From the Pastor's Pen

"But Moses implored the Lord, his God, saying, 'Why, O Lord, should your wrath blaze up against your own people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with such great power and with so strong a hand?'" (Exodus 32:11)

Dear St. James Parish Family,

People who frequented the celebrations of the Sunday Mass right before and after the promulgation of the renewal of the Sunday Liturgy would easily notice an addition to the Mass: the intercessory prayer (Prayers of the Faithful / Petitions) following the Creed. Nowadays the power of the intercessory prayer is so efficacious that many local communities also include this part as a norm in their daily Mass celebrations. For a very good and solid reason that this part of the Mass got restored to the prayer life of the Church; it had long been a part of the prayer life of those who had intimate relationship with God and were confident in God's mercy, like Abraham, like Moses, like Jesus and the many after him.

We recall, in the first reading of the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 27, 2025, (Genesis 18: 20-32) Abraham bargained with God in hope of saving Sodom and Gomorrah from destruction. Though Abraham was not successful, the story illustrates how patient and willing to listen God is to human pleading. We hear from today's first reading Moses' praying to God for his people. Fortunately for this people, Moses succeeded due to God's relenting heart, full of compassion and mercy. A bronze serpent on a pole was made as the designated sign of God's rescue for those who wanted to be saved.

God's compassion and mercy are once again recounted in Saint John's gospel passage we hear today. God's love for the sons and daughters whom God adopted through their baptism in THE ONLY SON once again spared them from death, the consequence of their own demise. *"And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believed in him may have eternal life."* (John 3:14-15) God spares none to receive back that which belongs to God. The crucifix for us is more than a symbol. It is for us the blueprint, the manual, and the guide, to meditate on and pray with.

Saint Paul told his student Timothy *"Beloved: I am grateful to him who has strengthened me, Christ Jesus, our Lord, because he considered me trustworthy in appointing me to the ministry."* (1 Timothy 1:12).



The Exaltation of the Cross honors Christ's Cross, an instrument made sacred by the Lord's offering of Himself upon it for our salvation. It is celebrated in both Catholicism and Orthodoxy on September 14.

This Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross was observed in Rome before the end of the seventh century. It commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross, which had been placed on Mount Calvary by St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, and preserved in Jerusalem. It then fell into the hands of Chosroas, King of the Persians in 614.

The feast entered the Western calendar 15 years later in 1629, after Emperor Heraclius recovered the cross from the Persians and returned it to Jerusalem.

Meditating Moments




Sandy is a creature of habit. I have my morning routine which includes dressing, making my bed, fixing my coffee and enjoying the first cup while I read the daily scripture, various commentaries, and meditate on its meaning in my life, particularly for the new day. If the morning is sunny and a bit cool, I try to sit in a comfortable chair on my back patio, taking in God's message both in the written form, in the natural beauty surrounding me, and in my meditative prayer. Next I, sometimes, with a second cup of coffee, consider the chores for the day, including my needed requirement for exercise. Monday, Wednesday, and Friday I'm off to the fitness center, Thursday to daily Mass, Tuesday to mow (provided it isn't raining), Saturday to work in my gardens, write or simply spend time sorting through the accumulation of many years, and of course Sunday I'm again off to attend Mass, receiving Jesus in community. Until the seasons change making mowing the grass and gardening unnecessary, my routine changes very little. Late afternoon I prepare our evening meal, which we eat between 4:30 and 5:00, clean up the kitchen, catch a bit of television, or gather with friends for spiritual discussions, knit, shower, and hit the bed around 10:00 pm. Some think I lead a very boring life, but I find great satisfaction, peace, and joy in my day to day living. I have a comfortable home, good neighbors and friends, grandson Michael for companionship and lively discussions, and I'm in good health. I also believe, that each day is filled with possibilities and new discoveries.

Since I began attending St. James in Liberty, I have found my life to be more securely grounded in faith in Jesus and His teachings. One of my favorite scripture passages is, of course, in John's gospel: "*Ego sum via, veritas et vita*: I AM the way, the truth, and the life." When you attend Mass at St. James, you have probably noticed these words on one of the panels around the ambo. I had not really thought about the significance of Jesus beginning this phrase with I AM until recently reading them as I prepared for Mass one Sunday morning. Jesus is speaking the exact words God spoke to Moses when Moses ask "what is your name," God answered: "I am who am. . . This is what you shall tell the Israelites. I AM sent me to you." (Exodus, chapter 3). I do not think Jesus used this phrase carelessly. I believe He was revealing His true identity, God incarnate, in-fleshed to become like one of us. God feeling, needing, and wondering what each day would bring into His human life. God just like you and I, hungry, thirsty, tired, frustrated, and perhaps at times discouraged. Just like you and I, however, Jesus continued to seek the will of His heavenly Father through prayer and time together. I believe this passage from John's gospel is not only revealing who Jesus is, but also the path through which my relationship with Him will continue to deepen and become richer. Jesus is God with me.





We look to the future of remodeling our Social Hall, the kitchen, and the restrooms. This will be wonderful for parish events. More to come on this as we move forward with architects.
