IS NOT a Holy Day of Obligation This Year**



From the Pastor's Pen

"You have been told, O man, what is good, and what the Lord requires of you: Only to do the right and to love goodness, And to walk humbly with your God." (Micah 6: 8)

Dear Saint James Family,

Second to God's compassion and mercy, virtue is our available source for human redemption. From the list of the 7 deadly sins, enumerated by Pope Gregory the Great in the 6th century, vain-glory (pride) is at the top. The rest are: greed, lust, envy, gluttony, wrath, and sloth. To help ourselves overcoming this deadly sin we practice and live humility (the top of the 7 virtues, the rest: charity, chastity, gratitude, temperance, patience, and diligence).

Humility – the admission that one is no good and nothing without God, is necessary for redemption, as illustrated through holy persons and saints who come to God pleading for help. Jesus Ben Sirach, the author of the first reading we heard today, so advised the pray-er. The sincere prayer from the heart of the lowly and humble person always reaches God and brings back God's response to the praying person.

Of all the followers of Jesus, no one was more educated and successful in proclaiming the message of Christ than Saint Paul. By being a Pharisee himself, Paul was likely more virtuous than any of his contemporaries. Yet, he claimed himself as the least of the Apostles and willingly accepted public execution, an apparent humiliation, to encourage his student Timothy to persevere in virtue.

The two parables that appear only in Saint Luke's Gospel, last Sunday – the widow and the corrupt judge, and today's parable – the Pharisee and the tax collector, depict the right position and posture for one who comes before God in prayer. Sincerely humbling oneself, body and soul, in the presence of God leads the praying person into the heart of God who in turn comes to reside in the pray-er. "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

The wisdom on humility that we heard from Jesus Ben Sirach, Paul of Tarsus, and Jesus of Nazareth is, not only inspiring, but also necessary to us to learn from, as we are living in a time of global greed and rampant self aggrandizement. In many real and practical ways, we might also learn from those humiliated among us: the voiceless, the helpless, the haveless, the home-

Meditating Moments



I don't know about you, but I don't like snakes of any kind. I would rather encounter almost any creature in my garden, opposed to even the smallest garter snake.

Given my distaste for snakes, I

must admit I am confused when I read Jesus' words: "See I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves." (Matthew 10:16) Equally confusing to me are words found in Genesis 3:1: "Now the serpent was most crafty/cunning/subtle of all the wild animals the Lord had" (Note: Nowhere in the Genesis text is the serpent identified as the devil.) I understand Jesus is warning His disciples that proclaiming His message and living according to His teachings will be met with divisions within families, acts of betrayal, hatred, persecution, and perhaps even death. Yet their faith in proclaiming the Kingdom of God will be strengthened by the Holy Spirit (represented in scripture as a dove). I also understand the dove represents gentleness, compassion, understanding and the peace of God, which are characteristics I must embrace if I am to be a disciple of Jesus. The image of wisdom of a serpent, however, remains somewhat elusive to me.

In ancient Canaan the serpent was associated with fertility cults, which the Israelites were to avoid, because they lead to sinful behaviors. The serpent, therefore, became a symbol for temptation to sin, as evidenced by Adam and Eve. In fact, the serpent itself is not the source of evil in the world, but rather evil is due to humanity's decision to oppose God's will. In Hebrew, *aruml*, the word translated as cunning, forms a wordplay with *arummim*, translated as naked, underscoring the fact that man and woman became aware of their nakedness. Going back to Jesus' words being wise as a serpent, seems to imply that as a disciple I must be aware not only of those who are in opposition to my beliefs, but more importantly that I am aware of my own tendency to be ego-driven (following my own wants and desires) rather than be driven by Jesus and Mary's examples of obedience to the will of God. I have come to understand that the greatest evil lies within, rather than in the culture in which I find myself living. Like the ancient Israelites, there are temptations existing everywhere, but I have been given free-will to choose. I can embrace temptations leading to sinful behaviors, or grasp an openness to the Holy Spirit to resist temptation and be faithful to God. Perhaps serpent wisdom can help me become aware of the pitfalls of power, wealth, social influence, and fame. On the other hand, if I use power, wealth, social influence and fame with the power of the dove, I can understand and take seriously the best in people, the reality of being made in the image of God, and the transforming work of the Holy Spirit. As a disciple, I believe in the power of prayer, truth, and love. These attributes, therefore, I can live with the wisdom of the serpent and the innocence of the dove.

Please consider assisting with this important Mass Ministry.




WEEKEND SNOW REMOVER HELP NEEDED

- We have three snow blowers, 7 shovels and plenty of de-icer.



Prayer Services will begin at 2:00 pm on November 2. This special devotion provides an opportunity to remember our loved ones.


