#### From the Pastor's Pen

On this Father's Day weekend I extend to all fathers, grandfathers, foster fathers, God fathers, and fathers-to-be, words of appreciation and encouragement. Thank you for answering God's call to bring new life into the world and to foster that life with your loving concern and good example. My own father, Ronald, was a man of deep faith and integrity. I thank him as well and ask God to reward him with eternal life.

Today our Church family throughout the world celebrates the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. We name God as our loving Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: three names, three realities, and yet one Lord and God. The Trinity, of course, is a mystery. God is beyond our understanding and our human words. Yet we can understand the human words: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Father as one who is creator, who begets life, who sustains all life. The Son is the beloved of the Father, the Word, whom we know as Redeemer The Holy Spirit is the breath of God who inspires us, who gives courage and counsel and a spirit of reverence. This is the God revealed to us, the God in whom we put our faith.

The doctrine of the Trinity was officially proclaimed by the Council of Nicaea (325 AD) and by the Council of Constantinople (381 AD). The doctrine was necessary to be defined because of a heresy (false teaching) called Arianism, which denied the divinity of Jesus and by another heresy called Macedonianism, which denied the divinity of the Holy Spirit. Can the doctrine of the Trinity be proven? The Catholic Catechism states that God has left us some traces of the Trinity in creation and in the Old Testament. But the inmost being of the Trinity is inaccessible by reason alone. This mystery is revealed in Jesus Christ and is the source of all other mysteries.

Some heavy stuff here, but I hope it is helpful in affirming the Trinity in your life of faith.

My prayers are with you daily.

In June we honor fathers. Mother's Day became an official U.S. holiday in 1914, but a holiday honoring fathers did not become official until 1966, when President Lyndon Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day.

Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972. But this doesn't mean that the holiday was not celebrated before this time.

The idea for Father's Day is attributed to Sonora Dodd, who was raised by her father after her mother's death during childbirth. While listening to a sermon at church on Mother's Day, she thought about all her father had done for her and her siblings and decided fathers should have a day, too.

Because Dodd's father was born in June, she encouraged churches in her area, Spokane, WA, to honor fathers that month. The first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane in 1910.

Over the years, the idea spread, and people lobbied Congress to establish the holiday. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson, who had signed the proclamation establishing Mother's Day, approved the idea, but never signed a proclamation for it. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge made it a national event to "establish more intimate relations between fathers and their children and to impress upon fathers the full measure of their obligations."

#### Meditating Moments



Christians are baptized "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Please note the singular **name** as opposed to baptizing in the **names of**. We are baptized in the name of the Holy Trinity, one God yet three realities. This is the central mystery of the Christian

faith. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: the Most Holy Trinity "is the mystery of God in himself. . .the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them" (CCC 234). Over the years I have attempted to understand and explain the Trinity to many people. In all honesty, however, I still struggle and I am unsure if anyone can fully explain the trinity. In spite of our limitations, we profess the reality and existence of the trinity each time we pray the Apostle's or Nicene Creed.

I find the concept of "One being in three persons" as an explanation of the Trinity to be a word problem more than one of conscience understanding. Instead I suggest "one being with three realities." Let me try to explain. I have often wondered how other people describe me. Perhaps by a noun such as mother, sister, wife, daughter, teacher, companion, or friend. Perhaps using an adjective such as carefree, tiresome, impatient, controlling, or loving. Personally I think of myself as both complicated and simple. Biologically I am made of many parts, differentiated from a fusion of two cells that provided my unique DNA makeup. I am also a person who evolved over time both in physical makeup and personality, influenced and formed by my environment, education, people, and faith. All the nouns and adjectives mentioned above are true, yet I remain a single entity. So is the Holy Trinity simple different descriptors for God? Not at all. Rather for me, Father, Son, and Spirit are different realities of ways in which I encounter God; how I perceive God's presence. St. Patrick used a shamrock to describe the Trinity. Each leaf, stem, root, flower, and in fact every individual cell has a distinct physical reality and function, yet all are genetically identical, originating from the same embryonic cell. Similarly, there are times when I recognize and relate to God as Father/Creator, all powerful and all knowing; the Son as Jesus the word enfleshed, teaching and encouraging; or the enlivening Spirit moving within, guiding and strengthening me. Still the same God, which I experience though different realities, one divine nature, fully present within my life yet experienced in three distinct ways.

Just a few of my thoughts.

### Sandy Gagnon ~ Changing Lives ~ One At A Time



As Catholics we are encouraged to evangelize, meaning sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with others. Most of us do this in our own ordinary ways by sharing our faith in conversations and/or simply living a life that reflects the love and teachings of Jesus.


Sandy Gagnon who, after 28 years in her role as Director of Christian Initiation Ministry at St. James, is retiring on June 19. During this time she has taken evangelization to a whole new level by bringing over 400 people to the Catholic faith.

It may surprise you to learn that Sandy is not a "cradle Catholic." Born and brought up in a German immigrant neighborhood in NE Kansas City, she and her family were members of a Disciples of Christ Church.

When she graduated from Northeast High School, she had two aspirations. She was fascinated with science and wanted to go into missionary work. However, because her major was Home Economics with a focus on nutrition, she also considered a career in that field as well. Not being sure which path she should take, she attended UMKC to get the basics done.

She met her first husband Bob in 1966 and they married a year later. When he enlisted in the Army the couple, along with their dog, left for Germany where they lived from 1969 to 1973, returning to the

US with two children, Julie and Kurt.

transferred to UMKC where she received a BS degree in biology and a BA in chemistry in 1980. Continuing her education, she received a Masters degree in microbiology in 1983.

In1990 she received her doctorate degree from MU. While working on this degree, she taught chemistry and microbiology part-time at Penn Valley Community College. She was able to finalize her studies for this degree in her garage, thus avoiding disruption in her work and family life and the commute to Columbia.

Upon receiving her doctorate, she worked full time at Penn Valley until her retirement in 2009. Sadly, during this time her husband Bob passed away in 1996.

So, you may be wondering, why and how did Sandy, with her many degrees and work in the field of biology and chemistry and her upbringing in a Disciples of Christ Church, not only convert to Catholicism but also take on a second career, spanning 28 years focused on bringing many others to the church?

When moving to Liberty in 1974, Sandy attended Liberty Christian Church. However, five years later in 1979, she stopped attending any church. Perhaps it was her focus on science, perhaps it was God's will (you know He moves in ways we don't understand).

In 1993, one of her students said "I'm praying for you." That Christmas Sandy went with friends to Midnight Mass where, now deceased Bishop Raymond Boland, gave a homily that, as she says, touched her heart.

The homily touched her heart so greatly that the next year she and her family began attending an RCIA class at St. James led by Ann Tucker, director of the program. At the Easter Vigil in 1995, Sandy, her husband Bob, and children Julie and Ross were welcomed as new members of the Catholic church.

Just becoming a Catholic was not enough for Sandy. With a new focus in her life she worked with Ann her retirement in 1997.

at which time she became director of the program. That same year she became an Eucharist Minister and a Stephens Minister..

In 1998, she was appointed as a Lay Leader of Prayer in the Kansas City/St. Joseph diocese by Bishop Boland, a position that allowed her to perform certain duties when no pastor was available. The program was discontinued when Boland retired. In 2001 she received an MA degree in Pastoral Studies in Ministry from Loyola University.

During her ministry as RCIA director, Sandy met not only those in her classes, but also many devoted sponsors One of these was Gene Gagnon who shared her passion for learning and bringing others to Catholicism. They married in 2009 and shared happy years together until he passed away in 2013.

Sandy's job as Director of Christian Initiation shortened to RCIA (Now known as OCIA) journeys with those who desire to receive the Sacraments of initiation. This ministry includes ,interviewing prospective candidates, leading faith formation sessions, catechist training, retreat planning, communicating with all involved in the OCIA program. Also included is ministering to participants and sponsor formation.

Her other ministry at St. James has been serving as the Safe Environment Coordinator. This includes ensuring that all employees, volunteers, staff and others dealing with the parish children are compliant with VIRTUS, which encompasses the Protecting God's Children Program, preparing annual audit safety reports and having knowledge and implementation of all Diocesan and

requirements. In other words, anything that involves children's safety in our parish is under Sandy's quidance and watch.

Although she is leaving St. James as an employee, her presence here will continue to be both seen and heard. As a volunteer she will continue to write her weekly column for the bulletin. The name of this column was previously *Someone Is Watching and Wondering,* and contained articles relevant to OCIA. The new column is called *Meditating Moments* where she will share her thoughts with a different focus.

She will continue her Wednesday morning class *Sharing Our Love With Jesus* and invites you to join her in a Small Faith Community called "Emmaus People – Responding to God's Call" that meets on Wednesday evening. Both classes meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday.

Working in her gardening and spending more time with family members are also in her future plans.

## A Big Thank You

We want to say a HUGE thank you on behalf of In As Much Ministry food pantry for the massive food drive hosted by St. James Parish this past weekend! Your parishioners were incredibly generous and provided 3,503 pounds of food to our pantry!

Based on Feeding America's formula for calculating pounds to meals to dollar value, this converts to 2,919 meal equivalencies which equals \$11,647.47, plus \$80 in cash given by two families, for a grand total of \$11,727.47!!! We have been truly blessed!

As you know, food insecurity is growing in Clay County. We see this each week by the growing number of families that shop at our pantry. Here are some statistics from our food pantry to emphasize the growing need in our area:


In As Much Ministry Food Pantry	2021	2022	2023	2024
Average Monthly Household Visits	326	425	470	500
Total Individuals Served	10,733	13,690	15,832	17,736

In March, April, and May of 2025, we have averaged 626 households each month which is a 20% increase increase in pantry usage. In May alone, we had 687 household visits, our biggest month ever. This is a lot of information but we want you to see the growing need and the impact St. James has made. Our clients will be excited when they come and shop this month!




