From the Pastor's Pen

"Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God." (Sirach 3: 18)

Dear St. James Parish Family,

In the older translations of the Catholic Bible, the Book of Sirach used to be called the Book of Ecclesiasticus, which means "Church Book". During the early developments of the Church, this book was used to instruct people wanting to join the Church, similar to our current use of the book of Catechism to instruct the catechumens nowadays (RCIA-->OCIA). I wonder how well would the Book of Sirach be accepted as catechism in this day and age, particularly in western cultures such as North American's.

I do not know how it was before my time, but since my induction into North American culture at early adolescence I was encouraged to "stand up and be counted". In school, for example, speaking up during class time was regarded by teachers as participating actively and contributing to the class. From a stand out memories I recall having received a barely passing grade in one of my graduate courses in spite of good test scores, simply because I hardly spoke up in class (a required criterion I failed to pay attention to as prescribed in the course syllabus).

Scriptures on this twenty-second Sunday of Ordinary Time, in practical and realistic ways help guiding us to re-orient our current popular North American socio-cultural practices to the teachings of Jesus in our daily living. Having already journeyed over two-thirds of the way through the Ordinary Season of Cycle C, we are now reminded that we have neglected some instructions which are needed for passing through "narrow doors" into the Banquet of the Lord. Self-centeredness, self-entitlement, self-aggrandizement, selfishness, and self-indulgence, to name some, might be the present-day narrow doors one might consider passing through.

God still allows us opportunities to correct and set ourselves aright on the path into God's kingdom, and strive to pass through narrow doors – even barely so. Barely passing is still better than failing. Wouldn't you agree! God invites and provides.

"You have been told, O mortal, what is good, and what the LORD requires of you: Only to do justice and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God." (Micah 6: 8)

We respond and follow with God's blessings.

Becoming a Man After God's Own Heart

Meditating Moments



There are and have been many moments in my life when I question my faith. According to the Oxford Dictionary, faith is “complete trust or confidence; firm belief without logical proof;” or from a religious standpoint, “spiritual


apprehension of divine truth apart from proof.” Perhaps this is where I find inner conflict. As a person trained in the hard sciences I am always looking for proof with the realization that facts change over time, thus altering what I understood as truth. In fact given “truths” such as the length of a meter or the makeup of the periodic table, are human constructs which are accepted yet also changeable when new information/data is available. Yet, from a religious understanding there appear to be unchangeable truths which cannot be proven by collecting new data.

Thomas Merton wrote: “Christian faith in the full sense of the word, is not just acceptance of ‘truths about’ Christ . . . [it] is the rejection of everything that is not Christ in order that all life, all truth, all hope, all reality may be sought and found ‘in Christ.’” (*Life and Holiness*, 1962) These words make sense to me especially as I try to see Christ in others, even those individuals with whom I have difficulty seeing acts of goodness and kindness. I have always found Christ's presence in the natural world, being and working with children, but I have difficulty finding Christ in the real circumstances that I see in our world, nation, communities, and even our Church today. Would Jesus say to me, “Oh you of little faith?” Do I lack the courage to choose faith over worry over the pain and suffering I see present today? Have I forgotten to keep my eyes on Jesus, to hold Him as the center of my life, the one in whom I trust completely, the rock which is the ground of my being? I know that Jesus is faithful ‘til the end, but what does this mean? I also know there are times God's actions are beyond my understanding or any proof I can offer. Why, for instance, does God remove people from my life or allow children to suffer? I believe that God sees things I cannot see, hears things I cannot hear, acts in ways I cannot, still it is difficult to sustain a faith which completely trusts God, especially when I feel my world changing so dramatically; when actions are taken that appear to regard human life as dispensable; when self-centeredness drives policies opposed to those which benefit the common good; and when vanity and pride replace humility and love. I ask myself, “What do I believe and where is my faith?”

Over the past several weeks I participated in a study/discussion group of Richard Rohr's book *The Tears of Things-Prophetic Wisdom for an Age of Outrage*. I was challenged by Fr. Rohr's words and the thoughts of other participants. In the final chapter of this book, he wrote: “Please remember that certainty – not doubt – is the opposite of faith. The insistence on certainty reveals a need for control, not a need for love or understanding.” I must confess, these words describe me and where I am in my faith. I have doubts, I ask questions, and I lack certainties, but in spite of where I am, I keep searching.




