

## From the Pastor's Pen

Back in 2021, Pope Francis established in our Church family the celebration of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, to be celebrated on the 4th Sunday of July. This time was chosen because it is near to the liturgical feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, celebrated each year on July 26 and who are traditionally named as the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the grandparents of Jesus. The theme for this year's celebration is taken from the Old Testament Book of Sirach: "Blessed are those who have not lost hope." Certainly it is a very fitting theme in this Jubilee Year with its theme "Pilgrims of Hope."

In his Angeles message in 2013, Pope Francis spoke these words: "How important grandparents are for family life, for passing on the human and religious heritage, which is so essential for each and every society. How important it is to have intergenerational exchanges and dialogue, especially within the context of the family." Yes, their stories are often filled with great wisdom.

Notice the theme for this special day is not only grandparents but also "the elderly." I am sure that all of you are highly respectful of grandparents and also the elderly, But there are situations in our country and world family where elderly abuse and neglect exist. Sometimes the elderly are placed in facilities that are substandard, the residents are ignored and forgotten and sometimes abused. Our Catholic faith teaches that every person is made in the image and likeness of God and should be treated with dignity and respect.

On this day of celebration for grandparents and the elderly, I would encourage you to express your love and appreciation not only for your grandparents but also for all the elderly. If grandparents have passed, remember them in prayer and thank God for the ways they influenced you, especially passing on the gift of faith. To my grandparents, Edward and Mary Theresa, Michael and Adelaide, I send my prayers and gratitude.



## Meditating Moments



I can only speak for myself but this year there seem to be more and more days when I feel saddened, even somewhat helpless as I witness current events in our

world. There seems to be so much hatred, actions taken against the poor, the homeless, immigrants, children and the elderly, people with different religious beliefs or divergent lifestyles. I keep thinking “What is Jesus saying to me; How do my activities/actions reflect of my faith; Am I so isolated in my comfortable lifestyle that I am becoming immune to the objectification and suffering of others; Am I truly committed to social justice, care of the environment, mutual, conversation, understanding and *agape*?”

Since my retirement I have been sorting through pictures, articles, books, and files that I accumulated over the past 30 years of involvement in active church ministry. I am discovering many interesting things (as well as many which need to be discarded). I found an article by Fr. Ron Rolheiser dated January 12, 2015, titled *The Importance of the Interior and Private*. He begins by stating: “A key, non- negotiable summons that comes from Jesus himself is precisely the challenge to reach out to the poor, to the excluded, to those whom society deems expendable.” He further states, that although global [and national] issues of justice seem to dominate our thoughts, we seem to forget “our private, little moral concerns” which may seem insignificant compared to the larger issues of society as a whole. Fr. Ron draws a conclusion: “Social action that does not have private morality as its base is not spirituality, but simple political action, power dealing with power. . .but not to be confused with real transformation.”

Jesus’ teachings clearly reveal that to live in the kingdom of God requires conversion and a change of heart enabling me to recognize my complacency in the greed, selfishness, bias, and prejudice witnessed by the devaluation of human lives that seems to dominate our world, nation, churches, schools, social groups, and families. In the 1960s, Thomas Merton admitted “it must seem like small potatoes” to engage in war against our private demons, when there are greater issues. Yet, without a change in my heart, true surrender and desire to follow Christ, how can I expect to address and fight for moral, structural change in our world. Without inner transparency and conversion, my efforts become simply my ego and power displacing that of another.

September 28**





**When I Called, You Answered**

Some of us have that friend about whom we are constantly discovering new things. Maybe we've known this person for ten or even twenty years, and one day at lunch we'll find out they're a direct descendant of a dead president or they once met a major celebrity.

"You never asked," they'll say with a shrug.

As annoying as this can be, it makes perfect sense, doesn't it? We never asked. There is something strangely sacred about the act of asking for something. It requires humility. It requires grace. It requires us to be awake, to be aware, to be vulnerable.

Too often we fall into a pattern of entitlement, even when it comes to information. We go through life thinking that a great cosmic conveyor belt of what we want is going to roll on past us, and we'll barely even have to extend our arms. We read our Bible and we hear all these amazing promises from the Father who loves us, and we get sort of complacent. *He's got this*, we think, and we shut our eyes to take a snooze on the road trip of life, confident that someone else is going to look out for stop signs and wrong turns.

It's true: God's got this. He *is* going to take care of us. But He wants us to be in relationship with Him. He wants us to be an active, receptive participant in our own salvation. See his patience with Abraham's entreaties on behalf of the righteous of Sodom: He wants to answer, not simply to tell.

He wants us to stay awake for the drive.


