



From the Pastor's Pen

"The Lord spoke to Ahaz: Ask for a sign from the Lord, your God; let it be deep as the nether world, or high as the sky!
But Ahaz answered, 'I will not ask!
I will not tempt the Lord!'" (Isaiah 7: 10-12)

Dear Saint James Family,

Having heard the call to be ready by preparing ourselves for the end time (parousia) in the first two weeks of Advent and the closely approaching arrival of the judge during the past week we are now on the last days to catch up with whatever that might still be lacking in order to more fully celebrate the Lord's having come and is coming in the flesh. We may realize, however, that we have fallen into the same trap that King Ahaz had: though feeling desperate amid present reality, yet reluctant to put faith into concrete practice. A powerful empire was placing a siege upon nation. His neighbors and close advisors urged him to surrender. His prophet told him to not give in to secular pressure; rather, persevere with faith placing trust and confidence in God. "Emmanuel = God-with-us" makes a lot of sense in this circumstance.

To the Romans, a congregation Saint Paul himself did not establish, he wrote to introduce himself as if he were to visit them. We notice in today's short passage his repetitive use of the phrase "called to – called to be an apostle and set apart, called to belong to Jesus Christ, called to be holy." We have been called into the Church (ecclesia = a community of peoples of the same faith, vision and practice) today called to re-affirm that which was proclaimed when we got received into that community of faith. "N., the Christian community welcomes you with great joy. In its name I claim you for Christ our Savior by the sign of his cross. I now trace the cross on your forehead," ... "As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life." (the Rite of Baptism)

In the midst of all the hustles and bustles of these seasonal days may our activities help strengthen not only our belief in the heart that God comes to be with us but also in concrete action that reveals the "God-with-us" who propels us through the thick and thin of daily life.



Meditating Moments



Do I limit God's love? This is a question which recently has been a part of my meditation and prayer. Have I limited God's love only to the human species and more specifically to only the few members of my species who worship and profess the same beliefs that I hold dear? To be honest, I am unsure. I know I will never be able to completely understand God's ways, the extent of God's mercy, forgive-

ness, grace, or love, therefore, it seems heretical for me to attempt to selfishly limit God's love to a select few of my human brothers and sisters.

As my faith continues to grow and evolve, I realize that creation is sacred and alive with God's loving presence. St. Paul states: "What can be known about God is perfectly plain, for God has made it plain. Ever since God created the world, God's everlasting power and deity **[and love]** is there for the mind to see in all the things that God has created" (Romans 1:20). Thomas Aquinas wrote: "God brought things into being in order that God's goodness **[love]** might be represented by them; and because God's goodness **[love]** could not be adequately represented by one creature alone, God produced many and diverse creatures, that what was wanting to one in the representation of the divine goodness **[love]** might be supplied by another. For goodness **[love]**, which in God is simple and uniform, in creatures is manifold and divided" (*Summa Theologica* 1.47.1). Fr. Richard Rohr as part of a recent daily meditation wrote: "Acknowledging the intrinsic value and beauty of creation, including the cosmos, elements, plants, and animals is a major paradigm shift for most Western and cultural Christians." I believe God revealed Godself from the beginning of time through the **loving** act of creation, "God looked at everything God had made and found it very good" (Genesis 1:31), therefore, everything is sacred and everything is loved by God, our creator. "How dull are all people who, from the things-that-are, have **not** been able to discover God-Who-Is, or by studying the good works have failed to recognize the Artist. . . Through the grandeur and beauty of the creatures we may, by analogy, contemplate their Author" (Wisdom 13:1-5). I find that a walk in nature, not only reveals the marvels and sacredness of God's creation, but also provides a glimpse into God's eternal, all encompassing **LOVE**.

I cannot profess to know God's ways, but I do profess to experiencing God's **LOVE**, not only in Jesus, but in all the diversity of creation.

St. John the Apostle Feast Day, December 27



Saint John the Apostle, one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus was called to be an Apostle by our Lord in the first year of His public ministry.

He is known as the author of the Gospel of John and four other books in the New Testament - the three Epistles of John and the Book of Revelation. The authorship of the

Gospel is credited to the "disciple whom Jesus loved," and John 21:24 claims the Gospel of John is based on the "Beloved Disciple's" testimony.

John was one of only two apostles sent by Jesus to make preparations for the final Passover meal, the Last Supper. During the meal, he sat next to Jesus, leaning on him rather than lying along the couches.

John was the only one of the Twelve Apostles who did not forsake the Savior in the hour of His Passion. He stood faithfully at the cross when the Savior made him the guardian of His Mother.

After the Assumption of Mary, John went to Ephesus, according to Church tradition. The "beloved disciple" died in Ephesus after AD 98.

Reflecting On The Manger



The story of the birth of Jesus, as told to us by Luke, is full of joy in the midst of great conflict and sadness - even irony and rejection. It prepares us for the scandal of the cross by helping us see, in such a beautifully told story, that Jesus' mission is revealed to us, in how he came to us - in poverty and humiliation.

There, in the hay, we begin to know. There, in the manger, we begin to understand. Our God is revealed to us by coming in the lowliest of possible places. It is a meditation for our whole lives.

This story is here to bring us light in the midst of any darkness, poverty, he comes, the Good News is also a rejection, emptiness, sinfulness we experience. By reminding us of where he where revelation of who we are. We are the "people who walk in darkness." We are people who experience parts of our lives as dry and unwelcoming as that hay. We are people who, on our own, not only fail to know and understand; we

are capable of tremendous infidelity and stubborn independence.

We get our word "manger" from the Latin (and so French, Italian, Spanish) root, which means simply "to eat." Jesus comes, into the greatest place of our poverty, not only to be "with us" but to nourish us. The manger can be the place we go this Christmas to be fed with the acceptance, love, and peace we need. There is no place of darkness in which we need ever feel alone. There is no situation, no loss, no tragedy that need ever leave us empty. There is no sin, no matter how selfish that will ever leave us apart from God's love.

We have prayed, "Come, Lord Jesus. Come and visit your people. We await your coming. Come, O Lord." Now, our eyes are opened to the wondrous joy of his coming to us in that manger 2,000 years ago, so that we will know and understand his coming to us in our hunger today, and ultimately so that we will long for his final coming to bring us to the banquet that has been prepared, to fill all our longing.






