



## From the Pastor's Pen

*"It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind."* (John 9:32)

*"Who is he, sir, that I might believe in him?"* (John 9:36)

I learned that a person born deaf would be mute, but one born mute could still hear. I was born with the five basic human senses: touch, sight, hearing, smell and taste – normal and healthy at birth. Of these five faculties, seeing clearly and hearing accurately seem to diminish noticeably as I age. Doctors told me that such conditions are common. However, it is quite frustrating when I was not blind but could not see; not deaf but could not hear.

Utterly frustrating is the inability to see in fine prints what needs to be seen. It is also unbearably frustrating while trying to concentrate on listening to what needs to be heard but still not able to hear fully and accurately the message being transmitted.

Jesus shines light into human born blind eyes to see as God sees – through the heart of truthfulness which give the courage to stand up for truth. By the light of Jesus the man born blind saw through the inside of the religious authorities of Jerusalem and heard the ulterior motive of their questioning. He was emboldened to rebuff them and would rather be thrown out of their synagogue than bow to their pressure.

As we enter the fourth week of Lent we may want to seek to see more clearly our present state of the world and to hear more accurately what God is saying about our current living. May our Lenten disciplines of praying, fasting and doing good deeds strengthen our faith and embolden our courage to keep marching forward. While still wading in the mid of confusion and apprehension about events happening in our world these days, even at times being blinded by deceptive rhetorics of politics, may we confidently trod under the Light of Christ.

*"You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth."* (Ephesians 5:8-9)

### Meditating Moments



Today's scripture readings focus on sight, not only what we physically see with our eyes but how we perceive

and understand what is taken in by our senses. In the first reading Samuel is sent to anoint one of Jesse's sons who will become king. Of course Jesse assumes the anointed one should be his eldest son, with no understanding that God has chosen the youngest son, David. The Psalm is familiar to most of us, describing how God, the loving shepherd will care for God's people. The reading from Ephesians demands that believers live in the light of Christ, vigilant in resisting the darkness of temptation and sin. Finally the Gospel (John 9:1-41) describes Jesus healing the man born blind. Jesus confirms this blindness is not a result of either the man's or his parents' sins, but rather a way for God to use his blindness and healing to reveal the glory and love of our heavenly Father. Sadly, the Pharisees refuse to see beyond their preconceived ideas, prejudices, and bigotry, to embrace Jesus's teachings. Instead they choose to cling to their stubborn ideas of this man's sinfulness, casting him away from their prideful, inner-circle of faithful Jews.

Every year when I hear these readings I feel shame at my inner blindness. I possess my physical sight, while remaining inwardly blind to the part I play in the suffering and pain of others. I abdicate any responsibility of participation in the suffering, so visible in our world today. Oh I complain, even attempt to stand in solidarity by giving money to the poor, but I hesitate to admit that I also support a culture and social systems that oppress and ostracize those perceived as not part of my lifestyle. I fail to see that "the others" are beloved children of God; they are not objects to be used by unjust systems. I previously wrote of the tradition of giving something up for Lent, and perhaps you were offended by my words. This was never my intention, rather a confession related to my complicated journey toward a loving relationship with Christ Jesus. As I continue to discern my spirituality and faith, I realize there are so many ways whereby I fail to stand in solidarity with my brothers and sisters; those struggling to survive and provide themselves and their families with the basic necessities of life (food, shelter, health care, education, jobs with livable wages, protection from prejudice and bigotry, and the ability to love and worship freely); those who live in constant fear. We may have differences, but I believe we share in a commonality which unites all God's children. My ego and preconceived ideas, my understandings blind me to this reality. I pray: "God remove my inner blindness. Guide my mind, heart, words, and deeds in responding to the cry of the poor, your beloved family. Help me see as you see."

It never fails. On the fourth Sunday of Lent someone always asks “why are the vestments pink, not purple today?”

The answer is that the Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as “Laetare Sunday.” The day’s theme comes from the entrance antiphon reflecting on Isaiah 66:10-11: “Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast.”

Laetare is the first word – meaning “rejoice” – in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent’s Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Call it pink – or, more fittingly, rose – this change in color indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

Laetare Sunday is the Church’s way of giving us a “shot in the arm” as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It’s an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday – the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and that our hearts will always be filled with joy!

Being aware of traditions and customs assists us in celebrating the beauty of our faith. As you can see, there is much associated with even a nondescript day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent – not to mention the rest of the season, or the 50 days of Easter and beyond. Take advantage of the richness of our Catholic traditions.



## St. Joseph Feast Day



**March 19**

The feast of St. Joseph is celebrated annually on March 19th in honor of St. Joseph, the husband of Mary and stepfather of Jesus. This holiday takes place during Lent, a time of fasting, and the holiday is traditionally a meatless feast.

According to legend, during a famine in Sicily, when food was scarce and many people were starving the poor people had only their faith to rely on. St. Joseph was known as the protector of the Holy Family; thus, Italians prayed for St. Joseph to intercede for them, in an effort to ensure successful crops. Their prayers were answered, and the famine came to an end. In gratitude, people promised to make annual offerings of their most precious possession – food – in St. Joseph's honor. Thus, in many places, a St. Joseph Table filled with food is the centerpiece for celebrating this day.

St. Joseph is the patron of the universal church in Roman Catholicism, and his life is recorded in the Gospels, particularly Matthew and Luke. His important mission in God's plan of salvation was "to legally insert Jesus Christ into the line of David from whom, according to the prophets, the Messiah would be born, and to act as his father and guardian." Joseph is last mentioned in the Gospels when he and Mary frantically searched for the lost young Jesus in Jerusalem, where they found him in the Temple. The circumstances of Joseph's death are unknown, except that he probably died before Jesus' public ministry began and was certainly dead before the Crucifixion.



## St. Patrick Feast Day - March 17

There are many legends and stories about St. Patrick. Perhaps the most well known is the legend that he drove all of the snakes out of Ireland. However, all evidence suggests that post-glacial Ireland never had snakes.

In his early teens he was captured by Irish raiders in his birth-country of Scotland and taken to Ireland as a slave to tend sheep. During his captivity, he turned to God in prayer. Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There he found sailors who took him back to Britain. He had another dream in which the people of Ireland were calling out to him "We beg you, holy youth, to come and walk among us once more."

He studied for the priesthood and was ordained. Later, he was ordained a bishop, and returned back to Ireland to establish the church. Though the task was difficult and dangerous, he persisted and was able to build a strong foundation for Christianity. The Irish people were very receptive to his teachings especially since that he was able to take several of their Celtic symbols and Christianize them. The most prominent of these is the green shamrock. He used this plant, which was held sacred by the Druids, as a symbol of the Trinity.

Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years, working many miracles and writing of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461. Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, who had total devotion to and trust in God. He feared nothing, not even death, so complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission.

Our last First Communion retreat is Saturday, March 21st from 10-2 in the Social Hall.


If you were unable to make the date in February, please be sure to attend.
