

Mission Statement

We, the community of St. James, are a prayerful and Eucharistic people who treasure our Catholic traditions. As the Body of Christ, we are called to love and serve everyone, especially the marginalized, with joy and hospitality.



This Sunday, the last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This solemnity, also sometimes referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Though it was originally celebrated in October, this feast was moved to the last Sunday of the liturgical year in 1969.

It is more than a coincidence that we close out the year with this particular feast. On this day especially, we celebrate the supreme kingship of Jesus over the entire universe. His is a kingship not like the secular monarchies of the past and present, but one that is pastoral, absolute, and desirous of bring us to himself.

We say in the Nicene Creed that God created all things visible and invisible. So Jesus is King over all the planets, stars, black holes, quasars, and exploding suns in the blackest corners of remote space. He is King over the earth and all its waterfalls, rainforests, mountain peaks, desert plains, and dark sea floors.

We await the coming of Christ in his eternal Kingdom, but we recognize that he is already King.

From the Pastor's Pen

"The people stood by and watched; the rulers, meanwhile, sneered at him ..." (Luke 23: 35a)

Dear Saint James Family,

We celebrate the last Sunday in this Liturgical Cycle C with Saint Luke's account of Jesus' last moments on the cross, and hail Him as Christ the King.

Just one year ago many of us cast votes hoping to elect the right persons to positions of local and national leadership. Some whom we prefer and others whom we don't care for, were elected. Who among them are true to their words as they claimed during their campaign? Some, we expect will dutifully serve their constituents; others, we suspect will take us for a ride. Their true color is already shown or yet to be seen. From the not-so-distant past we have discovered, however, that some of the elected leaders did their best but fell short; others turned out to be ineffective, or just fakes and frauds.

The first reading, taken from the second book of the Prophet Samuel, gives us an account describing the conditions for David to be king of Israel – to shepherd and to be commander – unifying the northern ten tribes to the southern two tribes. We notice here the two conditions which did not place David on a worldly position over the people. Rather, they refer to his obligation and responsibility – to lead and to care for (shepherding) the people. In the second reading Saint Paul describes to the Colossians all about the kingdom of the Beloved Son of God – Jesus, into which they were transferred. Because this kingdom was created through Him, with Him and in Him, Jesus as its king surpasses all the positions, roles and/or tasks that we might know or expect of its leader. Recounted in all other narratives about him, Jesus seeks, rescues, reconciles, heals, comforts, feeds, holds together and confers on his people the fullness of life.

"Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." (Luke 23: 43) are the last words we hear today from Jesus Christ the King. As we reach out to this king and his kingdom, may our mind be inspired, our heart be moved, our life be transformed, and our world be changed.



Meditating Moments



Remember the passage in Mark's gospel where Jesus cures the Gerasene Demoniac, sending the unclean spirits into a herd of swine that were driven into and drowned in the sea. There are many

references in the gospels of Jesus' healing by driving demons from individuals who were suffering. I suggest you reread Matthew 12:15-32. I have chosen to begin with verse 15-21, which includes the prophet Isaiah's proclamation regarding God's servant, who received the Spirit of God. As your reading continues you will encounter Jesus healing another "demoniac who was blind and mute." I do not wish to focus on the healing, however, rather on the response of the Pharisees who turns truth (Jesus filled with and empowered by the Holy Spirit cures, forgives, and protects humankind from evil personified as demons) into their creative lie, suggesting that Jesus' power comes from "Beelzebul, the prince of demons." The refusal of the Pharisees to accept that Jesus's works come from the Spirit of God, results in them spinning their own "self-righteous" narrative. Jesus responds with the one sin that cannot be forgiven; "Whoever speaks against the holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come." In other words, whoever refuses to accept truth, twisting and re-speaking it into lies, for the purpose of retaining power and manipulating others, is committing sin against God's Holy Spirit. Jesus, filled with the Holy Spirit is "the way, the truth and the life" (John 14:6), to whom we must respond, "thy will [not my will] be done."

Observing the world in which we live, there are times I wonder who are the Pharisees? Am I one of them? Do I twist and manipulate the truth in order to serve my own purposes: power, greed, selfishness, neglect of others, self righteousness, and condemnation of diversity or differing opinions? Are their demons working within me, encouraging me to deny the workings of the Holy Spirit? Am I so self absorbed that I refuse to see and accept truth? While I profess to accept Jesus' message of love and self sacrifice, how often do I choose to lie, even to myself, that my actions are in accord with His teachings, rather than my words and actions are promoting my egotistically constructed agenda and self promoting ideas?

Perhaps it is time to rethink the words I pray so often: "Lead [me] not into temptation, but deliver [me] from evil." Instead should I pray: "Lord, I beg you remove the demons from me, which I follow in order to twist and manipulate your truth?"

St. Andrew Feast Day November 30



St. Andrew was born in Bethsaida, in Galilee

He was Saint Peter's brother and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He

said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him." (*Matthew 4:18-20*)

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (*John 1:38-39a*).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.


