

From the Pastor's Pen

Each Sunday we pray the Creed, a statement of fundamental beliefs of our Catholic Church. Included in the Creed is the belief in the four "marks" of the Church. We are one, holy, catholic (meaning universal) and apostolic. It took over 300 years for that statement to become official teaching as it was approved by the Council of Nicaea in the year 325 AD. I think that often we say the words of the Creed without much reflection on the meaning of the words. But the Creed states the very foundation of who we are and what we believe as the Catholic Church family.

We are "one" because we profess a common belief. We are "holy" in the sense that the Holy Spirit guides and directs the Church. We are "catholic" because the Church includes people of all cultures, races, and places. We don't discriminate. We are "apostolic" because our roots are in the profession of St. Peter and his successors, the Pope and bishops. We are guided by the Scripture and Tradition. We are not "lone rangers," but are brothers and sisters to one another.

The most recent guide for living our faith comes from the teachings of the "Synod on Synodality." Launched in October of 2021, the Synod drew local Catholics, National Bishops' Conferences, and religious orders into an extended period of consultation, listening, and discernment, culminating in the October, 2023, assembly in Rome. The results of the Synod are not suggestions, not "pick and choose," but authoritative Church teachings. Actually, the synod documents are simply putting into practice the documents of the Second Vatican Council. So it behooves all of us as Catholics to become familiar with the documents as the one, holy, catholic and universal people of God.

My prayers are with you each day.

Is Easter Really Over?



Not Yet!! Easter Sunday is only the beginning!

Easter for Christians is not just one day, but rather a 50-day period. The season of Easter,

or Eastertide, begins at sunset on the eve of Easter and ends on Pentecost, the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church.

These Fifty Days are a celebration of the Resurrection of Christ. This extended season gives us time to rejoice and experience what it means when we say Christ is risen. It's the season when we remember our baptisms and how through this sacrament we are, according to the liturgy, "incorporated into Christ's mighty acts of salvation." As "Easter people," we also celebrate and ponder the birth of the Church and gifts of the Spirit (Pentecost), and how we are to live as faithful disciples of Christ.

Why fifty days? It's actually quite simple. After the resurrection, Jesus spent forty days on earth before he ascended, and then there were ten more days after that before the Day of Pentecost.

The Feast of the Ascension the Lord falls on the 40th day, which always falls on a Thursday. However, because this is a weekday, we observe the Ascension the following Sunday, the Seventh Sunday of Easter.

This sacred season of fifty days comes to an end the following Sunday, on Pentecost, as we commemorate the giving of the Holy Spirit to the apostles, the beginnings of the Church and its mission to every tongue and people and nation.



Meditating Moments



"That very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they

were talking and discussing together, Jesus himself drew near and went with them. But their eyes were kept from recognizing him" (Luke 24:13). As I reread and think about these words I wonder how many times Jesus has walked with me but I did not recognize him. Probably more often than I willingly admit, yet I know He walks with me each time I experience unconditional love, forgiveness, and hope.

For many years I have received an early morning email message from Pope Francis "Journeying with the Pope. "I will miss these morning words of inspiration and prayer, which have guided me toward seeing Christ Jesus in other people. The Pope's last message was posted the day he died, which I would like to share with you: "Everything can be seen, at last, from another perspective, and so our steps also go towards new goals. This is how hope, which never disappoints, arises. The Bible tells of this in many ways. And for us too, the experience of faith has been stimulated by encounters with people who have been able to change in life and have, so to speak, entered into God's dreams" (Pope Francis dated April 21, 2025). Perhaps I too can enter into God's dreams as my faith is stimulated by encounters with my brothers and sisters, sharing their humanity, visions, dreams, disappointments, grief, and journeys through life, realizing that my life is a pure gift of love from God, and that life is not primarily centered around myself. Living fully, as I believe God intended, means sharing and experiencing God's love, mercy, and forgiveness with others. Yet I must ask do I believe what I pray: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven," and forgive my sinfulness as I forgive my brothers and sisters. Father, help me accept that I do not need to be right and always comparing myself to others; that I may live contentedly and that my actions will reflect your abundant love. Help me to recognize Jesus, all ways.

As I stated last week, with God's help I am planning a small faith community, "Emmaus People—Responding to God's Call." Together we may recognize and experience Jesus with new vision. Beginning May 14, 2025, at 6:30pm, we will meet the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month, in the Church Office Conference room. I hope you will join me as together we explore experiences of Jesus.

Relay for Life Leaders Alan and Kathy Mazi retiring after 10 years of serving as captains on the Knights of Columbus team.



The Liberty Relay for Life (RFL) is an annual event to promote the fight on cancer and is the oldest event in the Kansas City area. The Knights' team has supported this

event since 2005, raising over \$150,000 to support the American Cancer Society. Each year there are several hundred spectators and participants at the trackside event held in June at the Kansas City Police Academy in Pleasant Valley.

The most impactful moment of each annual relay event is the Luminaria Ceremony, when the video screen displays lists of individuals who died from cancer, and those who have survived cancer or are currently fighting the disease. Hundreds of luminaria bags light up the track as participants walk in silence. This ceremony of light symbolizes the hope and perseverance with which we all continue to fight.

Over the last 8 years, Alan and Kathy Mazi have led the St. James Knight team, *Inspiring* HOPE. Alan has been a strong supporter for the fight against

cancer since 1975, the year his dad died from colon cancer. Alan was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer (sarcoma) at the age of 48. He was blessed that the sarcoma was found early and he was fortunate that one of only four doctors in the

country had an office within a mile from where he worked. He was thankful for the millions of cancer supporters raising billions of dollars. Being a survivor has motivated his passion for paying it forward. For four years, Team *inspiring* HOPE has been the top fund-raising team for this event. Under their leadership, over \$115,000 has been raised.

Both Alan and Kathy have decided to pass the torch on to another Knight or group of Knights to take this project on in the future. The St. James Knights will keep supporting this important event and will look for some new volunteers to take over this important program.

Please congratulate Alan and Kathy for an excellent job well done!



ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, APRIL 14, 2025

Pastoral Council's April meeting was called to order at 7:15pm by Chairperson Joan Peluso. Council Members present were Fr. Mike Roach, Deacon Chuck Koesterer, Eddie Baker, Phil Baumert, Kevin Casel, Chris Fullinwider, Yvette Lopez, Joan Peluso, Sherri Porterfield, Jeff Ridder and Corrine Sebranek. The opening prayer was said by Sherri Porterfield.

Old Business:

Chairperson Joan Peluso shared with the Council a message from Discernment Director Jay Meacham that one person has been discerned to become a new Council member. In the coming weeks there will be two more meetings with potential candidates in which two additional Council members will be discerned.

In previous meetings it has been discussed that the Council works to build a relationship with the many ministries at St. James. Council members received contact information for ministry heads and will be contacting these leaders via email in the coming weeks. It is the Council's desire to find out what their needs may be and how we can assist them. In addition, the Council will be asking in the email for a brief description of the ministry. This description will assist the St. James bulletin editor, Judy Keisling in informing the parish about these ministries with a short article in the bulletin throughout the summer months. The Council will also be asking if there is any interest in participating in a possible ministry fair sponsored by the Council in the early Fall. Council members are requesting a response from the ministry heads contacted by their May 12th meeting.

New Business:

At the suggestion of Sherri Porterfield, Chairperson Peluso reminded the Council to look over and be familiar with the articles concerning Election of Execu-

tive Committee members. Elections for Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Secretary for the year 2025-26 will be held at the May meeting.

Corinne Sebranek expressed concern for those parishioners who may experience health difficulties at Mass during the summer months because of air conditioning issues. Deacon Chuck suggested that the company who regulates the air conditioning be contacted to see if the temperatures in the church can be regulated. Luckily, if a parishioner does have a problem, there is a Point of Contact Person at every Mass to assist if there is a medical emergency.

The Council asked if a picture and information about St. James' new Deacon, Juan Rodriguez, could be placed in the bulletin so that our parishioners could get to know him. They were told that this should be happening soon.

Closing Comments and Prayer:

Fr. Mike told the Council that the name of the new St. James pastor should be announced in mid-May. He also announced the good news that a new Director of Liturgy and Music has been recently hired. Sam Fleming will be joining the St. James staff around May 7th. Fr. Mike closed the meeting with a prayer and the members prayed the "Our Father" together. The Meeting was adjourned at 8:10pm.

A number of traditions link the month of May to Mary. Alfonso (a Spanish king) in the 13th century wrote in his *Cantigas de Santa Maria* about the special al honoring of Mary during specific dates in May. Eventually, the entire month was filled with special observances and devotions to Mary.

In Rome by 1813, May devotions were held in as many as twenty churches. From Italy, May devotions soon spread to France. In

Belgium, the May devotions, at least as a private devotion, were already known by 1803. The tradition of honoring Mary in a month-long May devotion spread eventually around the Roman Catholic world in the 19th century together with a month-long devotion to Jesus in June and the Rosary in October.

In his 1965 encyclical, *Mense Maio*, Pope Paul VI identified the month of May as an opportune time to incorporate special prayers for peace into traditional May devotions. Pope Pius XII, recognizing traditional precedents, proclaimed the "Queenship of Mary" through his encyclical, *Ad Caeli Reginam*.

Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.

St. Damien of Molokai Feast Day May 10



St. Damien of Molokai, also called Father Damien, was a Belgian priest who devoted his life to missionary work among the Hawaiian lepers.

Born in Belgium in 1840, he joined the Society of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in 1858 and went as a missionary to the Sandwich (Hawaiian)

Islands in 1863. He reached Honolulu in 1864 and was ordained a priest the same year.

Moved by the miserable condition of the lepers whom the Hawaiian government had deported to Kalaupapa on the island of Molokai, he volunteered to take charge of the settlement. He served as both pastor and physician to the colony and undertook many projects to better the conditions there. He improved water and food supplies and housing and founded two orphanages, receiving help from other priests for only 6 of his 16 years on Molokai.

In 1884 he contracted leprosy, refused to leave for treatment and died in 1889.

He was beautified by Pope John Paul II in 1995 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.
