

Day of Remembrance Sunday, November 16




On Sunday, November 16

From the Pastor's Pen

As daylight savings time ends this Sunday and we “gain” an hour, it is a reminder that the fall season brings a shorter time of daylight. The leaves have fallen from the trees and the grass turns brown. Darkness comes earlier each day. Nature reminds us that death is a reality. Our life in this world will come to an end for all of us. We who are Christians believe that we will come to judgment for the way we lived our lives.

In our Catholic Church family, November is the month of focusing on the “last things”: death, judgment, reward, punishment. Blessed with “free will,” we are accountable for our choices, the way we live in the light of our faith. November is a good time to evaluate the direction of our life. As a consequence of “original sin,” we all struggle with weaknesses and failures. No one is perfect. We are all sinners. Yet we also profess the mercy of God. Even though we fail many times to live the great law of love, still we are confident that we can seek forgiveness and make new beginnings. We are restored and renewed in the Most Precious Blood of Jesus.

We also call November the “Month of the Poor Souls.” Yes, there is the reality of hell, the place of eternal; and yes there is the reality of heaven, the place of eternal joy and peace. However, there is also the belief in what we call “purgatory,” the final purification of the Elect, a belief confirmed by the Council of Trent. The Catechism of the Catholic Church quotes the words of St. John Crysostom: “Let us help and commemorate them. If Job’s sons were purified by their father’s sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and offer our prayers for them.”

My daily prayers are for you and all deceased loved ones.


Our ticket table will be open before and after all Masses in the Gathering Space near the chapel.

Meditating Moments



When Francis of Assisi began his community he had a clear intention that: "The Rule and the life of the Friars Minor is to simply live the gospel." When he first wrote the rules by which the friars would live in 1209, it was mostly a collection of verses from the gospels. When the pope questioned Francis, perhaps Francis' response was: "What else is there that we need.?" I find myself agreeing with the idea that Francis presented: What else do I need except to read, accept, and try to following the example and teachings of Christ Jesus; to live the gospel? This all sounds good, but I also realize that I cannot reach this goal alone. Following Jesus is not simply about me and Jesus. Rather believing and living as Jesus taught, following the gospel, requires community. For myself the idea of community presents many challenges.

First, I must define community. I suppose I could say that community consists of like-minded individuals, professing similar beliefs and supporting one another. In those beliefs; but is this definition too narrow? I wonder what I would hear if I stood at the doors of St. James and asked everyone who entered, "What do you believe?" Probably a plethora of answers would be given, some which I might find contrary to what I believe central to my faith in Jesus. Does this mean those gathering at St. James to celebrate the Mass are not my community?

This presents the second point: Are all members of a community required to express their faith/beliefs in exactly the same way? I suppose again, if we all recite the same creed we must believe the same things. The problem for me lies in how we express/live out what we profess. Taking another example, doesn't every Christian pray the prayer Jesus taught His disciples.? My challenge with these words are many: Do I hold the name of God sacredly; Do I seek God's kingdom or do I equate God's kingdom with the United States; Do I trust God to provide for what I need or do my needs run to unrealistic, over-inflated expectations or desires; In seeking forgiveness do I forgive, even or in spite of being severely hurt by others; Do I let go of personal slights?"

Finally for this writing, do I place God in my personal Catholic Christian box, excluding others who believe, live, or follow a call that differs from mine? Confessing I feel good within my belief system, finding peace and comfort, am I so self-centered that I tightly grasp and hold on to my own God-box that leaves no room for diversity. Honestly, Jesus never taught or lived in such a small community, and I cannot either if I truly believe the ideals of St. Francis: The only rule that I need is to follow the gospel, living with kindness, forgiveness, simplicity and love.

ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES Monday, October 12, 2025

The Pastoral Council October meeting was called to order at 7:04pm by Chairperson Eddie Baker. Council Members present were Fr Lac, Kevin Casel, Cindy Lamas, Dee Rosekrans, Joan Peluso, Scott Kollasch, Corrine Sebranek and Deacon Chuck Koesterer. Joan Peluso started the meeting with a prayer.

Guest Speaker: Walt Holt, St James Finance Committee

Walt shared that the Committee oversees many items at the Parish/School, such as reviewing our financial statements, budgets, and serving as an advisor to Father Lac. They also lead or form Committee's for any large projects, such as our new church. They are in the process of developing the plan for the conversion of our former church and Social Hall into an Event Space. This space will be Parish focused, and there will be town halls planned over the winter to present the proposed space design. He also shared that the parish is 98% funded by tithing and they are exploring the option of online giving platforms from bank accounts. The Council will also appoint one member to be placed on the School Advisory Board and Finance Committee.

Old Business:

Completion of the new Playground for School - the weather has been cooperating, and should be completed the first part of November

School Auction- There has been over 400 tickets sold, 50/50 raffle sales are strong and a link to bid on auction items will be printed in the bulletin.

Online Adoration Sign Up – Checking on adding to current church sign-up MSP Software and looking at other sign-up options.

Suicide Prevention Class – Has been moved to the Spring of 2026

New Business:

Additional fonts in Sanctuary – After discussion, it was decided they were not needed, as we have a large one that already exists.

Father Lac closed the meeting with a prayer.

Over the past several weeks, work has been taking place constructing the new playground in the area behind the school.


While the work is still in progress, pictured below are new play areas that will provide the students with safe, multisensory equipment on which to play and have fun.
