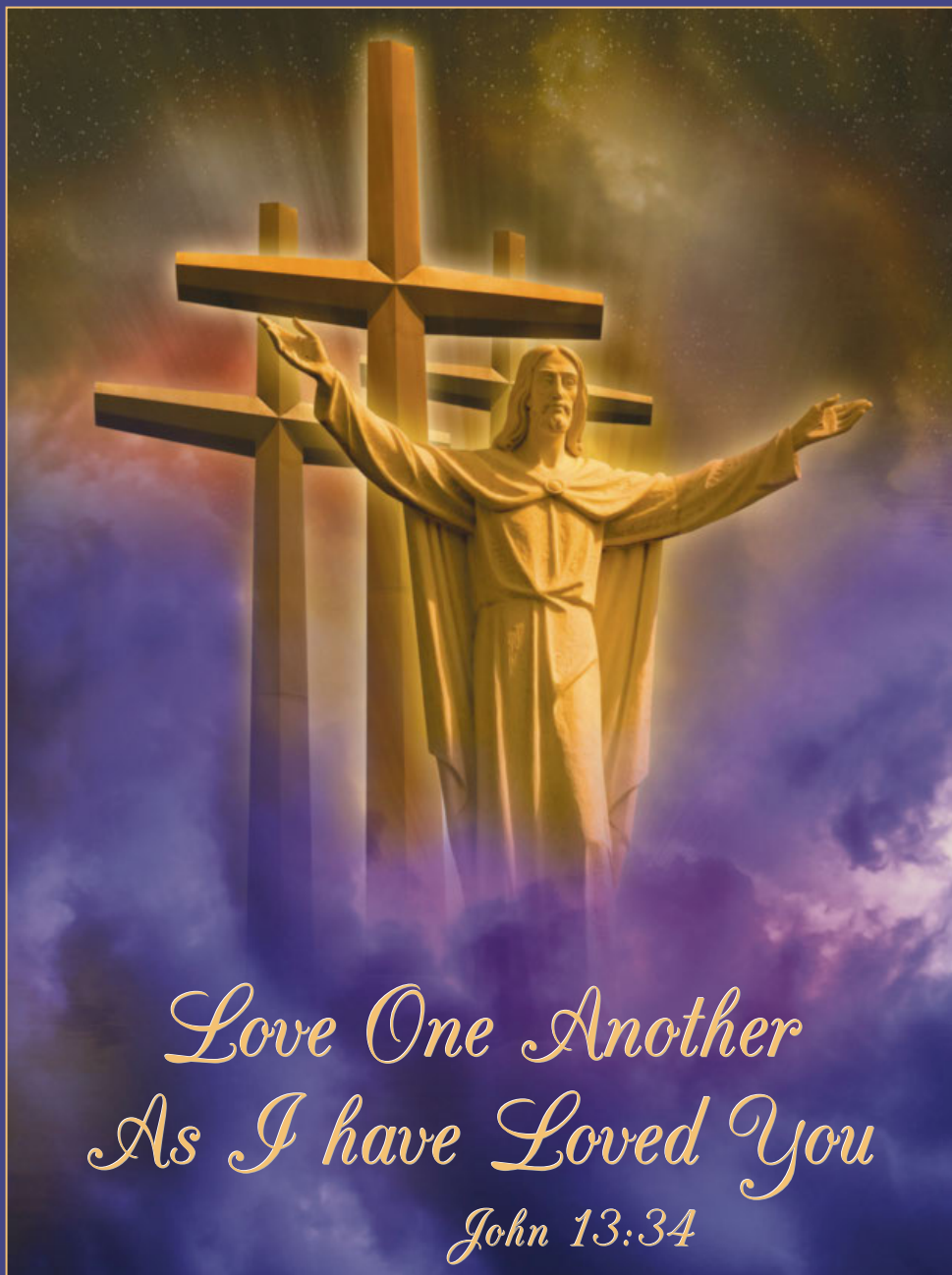

From the Pastor's Pen

The second Scripture reading this weekend continues the accounts about the missionary travels of St. Paul and his companions. The text says that "coming to Antioch, they called the Church together and reported what God had done for them and how He had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles." I was thinking how appropriate these words are in the year of Jubilee. The Jubilee began by the official opening of the holy door of Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome. Then the doors of the other basilicas in Rome were opened as well as all the cathedral doors throughout the world. The open door is a symbol of welcome, of hospitality, and of invitation. It is a symbol of an attitude of mind and heart that should be found in every Catholic church and chapel throughout the world.

Perhaps this image of the "door of faith" offers an insightful meditation for our parish family practice. We have six doors at the place of entrance into our church. I'd like to suggest that the number "six" be seen as six virtues of welcome, especially to visitors and newcomers. First, basic hospitality. We let people know that they are welcomed and wanted. Second, we greet them with words of welcome. Third, we are helpful. We answer questions, especially "where are the rest rooms." They may wonder about the Transfiguration scene behind the altar and we provide some insights. Fourth, we are friendly. We don't ignore them. Fifth, we smile. A smile breaks down barriers. Sixth, we invite them to come back again, to be with our parish family whenever they are in town.

Yes, we, like Paul and Barnabas, help to open the door of faith, or at least deepen the faith of others, letting them know that they belong. We fulfill the words of the gospel and the instruction of Jesus: "Love one another as I have loved you."

My prayers are with you each day.

Meditating Moments

I have read these words many times and yet I feel disturbed by them. What does it mean to "Be created in the image and likeness of God?"

To answer this question I must first articulate what my image of God actually is. Over the ages

God has been presented through various forms of art. Even a Google search is confusing, often providing images of God as father, creator, judge, or pointing hands, but also includes images of Jesus too numerous to bring any form or clarity. Eventually, I think our experience of God determines our image, one which is invariably static. If this is true then how am I and you, and every other human made in the image and likeness of God, with the final pronouncement that "God look at everything and saw that it was good."

If I am honest, I have no concrete image of God, but my image of Jesus is that of a middle eastern male, with dark hair and eyes, probably under six feet tall, and wearing clothing typical of a devout Jewish male of the 1st century. I also envision Jesus as well built, capable of heavy construction work, with strong, callused hands. Looking in the mirror this description is certainly not what I see reflected back. If Jesus, the man, and I are both made in the image and likeness of God, what does this mean and imply in the way I see others and live as a follower of Christ?

Over the past few weeks I have referred to **Emmaus People** as uniquely called to do God's work. I believe our call, our uniqueness in living out our call is what it means to be made in the image and likeness of God. My faith does not make me better or more holy than any other person, but it requires that I must respond to God, in whatever manner I have been called, to serve. I am also called to recognize the value and gift of other human beings. I am responsible to accept that each one is also made in the image and likeness of God, that they are loved by God, and I am called to respect and love them as my brothers and sisters. I must never dehumanize or objectify another human. I can disagree as others may disagree with me, but I should never force another person into believing or acting as I think best. God gives each of us free will to even reject God's grace and love. Sometimes I am forced to ask myself, "Do I think I am better than God?" I am not God! God's word is that all creation is good, so how can I condemn another as bad or of lesser value? What does made in God's image and likeness truly mean? I believe there is no room for bigotry towards or devaluation of another in God's kingdom.

Purchase a Luminaria.

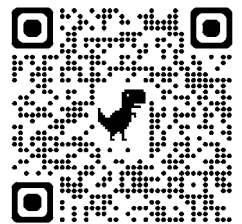


Luminarias purchased will honor those lost to cancer, survivors, those currently fighting cancer, and their caregivers.
