The St. James Point of Contact Ministry is looking for someone to handle the second Sunday of the month at the 10:30am Mass.


We have the other three Sundays of the month covered but due to a work schedule change we have this opening.

From the Pastor's Pen

"There is only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her." (Luke 10:42)

Dear St. James Parish Family,

This Sunday's scriptures call out and highlight who we are, to quote the mission statement of our parish, *"a prayerful and Eucharistic people ... called to love and serve everyone, especially the marginalized, with joy and HOSPITALITY."* Just over three weeks ago when I began my assignment in this parish community, I received so much welcome and offers for help from parishioners and staff members. Such is evidence of this community's spirit of hospitality. There are some other ways we can express hospitality, but we are on the right track, one which was well-trodden by our ancestors in faith (i.e., Abraham in the first reading) and the special way that Jesus pointed out to Martha in the gospel.

On July 12, 2025, the New York Post published an article reporting that in the Canyon Trails community in Arizona a homeowner was repeatedly fined by his homeowners association for giving out, on hot days, free refreshing waters to passersby from his own home's driveway. Father Abraham was lucky to exercise his freedom to be hospitable to strangers and generously share his blessings with people in need. I just wonder how three men could eat all the bread made from "one third of a bushel of fine flour" (1 bushel = 9 seahs) and "a tender choice steer." Perhaps, this virtue of compassion and hospitality was so well preserved and practiced among God's faithful that Jesus kept inviting those who were in need and trodden down to come to Him. (see Matthew 11: 28-30)

We, nowadays, are just as anxious as Martha in trying to be generous and hospitable to our guests. Martha was true to her Abrahamic faith tradition and to herself in busying herself so much to make sure Jesus' material needs were met that she was not there to listen to what Jesus had to share. Her sister Mary provided for Jesus what Martha did not: personal attentiveness. Mary was personally present to Jesus and listened to what He wanted to share.

May we faithfully make alive the faith tradition of Jesus as we, instead of speaking to, make effort to listen to God and one another.

St. Mary Magdalene Feast Day July 22



St. Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace.

The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels.

She is the patroness of converts, repentant sinners, sexual temptation, pharmacists, tanners and women, and many other places and causes.

Meditating Moments



In Chinese philosophy, **Yin and Yang** is the idea of opposites that interact, are interconnected and perpetuate each other. They are complementary, opposing forces, that together form a system in which the whole is greater than the individual parts. For example

Yin represents earth, femaleness, darkness, passivity, even numbers, valleys and streams. **Yang** is symbolic of heaven, maleness, light, activity, odd numbers, and mountains. Although different, **Yin and Yang** are both required for the fullness of reality and life. In my thinking, faith is similar; I hold opposites in tension while trying to surrender to the love God lavishes on me.

Let me share a few opposites as a way of explanation: sorrow and joy, unrest and peace, despair and hope, questioning and believing, stagnation and evolution, hell and heaven, death and life, tears and laughter, hate and love. These opposites are and have been part of my life and I believe they are evident not only today in our world but throughout the entirety of human existence. I know how easy it is to get enmeshed in negativity. During periods of deep sadness, I find difficulty in feeling joy. When I feel the pain of betrayal, trust seems elusive. When I am angry, forgiveness is not at the forefront of my mind. Some times my anger turns to tears but not laughter. For those who know me well, you also know I ask many questions and am not afraid to address controversial issues, even when answers seem outside my realm of possibilities. Yet the faith I hold deeply in my heart, the knowledge that I am a beloved child of God, that the Holy Spirit is my guide, and that Jesus is always walking with me is what sustains me. Through the events of Jesus' life I witness how pain and suffering brings love and grace; betrayal is met with forgiveness, despair leads to hope, and darkness is broken by light. Thomas Merton wrote in *New Seeds of Contemplation*: "Christianity is not merely a doctrine or a system of beliefs, it is Christ living in us and uniting [us] to one another in His own life and unity." He further states: "God's will is certainly found in anything that is required of us in order that we may be united with one another in love."

I think this means there will be many times when I must hold opposites in tension, and allow Jesus within me to lead me to answers and complementarily. The whole is greater than the sum of its parts, God is greater than me.

Friday, July 25 Feast Day of St. James the Greater The Patron Saint of Our Church



The son of Zebedee and Salome, "our" St. James is called "the Greater" to distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less", who was probably shorter of stature. He was the brother of John, the beloved disciple. Zebedee, his father, was a fisherman of the Sea of Galilee. Salome, his mother, was one of the pious women who afterwards followed Christ and ministered unto him of their substance.

James is described as one of the first disciples to join Jesus. When he first encountered Jesus, there probably was no indication that this was the day that his life would change. The dawn for him was not the bright beginning of a new day, but the end of long fruitless night of fishing. As James sat mending his nets in the boat with his brother John and his father Zebedee, he must have watched in wonder as his partner Simon brought in nets loaded with fish he had caught at the command of Jesus.

As Jesus walked towards James, followed by Simon and Andrew, He didn't pass him by. He stopped by their boat and called James and his brother John to do just what Simon and Andrew had done - follow Him. Without argument or discussion, James and John left their boat and even their father behind, and followed Jesus.

James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus chose to join to join him in prayer at the Garden of Gethsemane for his final prayer before his arrest and whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration.

Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for nearly forty years in Spain.

The Acts of the Apostles records that "herod the king" (traditionally identified with Herod Agrippa) had James executed by sword. St. James is the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament.

July - The Month Of The Most Precious Blood Of Our Lord



One particular devotion in the Catholic Church connected to the Passion of Jesus Christ is the honoring of his Precious Blood.

It is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how he spilled his blood for the salvation of humanity. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist and is something we can consume at Mass, along with the body of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine.

Over time the Church developed various feasts of the Precious Blood, but it wasn't until the 19th century when a universal feast was established.

During the First Italian War for Independence in 1849, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. He went there with Don Giovanni Merlini, third superior general of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood.

While the war was still raging, Merlini suggested to Pope Pius IX that he create a universal feast to the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. Pius IX subsequently made a statement on June 30, 1849 that he intended to create a feast in honor of the Precious Blood. The war soon ended and he returned to Rome shortly thereafter.

When the pope was in exile, he turned to the Blood of Christ for strength.

On August 10 he made it official and proclaimed that the 1st Sunday in July will be dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Later, Pope Pius X assigned July 1 as the fixed date of this celebration. After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

For these reasons the entire month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood, and Catholics are encouraged to meditate on the profound sacrifice of Jesus and the pouring out of his blood for humanity.



Kits For Kids Is Back

Help Love INC Supply Hygiene Kits for Low Income Kids in Clay County

Children living in poverty often go back to school without the basic items needed to help them manage proper hygiene.

When we asked kids what they needed for back-to-school, they said they wanted to "look good" and "smell good." That is why we work with local school districts and area churches to provide low-income families with pre-assembled hygiene kits at the start of each school year. And the items aren't those tiny, hotel size products. They are full sized hygiene items.

How You Can Help

First. collect the items below, place them in a clear one-gallon freezer bag (one of each item per bag for a total of six items in a bag. We will need an equal number of boy and girl bags.

Here are the items the kids will need:

Toothpaste (2.5-5 oz)

Toothbrushes (adult)

Body Wash (12-18 oz, men's and women's) (avoid larger sizes)

Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)

Bar Soap (bath size)

Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's)

Please bring the completed bags to Love INC no later than Wednesday, July 30.

You can bring the bags any Monday through Thursday between 10am and 3pm, or by appointment by calling (816) 994-6927.

Second, you can send donations to help Love INC purchase the colorful, nylon, string-tie gym bags that make up the "kits." Because we purchase the bags in bulk, they only cost us about \$1 each. We will need 600 bags. When the bags are distributed, the kids will be able to select the color of bag they like best, and then the kit will be placed inside the nylon bag and given to the child.

Third, you can help us distribute the bags. If you can help, let us know and we will let you know where and when, typically the first or second week of August. We already have confirmations from the Liberty School District and the Kearney School District.


