From the Pastor's Pen

"Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?"
(Luke 12: 14)

Dear St. James Parish Family,

At the conclusion of last Sunday's gospel Jesus asks *"How much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"* (Luke 11: 13b) This Sunday's question does not seem connected to the previous question at all (Luke 12: 14); two different issues they appear to be. And they are not rhetorical questions. They are for each and all of his disciples, then and today, to respond to with deep searches in soul and conscience.

We know and acknowledge that we were baptized, confirmed, given the Body and Blood of Christ, and blessed each time we make the sign of the cross and pray. What we can't see, and often do not acknowledge, is that in each of those occasions and events God the Father imparts the Holy Spirit upon us. Whether we open ourselves up to receive or allow (ask for) the Holy Spirit to reside in us and act through us, the Spirit is to be discerned in our thoughts and expressed in our deeds. The bottom line is, the Holy Spirit is with and in us. That's more than enough to equip us with potential to wisely manage our spiritual as well as worldly affairs.

We may spiritually agree with the teaching that *"Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!"* (Ecclesiastes 1: 2), but our daily attitudes and behaviors may disagree. *"To compete and/or to survive in this world nowadays we have to be realistic and practical"* – our excuse. Difficult and complicated life gets these days! But rather than calling on Jesus to be the judge or arbitrator in our current affairs, let the advice given to the Colossians guide our deliberation, *"take off the old self with its practices, and put on the new self, which is being renewed, for knowledge, in the image of its creator."* (Colossians 3:9-10)

That's the substance of *"having been baptized in Christ"* for us.

Meditating Moments



Perhaps my writing last week seemed somewhat dark and despairing. Today, I want to offer a follow-up, inspired by this image. I also wish to introduce the idea of two faiths suggested by Thomas Merton in his book *Life and Holiness*: “[First, an] external

faith in human society with all its inert patrimony of assumptions and prejudices, a faith based on fear of solitude and on the need to **‘belong’** to the group and to accept its standards with passive acquiescence.” Or secondly, “a faith in what we do not ‘see’, a faith in the transcendent and invisible God, a faith that goes beyond all proofs, a faith that demands an interior revolution of one’s whole self and a reorientation of one’s existence *in a contrary sense* to the orientation taken by mundane prejudice. Such faith as this is a complete acceptance **not only of the existence of God. . .but as the center and meaning of all existence, and more particularly of our own life.**” I believe this second idea of faith is what I am called to as I profess my faith as a follower of Jesus. Such faith, believing in the existence of God and willing to surrender myself completely to God is the only thing which sustains me and enables me to see ‘light in the darkness’. The idea of a revolution in my life, however, requires some time for contemplation and thought. Is my faith limited by my intellect, preconceived ideas, or need for security and acceptance in like-minded groups?

Sad as this may seem, I confess difficulty in understanding others who hold ideas, concepts, and thoughts which appear polarizing and morally unacceptable to me. I do not understand belligerent voices, name-calling and put-downs. I cannot comprehend elevating oneself in order to demean and objectify others. Conversely, I realize that I have not fully undertaken those steps necessary for an interior revolution in which I willingly surrender completely to God. I am at that place in my life when I have accepted that I am a beloved child of God, but I have yet to see individuals who appear to embrace Merton’s first idea of faith, as graced and unconditionally loved by God. I think I feel that God should punish them in some way and set them on the correct path, which of course is the path I am taking. Recently, however, I seem to hear these words: “All I ask is for you to be and embrace the person (Sandy L.) that I created as you also let each of my children also embrace their unique personhood, making a choice to surrender to me or not.” Lord I pray: Help me to see your light in others.

Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord Wednesday, August 6



The feast of the Transfiguration of Christ celebrates the revelation of Christ's divine glory on Mount Tabor. After revealing to His disciples that He would be put to death in Jerusalem, Christ, along with Sts. Peter, James, and John, went up the mountain. There, Saint Matthew writes, "he was transfigured before them. And his face did shine as the sun: and his garments became white as snow."

For Peter, James, and John, it was also a glimpse of the glories of heaven and of the resurrected body promised to all Christians. As Christ was transfigured, two others appeared with Him: Moses, representing the Old Testament Law, and Elijah, representing the prophets. Thus Christ, Who stood between the two and spoke with them, appeared to the disciples as the fulfillment of both the Law and the prophets.

At Christ's baptism in the Jordan, the voice of God the Father was heard to proclaim that "This is my beloved Son". During the Transfiguration, God the Father pronounced the same words.

NOTE: Each time we enter our Sanctuary, we are reminded of the glory of the Transfiguration as we see the large mural (33 feet 2 inches in height and 14 feet 7 inches in width).

Looking closely, we see Christ at the upper center with Moses and Elijah at His right and left. The three disciples are on the mountain: Peter at the lower left in a kneeling posture, John at the upper or summit of the mountain, and St. James, further down the mountain.




