

Saints Peter and Paul were the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and ultimate martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock', because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

In the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood."

From the Pastor's Pen

This Friday we join fellow Americans in celebrating Independence Day. Were it not for the sacrifices and valor of the colonists, we still might belong to the British Empire. So many colonists gave their lives for the sake of freedom. With just as much courage and patriotism over the years, so many Americans have given their lives so that we may remain a free and safe people. Today is not just a day off work or a time to travel and vacation, but also a day of reflection and prayer. We are a nation which has laws to protect our freedom and security, For this we give thanks and praise to the Lord.

However, freedom is not just about being physically or civilly safe, not just about enjoying the freedom given to us as a nation by the Bill of Rights. There is another kind of freedom that is even more important: spiritual freedom. St. Paul writes in his letter to the Galatians: "For freedom, Christ sets us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery." (Gal. 5,1) Paul asserts that before Christ came, we were bound to spiritual bondage: bound to lust; bound to greed; bound to selfish desires. Yes, we still suffer the temptations to these ways of bondage. But in his death and resurrection we have received the power to resist whatever enslaves us and the freedom to say "yes" to the ways of love and "no" to whatever holds us in bondage to sin.

So as we celebrate Independence Day, we also celebrate our call to be members of Christ and members of the People of God, given the grace to be spiritually free.

Take some time on Independence Day to re-dedicate yourself to the Lord and pray for those held captive, both physically and spiritually.



Feast of the Most Precious Blood
July 1



July 1st is the Feast of the Precious Blood and the month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood.

The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity.

The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

Meditating Moments



Have I forgotten Jesus' great sermon (Matthew 5:1-12 or Luke 6:20-26) or have I reconstructed His words to confirm my thinking and way of life? Have I conformed

Jesus' teachings (like my ideas of who is made in the image and likeness of God) into a "feel good message" which feeds my ego, politics, and understanding of what it means to say: "I am a faithful Catholic-Christian?" I find myself asking these questions more frequently than I previously expected on my journey of faith. Reading further in Luke's gospel (verses 21-46). Encountering Jesus' other words, I feel broken, lacking in my ability to surrender and follow Him. To summarize His teaching, if I forget all my blessings and fail to treat others as I wish to be treated, if I forget to show God's love and mercy but demand retribution, if I fail to forgive, I am rejecting His teachings, I am a hypocrite, and my failures are evident in the ways I fail to respond to the needs of God's children wherever and whenever I encounter one.

Jesus instructs me to lend without expecting pay back; love even my enemies; not to judge or condemn; give freely to anyone in need; forgive be compassionate; hear His words and act accordingly. Only then can I become one of His faith filled disciples, following His path to holiness.

I think there are many way in which I am poor, hungry, mourning and weeping, hated and insulted, even denounced, yet Jesus calls me blessed for what I understand as loss. Although my physical needs are well met I hunger and thirst for a deeper relationship with Jesus. I hunger and thirst for strength to follow His teachings. I hunger and thirst to forgive and let go of conceived insults and hurts. Even as I hunger and thirst, there are times when I fail to see one of my brothers or sisters who are also hungry and thirsty for empathy, compassion, love, respect, basic human rights and protection. I give to charitable organizations but do I go beyond monetary donations to encounter, listen, and fight for the voiceless? Do I reach out with my heart, body and soul? Am I judgmental and filled with condemnation, or do I seek to understand the thoughts, longings and needs of my brothers and sisters? Can I place myself in their particular situation so that I might better understand their thoughts, actions, and lives?

I feel I must read and reread Jesus' words in this great sermon with new eyes, ears, mind, and heart. I cannot walk this journey alone. I need others to walk with me and I need direction and guidance from the Holy Spirit. Whatever stormy path I walk I know I am never alone. "Abba, help me walk in gratitude and thanksgiving lest I forget others."

In 1930, the Church declared worthy of belief, the visions of the shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal from the May 13 to Oct. 13, 1917. St. Thomas, Apostle Feast Day July 3



Best known for his initial unwillingness to believe the other apostles in their claim that Jesus had risen from the dead, St. Thomas can teach the faithful about believing without seeing.

When he was told about it by the other apostles, he said, "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will not believe."


When Christ appeared later he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Pope Benedict XVI said "The Apostle Thomas' case is important for at least three reasons. "First, it comforts us in our insecurity; second, it shows us that every doubt can lead to an outcome brighter than any uncertainty; and, lastly, the words that Jesus addressed to him remind us of the true meaning of mature faith and encourage us to persevere, despite the difficulty, along our journey of adhesion to him."

Fr. Mike Roach ~ A Fond Farewell But Not Goodbye



It is with mixed emotions of sadness and happiness that on June 30th we bid a fond farewell to our beloved priest and pastor Fr. Mike Roach. We are sad that after 14 years, he will no longer be pastor of St. James but happy that he will be able to set his own schedule, relax and take it easy and enjoy a well deserved retirement.

His journey to the priesthood included a time of discernment and years of education. He lived in Liberty, attending St. James School (his parents were instrumental in the founding of the original school on Water St). He went to St. Pius X High School, graduating in 1971, Maple Woods Community College, SW Missouri State University, and graduating in 1977 from Conception Seminary College.



Following that he attended Kendrick Theological Seminary in St. Louis where he received his Master of Divinity degree. He was ordained on April 25, 1981 at the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception in Kansas City.

His first parish was the Cathedral of St. Joseph, followed by assignments to St. Therese, Risen Christ Church (now St. Monica), St. Patrick, and back again to St. Therese for 13 years.

When assigned to St. James on November 1, 2011, he said he felt as if he was "coming back home." After all, he was born and raised in the Liberty area. The day after his ordination he said his first Mass in the former church, now the St. Girard Event Center. Thus, it is somewhat fitting that his last Mass as our pastor is "at home" at St. James.

From his arrival here, Fr. Mike had a dream and vision of building a new church that would meet the growing needs of our parish then and for the future generations. At that time the northland area was growing rapidly and the former church could seat only about 550 people.

He had committees formed to study the feasibility of building a church and held focus groups to learn what features parishioners wanted in a new

church. Two Capital Campaigns were held to raise the required funds needed to build. Eight



years after his arrival that dream was fulfilled when our current church was dedicated by Bishop James Johnston on October 19, 2019.

It has been obvious from the very beginning that in addition to his forward thinking, leadership and administration abilities, Fr. Mike cares deeply for his parishioners and others who come his way.

He is welcoming, compassionate, understanding and has made positive impacts on the lives of many. He meets people where they are, walks with them, finds help if needed, listens to their concerns, celebrates their achievements and empathizes with their troubles and sorrows.

He is a source of encouragement for our vast number of St. James ministries in many ways, attending their events such as the Knights Fish Fries, Glory Be Tea, Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Lorenzo Feast Days, and the Do-Dad's Holy Smoke BBQ, and supports initiatives including the Advent Giving Tree, St. James Auction, the St. Joseph's Table, Roses for Mother's Day and so many others.



Our St. James School is an important part of his many responsibilities and he is passionate about its success. He can often be seen walking through the school, visiting classrooms, and talking with students. Their love for him was illustrated with this poster at his retirement party.

And so, we say *Farewell* to Fr. Mike – but not *Goodbye*. He will still be around St. James as one of our Senior Priests in Residence, at times saying Masses, officiating at weddings and funerals, and visiting the sick and homebound.
