving surrender to Christ Jesus.

THE STORY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared 6 times to three shepherd children; Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta; between May 13 and October 13, 1917. She came to the little village of Fatima which had remained faithful to the Catholic Church during the recent persecutions by the government. Our Lady came with a message from God to every man, woman, and child of our century.

Our Lady of Fatima promised that the whole world would be in peace, and that many souls would go to Heaven if Her requests were listened to and obeyed. She told us that war is a punishment for sin; that God would punish the world for its sins in our time by means of war, hunger, persecution of the Church and persecution of the Holy Father, the Pope, unless we listened to and obeyed the command of God. At Fatima, Pope John Paul II said on May 13, 2000; "the message of Fatima is more relevant and more urgent " then when Our Lady first appeared. The message is an appeal of our Heavenly Mother, Who sees us in great danger and Who comes to offer Her help and advice. Her message is also a prophesy, a clear indication of

what was about to transpire in the 20th century, and what is still going to happen infallibly in the near future, depending on our response to Her requests.

THE MIRACLE

As a great sign of the whole message truly coming from God, a marvelous miracle was worked in the sky above Fatima before 70,000 witnesses on October 13, 1917 at the time, date and place that Lucy and the other two children had prophesized in the name of Our Lady of Fatima.

The children were told by Our Lady that God would perform a miracle so that people would believe in the apparitions. The date the children was October 13, 1917, in Fatima. On that date, 70,000 people came to see the phenomenon. The miracle occurred with the sun. All could stare perfectly at the sun without blinking, or even hurting heir eyes. While all were watching the sun, it rotated, got large and small, got close to the people, and got far away from them. The sun " danced ". Every single person who was there testified to seeing the sun dance, even non-believers who immediately dropped onto their knees and begged for forgiveness.

MIRACLES TODAY

Our Lady of Fatima continues to work miracles today through Fatima water which is sent from Fatima around the world. This water sprang up in Fatima at the spot the Bishop told people to dig, very near where Our Lady appeared at the Cova de Iria (the Cove of Peace). The water is known to cure people with sicknesses and poor health. Other people are cured when they go on pilgrimage to Fatima, approxabout 90 miles north of Lisbon, Portugal.


