From the Pastor's Pen

Two areas of meditation are presented to us today: the baptism of Jesus and the baptism of each of us. First, the baptism of Jesus. The account of His baptism is recorded in all four gospels. Baptism was a sign of purification. John recognized that Jesus was the Holy One and questioned why Jesus should be baptized. Though he was sinless, Jesus wanted to show his identification with human nature. At the baptism, the voice came from the heavenly Father: this is my beloved son. In the rite of baptism, Jesus indicated that all who believed in him should be baptized, all re-made in the image of Christ, all would bear the name "Christian."

Second, this feast calls us to remember and reaffirm our own baptism. Most of us were baptized as infants. Infants do not remember the baptism and cannot affirm for themselves the call to discipleship. Parents and Godparents must understand and accept their responsibility to teach and train the infant in the ways of the faith. Those to be baptized as teenagers and adults must prepare to enter the waters of baptism by a thorough study so that they understand what they are undertaking. Even though the method of baptizing is often just pouring water over the head, the image of plunging into and being covered with the water still remains: death to whatever is opposed to the values of Christian life; life in Christ and in the Christian community. And even though the disciple may not live the life of love perfectly, with the proper disposition of sorrow and penitence, the disciple can always return to a way of full life in Christ. Baptism is not just a private affair, but commits the disciple to be one with all disciples in the family of the Church. For Catholics, baptism is strengthened and affirmed by the sacrament of Confirmation and frequent reception of the Eucharist.

Yes, this feast of the Baptism of Jesus offers a great opportunity to re-commit to faith and living the values of a disciple. Each time you make the Sign of the Cross, you are affirming the basis of your faith: your union with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Know that my prayers are with you each day.

The Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord January 11



This feast brings to an end the season of Christmas. At first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem an odd feast. Since the Catholic Church teaches that the Sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remission of sins, particularly Original Sin, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. Therefore, He had no need of the sacrament, as we do.

In submitting Himself humbly to the baptism of St. John the Baptist, however, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If even He should be baptized, though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be thankful for this sacrament, which frees us from the darkness of sin and incorporates us into the Church, the life of Christ on earth! His Baptism, therefore, was necessary - not for Him, but for us.

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin.

Why We Dip Our Fingers Into the Holy Water Font and Make the Sign of the Cross



When we dip our fingers into the holy water font at the entrance to the church and make the sign of the cross we are touching our forehead (our mind), our shoulders and our heart. It is a way of recalling our baptism.

It brings us back to what has brought us there in the first place. It is a reminder of who we are, and to whom we belong.

Meditating Moments



Eleven days into this New Year, 2026, and this is what my "New Year's Resolution List" looks like, EMPTY! I do not remember when I stopped making resolutions for the New Year, but let me say it has been some time. I felt

that such a list was a waste of time because my list really never changed much, nor did I. Year to year my list included challenging myself to live a more healthy lifestyle, eat less, lose weight, exercise more, grow in patience and understanding, forgive, leaving the past in the past, and completing tasks that seem to always be part of my "save for another day list." Although I continue to grow older, I do not seem to change in any significant ways, except physically.

For some time, instead of making New Year's Resolutions, I have tried to focus on relationships, especially with God, family, and friends. Please don't ask me to grade my success; not quite failure but definitely not outstanding. Spiritually I believe I have grown and continue to develop a greater understanding of God's presence in my life, however, I cannot state that I have reached the place where I regularly follow Jesus' teachings in my day to day living. Sometimes I think I am forgiving, yet the dark memories remain; I continue to build my inner-defensive walls. Other times I simply retreat, isolating myself from any individual or situation which I believe to be or to become uncomfortable or difficult. In the past I retreated into my vocation(s), working longer hours, striving for perfection. More recently, I simply retreat into myself, physically, mentally, and emotionally. The older I become, there seem to be more occasions where I am less patient, feeling unable to deal with problems I see in others, or that exist in the world. I find myself ill equipped to confront and dialogue with people or deal with situations for which I do not see a solution. Perhaps my feelings and inactions are a way of scapegoating, conveniently placing blame on others. To be honest, self-examination and confronting my behaviors is hard! Easier to be like an ostrich, simply hide my head in the sand. I know, however, hiding from fears only exasperates my failures to make realistic changes in my own life, attitudes, and actions.

Perhaps this year instead of trying to change others to fit my beliefs and understandings, I should reopen my life to God's will, striving to make changes in myself which can improve all the relationships and selfish attitudes I cling to. I cannot mold the world into my image. I can begin to recognize God's image in others and in all of creation.

Senior Real Estate Property Tax Relief Program

Participants are required to submit an affidavit every year after the initial application to ensure eligibility is still being met.



The **Clay County Senior Real Estate Property Tax Relief** open application period began **January 1st, 2026**, and will run through **March 31st, 2026**.

This will be the only application opportunity for 2026.

Applications **and renewals** will be taken at the Clay County Administration building as well as the Clay County Annex in Gladstone Monday-Friday 9am-4:30pm.

The application and renewal affidavit will also be available online at claycountymo.gov on the Senior Real Estate Property Tax Relief program page.

Eligibility Requirements

- Applicants must be 62 or be turning 62 years of age during the calendar year of your application.
- Applicants must be a Clay County Resident and must own your home or have a legal vested interest determined by the county.
- Applicants must be responsible for the property tax.
- Applicants can only apply for the program with their primary residence.
- Applicants home must have a fully established tax year to be eligible for the program.
- If you already applied in 2025 and were approved, you will need to fill out a renewal affidavit during the January 1st - March 31st, 2026, program dates.

Documents Required To Prove Eligibility

Proof of County Primary Residency and Age.

Proof of all taxes paid

If applicant is not on the deed, documentation proving legal interest in the property

NOTE the information above applies only to Clay County. Residents of other counties should contact their county courthouse for deadline information.

The Beginning of a New Liturgical Season

These first 11 days of January fall during the liturgical season known as Christmas, which is represented by the liturgical color white (and gold) - the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored).

The remaining days of January are the beginning of liturgical season known as *Tempus per Annum* or Ordinary Time, which is represented by the liturgical color green.

Green is a symbol of hope, as it is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal heart of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection.

The color green is worn during prayer of Offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.


The Hope Gift Card Ministry had an awesome Christmas Selling Season.




