

From the Pastor's Pen

*"Do you not know that you are the temple of God,
and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" (1 Corinthians 3: 16)*

Dear Saint James Family,

This weekend, instead of celebrating the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica).

For those who might be interested, the diocesan October Pastoral Bulletin listed October 19th was the anniversary of the dedication of Saint James Catholic Church in Liberty, Missouri. But in the Decree of Dedication of the Church of Saint James Liberty, Missouri given on November 7th, 2019 it is written that Bishop James V. Johnston, the Ordinary of the Diocese of Kansas City-Saint Joseph, did the blessing and dedication on October 3rd, 2019. We did not commemorate our church's anniversary of dedication, but we this weekend commemorate the anniversary of dedication of Saint John Lateran Basilica (the first and still is the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome).

Beyond the fact that this Basilica is "Mother of all the churches" of Rome and of the whole world, and more than bricks and mortar, there must be something of great importance for this celebration to supersede the 32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time celebration. Scriptures selected for this celebration may help us to have a glimpse into the significance.

The Prophet Ezekiel is "the prophet of hope." His prophetic vision of God's faithfulness, compassion, and covenant of restoration lifted the Babylonian exiles out of despair to return and rebuild the Temple of Jerusalem, out of which flows the life-giving water. Saint Paul to the Corinthians certified that believers of Christ are "the temple of God, where the Spirit of God dwells." Of course, we as God's temple are not built of bricks and mortar but of living body and Spirit. (It might be beneficial to re-evaluate our stance on capital punishment!) And Jesus in Saint John's gospel challenged the establishment to destroy his temple (BODY) so that in three days He would raise it up – the resurrection to eternal life. (cf. John 2: 19b)

Having been baptized in Christ we each have been given the Holy Spirit who dwells in our own body and soul. Having been anointed with Chrism Oil we each share membership in the Body of Christ (the Church). May we each in this celebration "come to believe the scripture" and be confident of the deed of Jesus.

Meditating Moments



Do you ever feel like this man; so much on your to-do-list and never enough time to tackle everything? I know I have and still do at times, I overextend myself, my tension and anxiety accelerates and frustration mounts. What should I do first? What task can I postpone? When will I have time for family, friends, myself, rest?

I recently found this quote from *Journey to Eloheh: How Indigenous Values Lead Us to Harmony and Well-Being* by Randy and Edith Woodley: "To overwork - that is, to spend time working for what one does not need means that one's life is out of balance, and it breaks the circle of harmony." Their words resonated with me, especially as I find myself worrying about so many things which I think are important and integral for my life-style. In reality they are probably not in any way necessary. For instance I enjoy the gardens around my house, but should I be stressed if I do not tend to them every day. Do I need to have the latest fashion, fastest internet, own hundreds of books when there are so many libraries, worry that my automobile is 13 years old, pay for 200+ channels accessible on my television, or change the furnishings in my home simply because something looks fresh? I think what I am actually trying to say is that I have worked, saved, and planned for many years to live comfortably but still worry about "what-ifs." Why are there times when I feel so stressed and anxious? Perhaps while I was spending time trying to secure my material wants I lost track of what was most important - developing my relationship with Jesus, rooted in trust and love. I wish I could say absolutely, "I trust in Jesus," yet I know there have been so many times when I fought the idea of dependency, believing I could take care of and provide for myself and my family. I also now realize that taking care of myself and family wasn't about needs but rather about wants. I was working for what I did not need and neglecting my most basic need; God at the center of my life. I have been out of balance so many times, and if I am perfectly honest have placed perceived wants and desires above my relationship with God. Material goods, wealth, position, and knowledge are not bad in and of themselves, but when they become a substitute for living what I proclaim to be my faith, I continue to live sinfully, stagnant in my relationship with Jesus.

Jesus taught to put others first, to raise up the lowly, to give up the place of honor, and become a caring, compassionate servant. If I stand, patting myself on the back for the good things I do, then I think I am like the Pharisee shouting his great deeds publically, instead of silently begging God for mercy. There have been and continue to be many times when I am unsure, when dreams and plans were derailed, and my path lead in directions I never expected. I cannot complain, however, as many of life's detours have brought me great joy. Today, I find myself once again at a cross-road, but as my relationship with Jesus continues to grow, I am not afraid but feeling peace and gratitude.

Veterans Day, observed annually on November 11, is a tribute to military veterans who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. This is not to be confused with Memorial Day, which honors those who died while in service, Veterans Day honors all military veterans, including those still with us.

Veterans Day, originally celebrated as Armistice Day, was first issued on November 11, 1919 by President Woodrow Wilson a year after the end of World War I. The purpose of Armistice day was to honor the fallen soldiers of The Great War for their sacrifice and bravery. 7years later in 1926, Congress adopted a resolution requesting President Coolidge issue annual proclamations on November 11, making Armistice Day a legal holiday.



THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA
November 9

Archbasilica of St John Lateran

Most Catholics think of St. Peter’s as the pope’s main church, but they are wrong. St. John Lateran is the pope’s church, the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides.

The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when the land was donated from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake, and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where popes were consecrated. The present structure was commissioned in 1646.

One of Rome’s most imposing churches, its towering facade is crowned with 15 colossal statues of Christ, John the Baptist, John the Evangelist, and 12 doctors of the Church. Beneath its high altar rest the remains of the small wooden table on which tradition holds Saint Peter himself celebrated Mass.

Journey to New Life (JNL). JNL was founded in 2013. Its mission is to maximize quality of life for men and women returning to the community from prison. JNL helps these individuals reintegrate into the community, providing a welcoming place that offers respect while assisting with basic necessities, housing, and job assistance. Each year JNL serves approximately 2,000 people, including individuals with substance abuse and mental health conditions. Your AGT donations will continue to help provide funding for these valuable services.

Kansas City Indian Center (KCIC) operates as the metro area's only social service agency for American Indians. KCIC's mission is to encourage social, educational, and economic advancement of the American Indian community by promoting traditional and cultural values. 


