From the Pastor's Pen

"Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

Dear Saint James Family,

Pope Francis announced in 2019 that the Roman Catholic Church celebrate the World Day of Migrants and Refugees on the last Sunday of September. This year the US Catholic Church has begun to celebrate The National Migration Week since Monday, September 22nd and concludes the week today, Sunday, September 28th. In Rome and around the world, the Universal Church will celebrate the World Day of Migrants and Refugees on the weekend of October 4-5 with the theme "Migrants, Missionaries of Hope."

What do the Scriptures we hear today have to say about migrants and refugees?

In the first reading the Prophet Amos warned the people of Israel of the impending consequences while they were feasting on material prosperity, though plagued with social and religious corruption. Israel fell into exile by the Assyrian power in 721 B.C., and Judah by the Babylonian in 586 B.C. The Israelites always reminded themselves at the beginning of their harvest festival that *"our father was a wandering Aramean."* (Deuteronomy, chapter 26) We Christians claim this "wandering Aramean" as Our Father in Faith. That makes all of us descendants of and are migrants and refugees. Denying or ignoring our roots are acts of betraying our Ancestors and faith Tradition.

In the second reading Saint Paul taught his disciple Timothy to compete well for The Faith, and be a true leader by pursuing righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Through baptism we are with Christ in being "priest, prophet, and leader". So, in exercising leadership we are to uphold these valuable characteristics. Also, of the leaders whom we elect, are we not to expect the presence of these characteristics?

And the Gospel presents us, church goers, the story that we all have heard in church so many times, the story of the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man was the kind of man that we would want, a very much family-man and desired-sibling, so concerned and caring for his family members. However, he could not rest in the embrace of Father Abraham's bosom. It was not because he was wealthy or because he enjoyed his wealth; nor was he a mean

or cruel person. Rather, it was because he failed to recognize the needs and sufferings of Lazarus, readily visible right at his gate! (Calling to mind the Prophet Amos' warning.) Worse than that, he denied Lazarus of his fundamental human dignity, subjecting him to being a SLAVE: "Send Lazarus to..."

We may well remember that from the very beginning the Catholic Church has always been a Migrant Church. Jesus, her origin, was a refugee and a migrant. Continuing from the opening prayer at Mass last Sunday let us continue imploring the Holy Spirit, who resides in each person, to guide and strengthen us as we keep faithfully God's precepts (love of God and neighbors) so that we may be able to join Lazarus in the bosom of Abraham.

Meditating Moments



Recently I found these words written by a Camaldolese Benedictine monk, Catholic priest, author, and songwriter, Cyprian Consiglio: "I can think of nothing more prophetic than to preach the gospel. Nothing more radical, more countercultural, than to nurture and promote values of the Spirit - love, peace, joy, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness as well as self-control - in little ways and great." For many years I have understood Jesus' words and teachings to be countercultural, but at the same time question how they are lived out in my life today. Fr. Consiglio's words seem to be applicable for ways in which I must interact and treat others. Am I loving, peaceful, joyful, patient, kind, gentle, toward all God's children, my sisters and brothers? Do I strive to act in ways that are beneficial for the common good? Am I faithfully sharing my time, talents, and treasures with those who struggle and find themselves objects of criticism and condemnation? Do I look into my sisters and brothers faces with compassion, empathy, and understanding or do I divert my eyes in order to block out what is difficult to see? Harsh questions and perhaps there are no simple answers, yet I think Jesus is telling me to always be present to anyone, anywhere, who is struggling to live fully as a human being and child of God. Sometimes listening and acknowledging their pain is all they are seeking. I need to be aware of their needs, not my own, or to any preconceived idea I have about making their life better. If someone is asking for clean water, food, safe shelter, warm clothing, or assistance with finding a job or obtaining medical care, there is nothing gained by saying "God loves you!" There is nothing gained by stating that the world is in a terrible mess, leadership is lacking, or funds are drying up. Standing in solidarity with my sisters and brothers is not some grand political notion or words escaping from the "sacred inner box" where I carry the words of the gospel. Jesus commands me to act: welcome the stranger, feed the hungry, visit the lonely, clothe the naked, give drink to the thirsty, and care for the sick. He reminds me to treat others as I wish to be treated, to love as He loves, to embrace the lowly, and to forgo places of honor and status, to lose myself.

I believe to lose, means I must rid myself of egocentricity, selfish desires, feelings of "poor me", fears and anxiety. I must trust in God, knowing that I am never alone. Jesus is my constant companion, surrounding me with His spirit, guiding me along the beautiful path of life as a total, complete, and unique human being - God's beloved child. I am not suggesting that following Jesus' message is easy, but is there any other true choice? Nurturing "values of the Spirit - love, peace, joy, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness as well as self-control - in little ways and great," may seem daunting, especially in a worldly culture in which we live, which appears to emphasize the opposite, but I believe this is the only way to live as an authentic Catholic Christian. What do you think?

ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Monday, September 8, 2025

The Pastoral Council May meeting was called to order at 7:03pm by Chairperson Eddie Baker. Council Members present were Fr Lac, Kevin Casel, Dee Rosekrans, Joan Peluso, Jeff Ridder, Cindy Lamas, Chris Fullinwider, Scott Kollasch, Corrine Sebranek and Deacon Chuck Koesterer. Dee Rosekrans began the meeting with a prayer.

Guest Speaker: St James School Principal Jennifer Smith

Principal Smith shared with the Council that the school enrollment has increased from 333 students in the last school year to 379 this year. The Aftercare Program currently has 67 students. There are 50 children who are Missouri Scholarship students in grades K-8. These scholarships have brought in over \$318,000.

The new playground construction will begin on October 2nd, with plans to be completed about October 17th. This has been funded by many donations, including Father Mike's retirement donations, the PTO and several school families.

The School Auction is Saturday, October 25th, with a theme of "Sparkles and Spurs". The planning and fundraising are going well, as it returns to the school gym this year.

The school has a Safety and Security team in place to protect the students and staff. There are monthly safety drills performed, and all staff are trained.

Old Business:

Confirmation - With the Sacrament of Confirmation to be held at the Cathedral this year, it was discussed how the Post Confirmation Celebration will be done.

Chairperson Eddie Baker will contact our Confirmation Leader on details for our celebration for them.

Blended Mass – In development with Deacon Juan working for special masses during the year

Online Adoration Sign Up – Checking on adding to current church sign-up MSP Software and looking at other sign-up options.

Suicide Prevention – The Church is exploring hosting an upcoming Veteran's gathering.

Church Income Reporting – Chairman Baker to meet with Finance Committee Members to clarify reporting to the Parish.

Closing:

Father Lac shared that the sound system in the church has various technical issues, and they are being addressed. Various solutions are currently under evaluation to allow everyone to be able to hear in all areas of the sanctuary.

The church is awaiting bids to formulate plans for the renovation of Social Hall.

Father Lac closed the meeting with a prayer.

The Council's next meeting is Monday, October 13th at 7:00pm in the AV Conference Room.





Based upon Scripture the Church determined there are Seven Archangels who played an important role in Jewish and Christian traditions. At the Council of Rome in 745, the names of the three Archangels mentioned in Scripture were officially recognized: Michael, Gabriel and Raphael.

Although names of the other four Archangels (Ariel, Raquel, Zerachiel, and Remiel) appear in Jewish and Christian sources outside of the canon, they are not recognized by name in Catholic doctrine.

Our world thirsts for a personal, practical spirituality grounded in our lived experiences, one that draws us deeper into an intimate relationship with the living God. Have you ever desired to want to go deeper in your journey?

I am currently enrolled in the Souljourners Spiritual Direction Program at Sophia Center in Atchison. As a second year student, we are asked to meet with Directees once a month over this next year and practice our skills.
