



## From the Pastor's Pen

This Monday, July 14, the Church in our country honors the memory of St. Kateri Tekakwitha. Her mother was a native American Algonquin who was captured by the Mohawks. Kateri contracted smallpox as a girl, which left her scarred. At the age of 19 she was converted to Catholicism and lived a very devout and celibate life. She died in 1680 and was canonized in 2012.

Perhaps her feast is an opportunity to reflect on the treatment of indigenous peoples and races as part of the heritage of our country. There is a term which became popular in the 1800s called "Manifest Destiny." It implied that America was an exceptional and mostly white nation. It was the destiny of our country to expand ever westward across lands occupied to Native American tribes. Land was simply annexed and tribes were displaced.

The rationale was that America, as a Christian nation, had the destiny to impose its values and way of life on all people. They would be limited to living on reservations. The notion of "American exceptionalism" justified such actions. It was inevitable that indigenous people would be resentful and fight for their land, their culture, their way of life. Battles and suffering ensued. It is a shameful part of our history.

If Christian values were the bedrock of this campaign, where was the reading of the gospel? Did they not understand the great law of love? Did they not hear the command to treat one another with dignity, respect, and justice? We cannot reverse history. But we can learn from mistakes, bad decisions, and injustices. St. Kateri, pray for us.

My prayers are with you each day.

## Meditating Moments



How many times have I asked for help? On whom do I depend? These are questions I ask myself but also questions I ask individuals who come to me seeking spiritual direction. At first there are answers such as "my spouse, my parents, close friends, teachers, faith leaders," and sometimes

there is a response referring to Jesus or God the Father. My follow-up question: "What about strangers, people you do not know? Do you depend on these?" While the answers may seem apparent, I think a deeper question is: "Do I think that the people on which I depend (the people collecting my trash, cleaning my hotel room, washing the dishes at a restaurant, making repairs to my storm damaged house, providing clean water, electricity, gas, or the clerk at the grocery store) as somehow less important than I am?" Are they inferior, less loved, or individuals to whom I can deny basic needs and freedoms?

In Genesis 2:18 we read: "I will make him a helper (NJB), "I will make a suitable partner for him" (NAB), "I shall make a partner suitable for him" (NEB) or "I will make him a helper as his partner" (NRSV); four translations of the same passage referencing to God's creation of the first woman. In Hebrew what is being translated are two words *ezer k'negdo*, Regardless of the translation, it seems to me that men and women are equal beings destined to help one another. Neither is secondary or subordinate to the other. By extension, I believe that regardless of one's economic, social, educational, occupational, cultural, or religious status all human beings are co-equal, created to help, serve, and love one another. Rabbi Sharon Brous recently shared the idea of community as the intersection of mutual concern and shared purpose; a community that sees ritual and gatherings as an opportunity to deepen connectivity; a community that is multi-faceted filled with wounded individuals, "each being essential to the greater whole." I believe a first step to building such a community is to speak honestly, and openly about our own disconnectedness and feelings of despair. We must build sacred spaces free of shame and stigma. Sharing our fears and vulnerabilities we also meet others with concern and care. Weeping or laughing, disagreeing or debating, we receive one another in love. Accepting others as partners in creating a more peace filled, just world, we find strength, wisdom, understanding, and pathways to spread the good news of Jesus. Although different and unique, I am not superior to others, rather I am dependent on fellow humans, past and present.

- Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)
- Bar Soap (bath size)
- Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's))

### St. Bonaventure Feast Day - July 15




Born Giovanni di Fidanza in 1221, he received the name Bonaventure as the result of an exclamation of St. Francis of Assisi, when, in response to the pleading of the child's mother, the saint prayed for John's recovery from a dangerous illness, and, foreseeing the future greatness of the little John, cried out "O Buona ventura"- O good fortune!

A member of the Franciscan Order, he steered the Franciscans on a moderate and intellectual course that made them the most prominent order in the Catholic Church until the coming of the Jesuits.

He was canonized in 1484 by Pope Sixtus IV, and ranked along with Thomas Aquinas as the greatest of the Doctors of the Church. He is regarded as one of the greatest philosophers of the Middle Ages.

# Fr. Ron Will, C.P.P.S.

## Celebrating 50th Anniversary of Ordination



This Saturday's 5:00pm Mass will be a Mass of Thanksgiving, celebrating Fr. Ron Will's 50th year of ordination to the priesthood.

Fr. Ron is well known to some who are members of our parish, as he was our pastor in the 10 year period between January 1994 and

July 2004. He may be familiar to many others as he has also been the presiding priest at weekend Masses from time to time. Or, you may know him if you've attended one or more of his classes and/or bible studies held at the Precious Blood Renewal Center here in Liberty.

Father Ron was born in February of 1947 in St. Sebastian, OH, where he was baptized in 1947 and was confirmed in 1956 at St. Sebastian Church. In 1961

at the age of 14 he began his journey to the priesthood, attending high school at Brunnerdale Seminary in Canton, OH. He graduated from St. Joseph College in Rensselaer IN and is also a graduate of Catholic Theological Union and

Creighton University's School of Christian Spirituality.

On Aug. 15, 1968, he was incorporated into the Congregation of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood at St. Charles Seminary in Carthage, OH. He was ordained as a priest on June 14, 1975.

After his ordination, he was assigned as associate pastor at St. Mary's Church in Garden City

KS on Aug. 26, 1975. he then joined the formation staff at Rockhurst College in Kansas City where he served from 1980 to 1987.

For the next year Fr. Ron was the parochial vicar at St. Anthony Parish in Linton, ND and then pastor from July 1, 1988 to Aug. 1, 1993. In the fall of 1993, he took a sabbatical for continuing education at Notre Dame Institute for Clergy in South Bend, IN.

On Jan. 8, 1994, Fr. Ron became the pastor at St. James Parish in Liberty. He then became the pastor at St. Mary's Parish in Centerville, IA on Aug. 19, 2004.

On July 1, 2007, he became the pastor at St. Francis Xavier Church in St. Joseph, MO until June 30, 2017. During this time he was also the parochial administrator at Seven Dolors Parish in Hurlingen, MO. On July 1, 2017, Fr. Ron took a sabbatical.

In 2018, following his sabbatical, he returned to the Precious Blood Renewal Center in Liberty as director and also became the sponsor for the Liberty Companions which has continued to date.

Over the last fifty years, Fr. Ron has been on the provincial council for the former Kansas City Province and is currently on the U.S. Province Provincial Council.

Known as a dynamic and inspiring speaker, Fr. Ron has a special interest in helping form intentional disciples of Jesus, encouraging others to go spiritually deep-sea diving to explore a deeper relationship with God, and walking with people as they dive into the ocean of God's mystery actually experiencing God rather than simply dipping one's toe into the water.

He has produced a number of video reflections on topics like *The Eucharistic Prayers*, *Encounters of the 4th Kind*, *Living in the Season of the Holy Spirit* and *Journey to Emmaus in Contemporary Scenes* and more.

In all of these reflections, Fr. Ron relates easily understandable examples. In *Encounters of the 4th Kind* he discusses the encounters of human beings and non-human beings (spiritual beings and God) and tells, among other examples, of a close and real encounter, the story of the Virgin Mary's encounter with the Angel Gabriel.

In *Living in the Season of the Holy Spirit*, he brings to life what it means to live under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

In an Easter Season series on *Journey to Emmaus in Contemporary Scenes* we are challenged to see that the Kingdom of God is among us - unfolding to us that Jesus is with us today.

While not working on developing video and in-person programs, Fr. Ron is passionate about the sanctity of marriage and strengthening the relationships of couples.

He is deeply involved in the Worldwide Marriage Encounter Weekend programs, having participated in his first weekend in 1978, three years after his ordination. Forty-seven years

later, Fr. Ron is still an active participant in the program, bolstering not only thousands of marriage relationships, but also his relationships with

married couples, the Catholic community, and the Church, as well. "I became a better priest," he says. "I am a much better priest because I'm involved in Marriage Encounter."

In addition, he hosts a weekly radio program, *The Spice of Marriage*, during which he shares tips for married couples to live a passionate and loving relationship, leading to their cherishing each other on a daily basis.

Fr. Ron is also involved in the Liberty area Ministerial Alliance, a group that includes representatives of other Christian faiths who focus on what they have in common as Christians rather than the differences.

Hundreds, perhaps thousands, have been blessed by Fr. Ron's influence. People have been moved by homilies he preached, on prayers he led, and programs he facilitated. And, while he didn't see these as extraordinary, some found them profound, even life-changing.

When he learned this, he was shocked that they were able to remind him of what he had said even months earlier. Later, reflecting on this, he said, "I realized that someone beside me was working during those times and my heart burned within me, burned with gratitude for God's presence working through me."

Thus, it should be no surprise that his favorite bible quote is: "Here I am Lord ... I will go Lord, if you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart."





### Saint Kateri Tekakwitha Feast Day - July 14



Saint Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be declared a Saint. She was informally known as Lily of the Mohawks. Born near Auriesville, NY, she suffered from smallpox as a young child, which scarred her face and greatly weakened her eyes. She converted to Roman Catholicism at age nineteen and was renamed Kateri. She settled

for the remaining years of her life at the Jesuit mission village of Kahnawake, south of Montreal in New France, now Canada.

Tekakwitha took a devout vow of perpetual virginity. She was baptized in honor of Saint Catherine of Siena. Upon her death at the age of 24, minutes after her death, witnesses say her scars vanished and she appeared radiant and beautiful. Known for her virtue of chastity and mortification of the flesh, as well as being shunned by her tribe for her religious conversion to Catholicism, she is the fourth Native American to be venerated in the Roman Catholic Church.

She was beatified in 1980 under the pontificate of Pope John Paul II and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October, 21 October 2012. Various miracles and supernatural events are attributed to her.
