Fr. Lac, a member of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, U.S. Province, was born on October 19, 1961, baptized and confirmed in Saigon, Vietnam.

He began his journey to the priesthood in 1975 at the Precious Blood Seminary here in Liberty, then continued his education at Rockhurst College (KCMO) and the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago.

Following his ordination to the priesthood in December 1989, he served as parochial vicar at Saint Francis Xavier Parish (St Joseph, MO) until July 1996, when he was sent to the CPPS Vietnam Mission. During his time there he served as Mission Director from 2007 until leaving Vietnam in 2015.

After a year of sabbatical he was sent to the San Felice Formation House in Chicago where he served as Director of Initial Formation. In July 2019 he returned to St Francis Xavier Parish in St. Joseph, MO as parochial vicar where he remained until his assignment as our new pastor on July 1.

His extensive periods in both Vietnam and the United States have enabled Fr. Lac to be fluent in both English and Vietnamese.

Let's give Fr. Lac our heartfelt welcome as he begins his new journey at St. James.

From the Pastor's Pen

"Into whatever house you enter, if a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you." (Luke 10: 5-6b)

Dear Members of Saint James Family,

Four weeks ago, the celebration of Pentecost concluded the Easter Season and turned us back to the Ordinary Time, but only during weekday Mass. On the last three Sundays of this second part of the Ordinary Time we encountered the solemnities of The Most Holy Trinity and The Body and Blood of Christ, then The Feast of Saints Peter and Paul. After four months of digesting "unordinary" Sunday scriptures we now should allow its fruits to show forth as we return to our Ordinary Time "mission", sent by Jesus. In other words, it's time to go to work.

Having been branded with the indelible mark – the cross of Christ – on our forehead when we got baptized, we should be able to chime in with Saint Paul, "let no one make troubles for me," as we dutifully carry out our "ordinary" time mission. I particularly like the insights that the commentator of the St. Charles Bible Study offered for this Sunday's gospel:

Actually, it is Jesus preparing His staff of seventy-two for their first great missionary journey – a kind of sales job. His instructions, practical and specific, would be a good program for any endeavor:

1. *Stay focused on the project at hand; allow no distractions.*
2. *Remember, you do not work alone; God is with you.*
3. *Pray and trust in God's help.*
4. *Stay alert at all times. Pay attention.*
5. *Value your product, because it is important.*
6. *Carefully discern when it is time to speak, time to be still.*
7. *If people are closed to you, you are wasting your time; move on.*

9. *Remember, Christ will do the follow-up work; you prepare the way.*
10. *Pray for more workers; that's an essential part of the plan.*

Meditating Moments



In the preface to his book *Prayer, Our Deepest Longing*, Fr. Ronald Rolheiser states: "there is no bad way to pray and there is no one starting point for prayer. All great spiritual masters offer only one non-negotiable rule: You have to show up for prayer and you have to show up regularly. Everything else is negotiable and respects your unique circumstances" **[and [personhood]**. I struggled with this idea for many years, however, I now have whole-heartedly embraced the idea that my prayer life and yours may be quite different. Yes, I know we gather for the great public prayer of our Church, the Mass and perhaps we share other common prayers such as the rosary, grace before meals, and of course the Lord's prayer. Perhaps you pray morning and evening prayer alone or with others. I myself pray the Jesus prayer daily as well as Psalm 46:10, "Be still and know that I am God." when I feel stressed or anxious. Although generally one hour during early morning is my regular time devoted to scripture, devotional reading, and prayer, I find my words and thoughts lifted up to God throughout the day. I never considered such random expressions as prayer, yet I now realize that any conscious time spent with God, even a few moments, is a time of prayer. Prayer does not require ritualized recitation, alone or with others. Prayer only requires recognizing God's presence and acknowledging my deepest desire to be with God.

I remember reading a book as a child (I cannot remember the title) but in this book a small girl asked: "God this is [Sandy], I am here. Do you see me? Do you hear me? I am scared." (I added my name added here – not the author's words.) I don't know why those words have stuck with me for so long, but I believe the innocence of that child's voice is what I also must bring to God. I cannot tell God what to do, I can only request help and direction as I also acknowledge God's unconditional love, mercy, grace, and forgiveness. If I am willing to "shut up and listen" God will always show me the way. God does see me, God listens to me, and God answers my prayers as Jesus assures His disciples and each of us who surrender to Our Father.

The St. James Landscape Care Team



The Landscape Care Team currently consists of a group of 12 ladies. They take care of all of the trees, evergreens, shrubs, and perennials around the church, the school, the social hall, the resource center, the event center, the prayer garden, and the parking lot beds – a total of over 800 plants,



They plant and prune perennials and shrubs, weed, weed, and weed the grounds, mulch where needed, rake leaves, and do some tree trimming. They also plant annuals in the prayer garden and in front of

the church, the event center, and, at times, in the fountain. They also plant cannas in the parking lot. Their work schedule is 2-3 hours every Tuesday morning from March thru November. Normally half of the ladies come on a workday and do what they can to try to keep the landscape looking good.



However, they also recognize that there is more that could be done in the time they are there. Funds for the materials and other supplies come from the profit from the Roses For Mother's Day event and donations.

There is definitely a need to get more people volunteering to help on this team, particularly young people, as the majority of current volunteers are older women.

St. Benedict Feast Day July 11



On July 11, we celebrate the feast of Saint Benedict of Nursia, the sixth-century abbot who gave Christian monasticism its lasting foundation in Western Europe.

He was born in Italy during the year 486. As a young man he spent three years in solitude, facing and overcoming severe temptations through prayer and asceticism.

Only after doing so, did he have the confidence to emerge as an organizer of monastic communities. His first monasteries were established in the Anio valley outside Subiaco, Italy.

St. Benedict was also the patron saint of Pope Benedict XVI's pontificate. In a 2005 general audience, the Pope said St. Benedict was a "powerful reminder of the indispensable Christian roots" of Europe. He cited the monk's instruction to "prefer nothing to the love of Christ," and asked his intercession "to help us keep Christ firmly at the heart of our lives."




Knights of Columbus Receive Top Award


