From the Pastor's Pen

"Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?"
(Luke 17: 17-18)

Dear Saint James Family,

"I am an atheist," famed Mexican American singer Linda Ronstadt responded when asked if she were no longer a practicing Catholic. (AARP 9/19/2022) When we compare the number of members claimed in official register of Catholic parishes and the number of participants at Sunday Mass in any given Catholic church, the data seem to indicate that there is a vast number of "practicing atheists" while still registered themselves as Catholics. Sparsity of Sunday Mass participation is becoming a "normal" scene, in spite of the already re-established pre-pandemic "normalcy" of Sunday church going.

Scriptures this Sunday remind us that the God whom we worship is the God of all creatures, and that only this God has the power to make possible that which is humanly impossible (healing of serious/fatal diseases, rising from the dead). This reminder should arouse in us the need to tangibly express our gratitude to God in concrete actions.

Having realized that he was cured of leprosy, a disease known in his time and culture as worse than death, the esteemed and respected Aramean commander acknowledged and expressed his gratitude by wanting to worship the God who healed him and is supreme of all gods, on this God's own turf (i.e., the two mule-loads of the dirt of the land where this God dwells). The Samaritan and the other nine lepers (presumably Jews), were cured. While all ten trusted Jesus by carrying out the instruction Jesus gave and got cured, but the Samaritan was the only beneficiary who returned to give thanks to God. Perhaps, the other nine were cured of physical leprosy but still bore the leprosy of the mind – the attitude of entitlement.

We today visibly and concretely profess our belief in Jesus' words *"your faith has saved you"* by our day after day return to God's house to celebrate the Mass, offering with Jesus our sacrifice of praise, of thanksgiving and of prayers to God.

Spaghetti Dinner - October 18

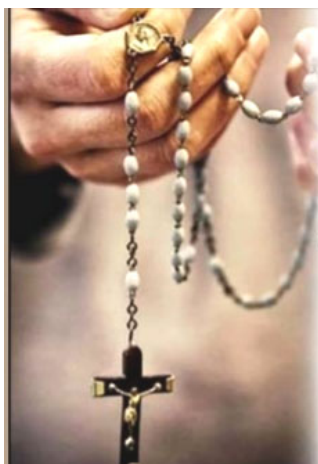


Spaghetti Dinner

Meditating Moments



In his book, *Life and Holiness*, published in 1963, Thomas Merton wrote: "We have seen that Christian holiness can no longer be con-

sidered a matter purely of individual and isolated acts of virtue. It must also be seen as part of a great collaborative effort for spiritual and cultural renewal in society, to produce conditions in which all men [and women] can work and enjoy the just fruits of their labor in peace." He continues, "we are all involved in the social, economic, and political problems of our time. The Christian cannot separate his [or her] life from the real world [and its struggles]." Of course when he wrote these words Merton's focus was on the growing communist threat and nuclear weapons. His words are still relevant. Our world is engulfed in many militarily fought wars, as well as wars of political violence, hate speech, and people being denied basic human rights and dignity. I can only speak for myself, but I am tired of the artificial divide between us and them. I am tired of the demonization of anyone who expresses a different point of view or lives a different life than what is mainstream or quoted as dictates of a particular religion or idea of social acceptability. I am forced to ask, "What has happened to civil discourse, understanding, and working towards the common good for all humankind. I am frustrated, sometimes angered, and certainly confused by the things I see and hear in our world today. There seems to be a renunciation of shared humanity and a need to be on the "winning side," whatever that means.

I must confess, I do not have answers to the many questions swirling in my mind. However, I do know where to look for guidance – reading and meditating on the Gospel of Christ Jesus. Jesus' central message is to love one another even as He loves us. Jesus does not suggest some type of romantic, touchy-feel good love, but rather unconditional love where the other is first and I am being sent to serve. Jesus also calls me to reconciliation, compassion, and community. He admonishes me to work for inclusion, justice, and liberation. He calls me to embrace all life, in every form, and at every stage. Jesus wants me to share His light in the darkness of sin and despair, not to devalue or objectify those who are in most need. Merton concludes his chapter on "Social Perspectives of Charity" writing, "To be one in Christ, we must all love one another as our own selves" which means "to treat him [her] as oneself, to desire for him [her] everything that one desires for oneself. This desire has no meaning unless one is willing to take definite steps to help someone else." In quoting the parable of the Good Samaritan, Merton concludes with this question: "Who are we? Priests, Levites, or Samaritans?" I know I have a desire to be a Samaritan, regardless of what I witness around me, regardless of the offensive, cruel actions and words of others, but there are many times when I feel discouraged, unsure what to do or say, yet I continue to trust God and find hope in trying to follow the teachings of Jesus.
