

From the Pastor's Pen

"Blessed are ... they (?) ... you (?) ... we(?)"

Dear Saint James Family,

We usually begin Mass invoking a blessing, *"The Lord be with you,"* and conclude the session with *"May almighty God bless you, ..."* These rituals may have become so routine and redundant that we might nonchalantly perform without any conscious intention of receiving.

The Prophet Zephaniah, one of the twelve minor prophets, revealed to a people - who after years of being led astray by unfaithful leaders - the blessedness of having been sheltered and spared from the Lord's anger through their practicing justice and humility. In the eyes of their fellow citizens the Christians in Corinth were regarded as foolish because they lived their daily life banking on the teaching of Jesus through the preaching of Saint Paul, (i.e., the virgin birth and the resurrection of the dead - notions that still are foolish, incredulous and unscientific in our present time). Saint Paul admitted that this teaching made believers appear foolish, weak and inferior in the eye of non-believer's world. However, it is by persevering faith in this teaching that the believer is truly wise and blessed.

Jesus in today's gospel announces the ways in which his believers are blessed, **The Beatitudes**.

"Blessed are WE: "the poor in spirit, the defender of the helpless, the mourner, the meek, the thirsty and hungry for righteousness, the merciful, the clean of heart, the peacemaker, the persecuted, insulted and slandered because of our conscious choice for Christ" who daily walk the walk of faith. The disciples gathered around Jesus to hear of Jesus' proclamation about their blessedness. That we who gather to worship at Mass may hear through our very own ears and see with our very own eyes that God greets our gathering with God's blessing and that as we take leave from the Mass we carry within ourselves the blessedness that God wants to dispense to all those whom we encounter.

"The Lord be with you!" ... "May almighty God bless you," ... "Go forth with the peace of Christ!"

Meditating Moments



Perhaps in your day to day life you don't give too much thought to the sun, except perhaps when trying to observe a solar eclipse. Neither do I, yet without this star/sun at the center of our solar

system, life as we know it on planet earth would not exist. Our seasons depend on the tilt of the earth as it orbits the sun, as do the hours of daylight vs the darkness of night. Plants use specific wavelengths of light from the sun to photosynthesize and grow. Animals, in turn, directly or indirectly, depend on plants for their existence. Even on the coldest days of winter, the sun provides warmth; on the cloudiest days it still provides light and energy. Illumination of the moon at night is a result of reflecting the sun's rays, but do you realize that while looking towards the sun you cannot simultaneously see shadows. You may see shading, even patches of darkness, but not shadows!

Now allow me to guide you through a brief reflection on the **SON**, Jesus. I believe that if I continually look to the Son, I also will not see shadows. I read in sacred scripture that Jesus is "Light for the World," obviously not physical light as our celestial sun, but spiritual light to guide me away from the dark shadows of doubt, hopelessness, despair, and sin. Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life in which I am called to immerse myself; He is the center of my life. Jesus is the light I recognize whenever I recite the Nicene Creed, renew my baptismal promises, or receive a sacrament. Jesus is my light and teacher when I pray; my hope which drives me to begin each day with gratitude. Jesus is the light that warms my soul and picks me up when I feel broken. Jesus is the light that guides me through pain, sadness, and grief. Jesus is the light that illuminates even the darkest night. The magi followed His star so they might see His face and worship the Messiah. I too desire to follow His star that I might worship with a pure heart, unencumbered by prejudices directed at my fellow human beings. I want to follow His star that I might be released from judge-mentalism. I want to embrace His star so I might learn to love and serve as He taught. I want to follow His star so that I become more forgiving. I want to live in the light of His love and grace, so as to become a faithful disciple. I cannot truly live in His Light until I surrender myself to Him; believe the words, "not my will but yours!"




Lenten Bible Study ~ Begins February 19 ~ Register Now
