

From the Pastor's Pen

Each October is celebrated as Respect Life Month in our country. We have all heard the message again and again: God is the giver of life; all human life is sacred; to end human life in the womb, simply because the child is unwanted, is a moral evil. Every child is a gift of God, created in the image and likeness of God. Our Catholic church, joined by other Christian churches and other religions, strictly condemn abortion and cry out for the defense every human life, born or unborn.

So also the Church teaches that the taking of human life at the other end of the spectrum is also a crime. The taking of life of those who are experiencing acute suffering is called "euthanasia, justifying the ending of human life as freeing the person from pain and suffering. The constant teaching of the Church is that God gives the gift of human life and only God can take human life.

But defense of human life in the womb or in the life of the suffering is not the only pro-life concern. In 1998 the bishops of the United States issued a document called "Evangelium Vitae," the "Gospel of Life." They teach that "opposition to abortion and euthanasia does not excuse indifference to those who suffer from poverty, violence, and injustice. Any political of human life must work to resist the violence of war and the scandal of capital punishment. Any politics of human dignity must seriously address the issues of racism, poverty, hunger, unemployment, education, housing, and health care. Therefore Catholics should eagerly involve themselves as advocates for the weak and marginalized in all these areas."

Let's use this Respect Life Sunday and month to re-affirm our own convictions to be pro-life people, always standing up for those whose lives are threatened in any way.





Meditating Moments



What comes to your mind, or what visual image forms when someone speaks about the "Kingdom of God." For many this phrase invokes the idea of eternal life and a vision of "heaven." For me, however, I think of the here and now living in the kingdom; Jesus' teachings ushered in the kingdom of God. In Luke's gospel Jesus speaks these words in reply to questioning by the Pharisees: "The kingdom of God is not coming with things that can not be observed; nor will they say, 'Look here it is!' or 'There it is!' For, in fact, the kingdom of God is among you." (Luke 17:20-21) I realize that Jesus is speaking about His very presence, but I also realize that His presence remains among us. We are living in the kingdom of God. Unlike worldly kingdoms, however, the kingdom which Jesus initiated is unique. Take for example, this simple comparison to the Roman Empire of Jesus time. Rome's empire was violent and one of domination. God's kingdom is nonviolent and stands out as one of liberation and service. Rome was preoccupied with wealth, while God's kingdom focuses on generosity, caring for the poor, the hungry, the thirsty, the lonely, and those objectified as outcasts. Rome's empire was driven by the need for power and military might, while God's kingdom is fueled by the power of love. Rome's empire rested on a pyramid with the rich and powerful at the top, using chains of submission for keeping everyone else in their place beneath the emperor and his leaders. Jesus' teachings turns Rome's pyramid up-side-down; the least shall be first, humankind living in solidarity and mutuality, (neither woman nor man, slave nor free, citizen nor alien), united and sharing the love of God. Not surprisingly, Rome saw Jesus and His followers as threats to their regime, and yes we know how Rome tried to end the threat. They striped Jesus not only of His clothing but tried to strip Him of His humanity, nailing Him to a wooden cross, leaving Him to die. Rome, however, did not succeed. The resurrection and Jesus' presence among us continues to lead and teach us how to live in God's kingdom, loving and serving one another.

I am saddened by the fact that Jesus' words are continually distorted and bent in ways to re-enforce our stubborn wants and desires. Unfortunately it seems to me that humankind's need for power, wealth, fame, and control, darkens the good news of Christ Jesus. In our pretentious minds and actions we declare to be His followers, while missing the point of His message and the foundation on which the Kingdom of God was and continues to be built. How can a follower of Jesus ever justify the taking of another person's life, livelihood, security, human rights and dignity? In my daily prayer I ask God to help me find ways in which I can honestly become a servant in the image of Jesus.

As Catholic Christians, respect for ALL LIFE is a great part of our faith. Each October, Catholics nationwide celebrate Respect Life Month.

Respect for life is all encompassing. One of the misconceptions people have about respecting life is that it only applies to the unborn. Certainly, much of the work of Respect Life groups is devoted to protecting the most innocent lives from abortion, but respect for life doesn't stop with them.

As Pope Francis reminded us, "the innocent victim of abortion, children who die of hunger or from bombings, immigrants who drown in the search for a better tomorrow, the elderly or the sick who are considered a burden, the victims of terrorism, wars, violence and drug trafficking, the environment devastated by man's predatory relationship with nature are all issues. At stake in all of this is the gift of God, of which we are noble stewards but not masters."

The Respect Life Ministry shares this conviction voiced by Saint John Paul II, "A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world" and knows that leading and promoting prayer for life is our most important task. An anti-life culture can only be defeated by the God of Life.

What can we do in our daily life to respect life?

- Become informed about the issues and share your knowledge with relatives, friends, classmates, teammates and neighbors. Visit www.usccb.org/ or www.humanlifeaction.org for federal and state voting records of your elected representatives.
- Fast one day a month in reparation for sins against human life.
- Commit to one hour a week in prayer for the sanctity of human life at Eucharistic Adoration. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the Chapel every Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00am – 9:00pm.
- Join the St. James Respect Life Ministry that meets the second Monday of each month at 6:30pm in the Parish Hall (lower level of the church)



We are called to accompany migrants at all stages of their journey: from the point of origin, through transit, and to their final destination.


Let this year's World Day of Migrants and Immigrants be an opportunity to reflect on how to do this more effectively.
