

From the Pastor's Pen

"You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep." (Romans 13: 11a)

Dear Saint James Family,

We observe that the first two Sundays of Advent ring out the announcement of the end time and the Lord is coming as Judge, and the last two Sundays, the preparation for the Lord's coming in the flesh. From Sunday scriptures, a week ago the Prophet Isaiah sounded the coming of the Lord to establish God's reign. Today he gives us a scenario of what that reign would be like; quite attractive to many people, especially those being ravaged or destroyed by tyranny, division, violence, and disaster. The second reading today seems to give a detail to the heads-up of last week's that it is now the time to be awake and act. The correct, appropriate and necessary action now is to recognize that God's mercy redeems even "the gentiles" (=non-believers); therefore, be accepting and be reconciled to one another.

On the first Advent Sunday Saint Matthew's account of Jesus' warning of the coming of the reign of God (the end time) differed from the Prophet Isaiah's; instead, it sounded threatening and scary. Today's account presents Saint John the Baptizer's chastisement of those who heard his call and came to him to be baptized (ritual cleansing with water) but had the attitude of taking for granted their "being children of Abraham," therefore not truly sincere or humbly repentant. From the text we read those scolded here were identified as Pharisees and Scribes. They were respected for being the people knowledgeable of religious laws and traditions, and experts of the faith, (=pious and devoted).

We do believe and do expect that the Lord "has come and is coming" with God's kingdom, though not knowing how or when. We anticipate that through our ritual celebration expressing our longing for and our welcoming of the Lord's arrival, may we be blessed with a humble and sincere readiness in words and deeds to greet the Lord.

STAGE 2: Begins December 8 - From Monday, December 8 through Friday, December 21, we are unable to collect articles of clothing; however, we will accept monetary donations.



Meditating Moments



“Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.” (Matthew 5:5-9) I know these words are familiar to you; they are part of the Beatitudes from Jesus’


Sermon on the Mount. I think of them as attitudes for living a Christ centered life. Jesus concludes His sermon: “Everyone who listens to these words of mine and acts on them is like the wise man who built his house on rock,” which no storm can destroy. (Matthew 7:24). In contrast, those who listen but refuse to act will face collapse and ruin, like a house built on sand.

Although I hear these words of Jesus, there are so many times when I do not know how to act on them. How am I called to act to bring about justice for all, not simply a select few? Is my heart pure or are there dark, shadowy places where I seek “pay-back”? Do my words and actions truly seek peace, or are they a means to force my thoughts and ideas on others? Do I shy away from dialogue and compromise in attempts to avoid conflict? Do I listen to others to understand their needs or rely on preconceived ideas of their needs? I believe I show mercy, but again I must ask myself; mercy to all or mercy to a select few?

Dorothy Day, one of the founders of the Catholic Worker Movement has been quoted: “Our manifesto is the Sermon on the Mount, which means that we will try to be peacemakers.” In one of her letters she wrote: “We are trying to lead a good life. We are trying to talk about and write about the Sermon on the Mount, the Beatitudes, the social principles of the church, and it is most astounding, the things that happen when you start trying to live this way. To perform the works of mercy becomes a dangerous practice.” I think Dorothy Day tried to live the Beatitudes as did others working for peace and justice such as Thomas Merton, Phillip Berrigan, Fr. John Dear (the Non-Violent Jesus podcast) and folk singer Joan Baez. Perhaps to live as Jesus taught isn’t about winning the battle, but simply showing up and doing our best to live pure in heart, work towards peace and justice, and show mercy.

As a sinner, I know I fail many times, but with God’s help my failures will not be for lack of being present and sharing the peace or Jesus.

What Is The Immaculate Conception?



On December 8, we honor Mary, our Mother. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a Catholic feast celebrating Mary's conception without sin. Even though this feast day occurs in the liturgical season of Advent, which prepares for the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Immaculate Conception refers to the conception of Mary in the womb of her mother, St. Anne.

The Immaculate Conception should not be confused with the perpetual virginity of Mary or the virgin birth of Jesus. It refers to the conception of Mary, by her mother, St. Anne.

The dogma of the Immaculate Conception asserts that, "from the first moment of her conception, the Blessed Virgin Mary was, by the singular grace and privilege of Almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of Mankind, kept free from all stain of original sin.

The observance of this feast began with a Papal encyclical by Pope Pius IX, when he formally defined the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, *INEFFABILIS DEUS*, on December 8, 1854.

Several years later, in 1858, the Blessed Mother gave her name to St. Bernadette at Lourdes stating, "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Light out of darkness, Green amid the dry







The holiday season is approaching along with its accompanying stress.
