

From the Pastor's Pen

Just a few words about three events this week. First, this is Mission Sunday. As we are so often reminded, Jesus was a missionary and sent missionaries to proclaim the good news.

Each of us is a missionary. We don't go to foreign mission lands, but we do proclaim the good news of Jesus in the way we live our lives of charity. Good example is missionary action. We are also asked to support the work of those in missionary areas by monetary donations. Please use your envelope for that purpose.

The second event is the celebration of the feast of St. Gaspar del Bufalo, founder of the Society of the Precious Blood, this Tuesday, August 21. Gaspar was born in Rome on January 6, 1786 and ordained a priest on June 31, 1808.

He had a special devotion to the Blood of Christ and founded a religious community on August 15, 1815, given the title of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. He died on December 28, 1837 and was canonized on June 13, 1954.

He has left a legacy of many priests and brothers who have continued to proclaim the glory of the Blood of Christ. St. James Parish has been staffed by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood for many years.

The third event is the St. James School "Sparkles and Spurs Auction," which will be held this coming Saturday here at the parish. Whether you have a child in the school or not, all parishioners are invited to support this event.

You probably have read the details about the event in the bulletin. Please come, enjoy, and support.

Meditating Moments



Recently Fr. Richard Rohr wrote:

"Jesus was a singular figure in history - a teacher, prophet, and embodiment of the Divine. He offered a path to individual salvation through grace and

prayer. . . But he also offered something more dangerous: a revolutionary program of nonviolent resistance to empire, practiced by early Christians and echoed through history by prophetic Christian minorities - those who have embraced strategic, principled nonviolence in the face of systemic evil." Jesus' words and teachings continued and enriched the words of the prophets who came before Him, who spoke of liberation, enlightenment, and revolution which sought not merely to replace one king with another, but to replace authoritarian, unjust structures and systems with one that recognize all people as children of God, people united in their desire for peace and for sharing creation as well as their God given freedoms, respect, and dignity with one another. Jesus spoke of embracing lives of prayer, ego-death, and mystical union with God. Fr. Richard writes of a revolution in which: " the promised land is not only a political reality, but also a psychological and spiritual one," in which we recognize the *Imago Dei* - the divine indwelling that is already within each of us. Through such a recognition, I have come to realize not only my oneness and dependency with all God's children but also my oneness and dependency with all of God's amazing, ever changing creation.

According to modern archaeologists, anthropologists, and other scientists, we are entering the sixth mass extinction, termed the Holocene extinction or the Anthropocene era (the era of earth's life marked by abuse, violence, and human caused destruction). These ongoing events of destruction and loss are estimated to be 100 to 1,000 times faster than the natural rate, and are largely attributed to human driven habitat destruction, pollution, climate change and the overexploitation of resources. Still humanity seems driven by individualism and consumerism with little awareness of our place as creatures dependent on the natural world and on each other. To me it appears that our species continues driven by egocentricity, as opposed to prioritizing interconnected relationships, sustainability, and the common good. Our planet is both dynamic and fragile, in need of care and protection, not domination and destruction. Our human brothers and sisters are also dynamic and fragile, in need of care and protection. I do not believe Christ Jesus ever called me to dominate, abuse, use or destroy another human or the planet. Rather Jesus calls me, each and every moment of each and every day, to reach out to my brothers and sisters in unconditional love. He calls me to recognize the sacredness and divinity within everyone, not simply a few like-minded individuals in whose companionship I find comfort. Jesus calls me to live my full humanity within our shared human community and natural world. He calls me to treasure and value that with which I am graced. He calls me to be part of the puzzle for building unity and peace, for caring for and nurturing God's creation. Will you join me in unity, trying to follow Jesus in unconditional love, oneness, and caring compassion?


