Thanks To Our Military Outreach Ministry



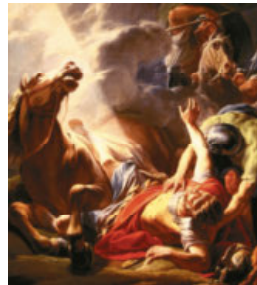
Members of our Military Outreach Ministry added a special touch to Memorial Day by passing out poppies after all Masses in remembrance of those who served and died for our country.

Meditating Moments



As you know, today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit to the followers of Jesus. There is one very significant person, however, who spread Jesus’ message that is not present at this event, Saul. Many times in my journey toward Jesus, I have felt closer to

Saul and his struggles with receiving God’s call to become a believer in Jesus, than I have to the other disciples. Like Saul I never physically saw or walked with Jesus during His earthly life. Additionally, I can point to a single event in my life when and where my conversion occurred, although not in such a dramatic fashion as Saul’s experience. I was not struck to the ground, blinded, nor did I hear Jesus ask, “Why are you persecuting me?” Yet in a very real way I heard His call, and my life turned in a new direction. I wonder, however, what my response would be if a bright light from heaven blinded me and falling to the ground, I heard Jesus’ speak to me and ask that same question.

There are different ways in which I persecute Jesus which can be summarized by acknowledging how often I fail to love my fellow human brothers and sisters as He commands me. I fear rather than welcoming the stranger. I turn my sight away rather than facing the person at the intersection asking for help. I put my comfort and security first rather than advocating for those shunned and voiceless. I can be arrogant, resentful, and wallow in perceived offenses. I could go on and on but this isn’t a confession enumerating my many faults and sinfulness. Instead I point to these things not for self recrimination but as a reminder that each day I must discern what has taken hold within my very being that prevents me from opening to, welcoming, and receiving the Spirit given freely to me through Grace. Like Saul, I believed I was trained by very knowledgeable people to live according to the law, yet I ask myself: “Do I persecute Jesus by using my laws/beliefs as weapons on other people instead of listening to their stories. What wounds do they carry, where do they feel confused, forgotten, and objectified; is it possible, through my own suffering to help another person heal? I must be perfectly honest; I cannot do this on my own regardless of what the prevailing culture in the USA states. I can only love and do God’s work through the workings of the Holy Spirit in my life. Today, as every day, I long for the Holy Spirit to be with me as I try to follow rather than persecute Jesus.

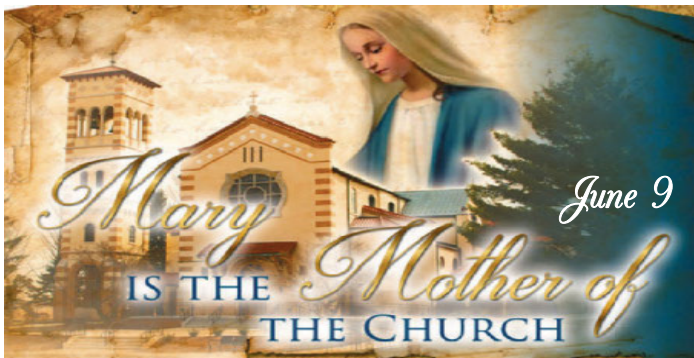

Throughout the centuries, Christians have called upon and honored Mary as their mother. In 2018, Pope Francis decreed that the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church be inserted into the Roman Calendar on the Monday after Pentecost

In this way, the Church specifically recalls Mary's reception of the Holy Spirit with the Apostles at Pentecost, as well as her desire to protect all who come to her Son in His Holy Church. The many mysteries of Jesus' life that Mary pondered were brought to full understanding in her heart at Pentecost. As the Church was fully established in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, strengthening the Lord's followers to believe in and to proclaim the Gospel, the Blessed Mother was there as the foremost example of what it means to fully say yes to Jesus.



At all Masses last weekend Jennifer Prusa, who coordinates our diocese's 'Journey to Bethany' program, shared information about this ministry.

The ministry was founded to serve those who have been harmed by clergy sexual abuse, including survivors, their families, and closest supporters.

Journey to Bethany connects with those who have been harmed by clergy abuse by providing services, monthly support groups, direct assistance, counseling referrals, and prayer groups, just to name a few.

How We Can Help! Jennifer explained that survivors of this abuse continue to need our prayers. For the next two weeks there will be a "Hope Box" in the Chapel containing prayers of the survivors. She encouraged us to visit the chapel over the next two weeks to offer our prayers or add one of our own to the "Hope Box".

Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. In 1949 President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14th as National Flag Day.

Disposing Of A Flag: If your flag has become tattered or soiled and it's time for a new one. It's important to dispose of the old one in a dignified manner. The U.S. Flag Code states that the preferred method of flag disposal is burning it (throwing it in the garbage is not acceptable). If you live in an area where you cannot burn it or are not comfortable doing so, here are some alternatives..

The flag can also be buried in a sturdy container. Many VFW and American Legion posts have flag disposal boxes available.

Why We Celebrate Pentecost

Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year, concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the church.



Pentecost celebrates the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

The Holy Spirit gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations

Right after Pentecost Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, preached his first homily to Jews and other non-believers, in which he opened the scriptures of the Old Testament, showing how the prophet Joel prophesied events and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

For this reason, Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church - Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers. The apostles and believers, for the first time, were united by a common language, and a common zeal and purpose to go and preach the Gospel.

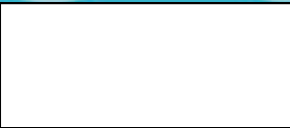
