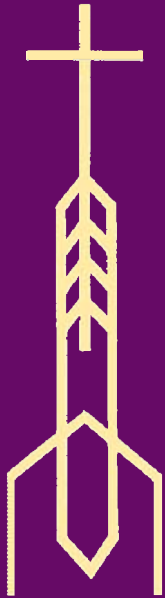

From the Pastor's Pen

One of the big items in the news in recent times has been the actions of the Immigrant and Customs Enforcement (ICE). It was formed as a subsidiary of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 in response to terrorist threats. This agency has the power to stop, detain, and arrest people suspected to being in the United State illegally. All of us are familiar with incidents of questionable behavior and arrests. Under the United States Constitution, law enforcement can only use deadly force if a person has committed a violent crime. The actions of ICE agents has caused a great deal of controversy.

This past fall, the Catholic bishops of the United States met in Baltimore. They issued a special message addressing their concern for the evolving situation impacting immigrants in our country. They speak as pastors, disturbed by a climate of fear and anxiety regarding profiling and enforcement, about conditions of detention centers and the lack of access to pastoral care, about immigrants arbitrarily losing their status, about threats against the sanctity of houses of worship. The bishops remind us of the teaching of our faith, that every person deserved to be treated with dignity, for we are all created in the image and likeness of God. We oppose the mass deportation of people.

I urge you to read this document of our bishops, readily available on the Internet. Those who are hunted and arrested are our brothers and sisters in the Lord. Yes, there needs to be immigration reform. Yes, those who endanger our country, its laws and values, need to be deported. But the majority of immigrants are not lawbreakers and contribute to the well-being of our country. ICE has a duty to be acknowledged, but their actions must be governed by the Constitution and the recognition of brotherhood.

My prayers are with you each day.

Meditating Moments



Like many of you I have experienced loss of people I love, and have dealt with many, different stages of grieving. Although the pain of my grief seems to dim over time, I wonder if it will ever go completely away. At times, I still feel great sorrow and loss.

Today's gospel (John 11:1-45) provides a look into the grief of Mary and Martha over the death of their brother Lazarus, as well as a glimpse of Jesus' grief. Mary remains in her home with other mourners, while Martha meets Jesus with simple words from her heart: "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus replies: "Your brother will rise. . . I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live. . . do you believe this?" Without hesitation, Martha answers: "Yes, Lord." Jesus' words and Martha's response are central to my faith. I profess belief in the resurrection, hoping I too will be united with God in eternal life. Although I believe Jesus' words, many times I sink into deep pain and the sorrow of my grief. I feel alone and hopeless. Though I desire to feel whole and trust His words, my heart still feels broken. I feel incapable of moving forward.

The shortest passage in scripture expressing grief is found in today's gospel: "Jesus wept." Jesus did not simply address Lazarus' family with teaching words, nor did he perform yet another miracle calling Lazarus forth from the tomb. Jesus felt great sorrow; Jesus felt grief; He wept over the tomb of Lazarus His friend. Perhaps He was also weeping over the failure of His followers to believe and embrace His teachings on love, forgiveness, and mercy. Perhaps He wept knowing the gut wrenching terror He would soon be called to endure. Perhaps He wept knowing His closest friends would betray and deny Him. Perhaps He is weeping for you and I, for all God's creation.

Does Jesus weep for me and my failure to believe; my failure to trust, to be lead by Him and to be healed of even my greatest sorrow and pain? Does Jesus weep because I fail to put His words into action, because I fail to recognize and minister to the poor, to speak and fight against social injustices and laws that objectify and imprison my brothers and sisters? Is Jesus weeping because this world is so wounded by wars and the suffering of innocents? Is Jesus weeping at our failures to shelter and protect and minister to immigrants, children, the homeless and the elderly who find themselves alone and forgotten? These questions I ask myself as I am confronted with the expanse of Jesus' pain, grief, and sorrow as "Jesus weeps!"

The Devotion of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Recitation of the Seven Sorrows Rosary
Friday, March 27 ~ 4:30pm in the Church



Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great signal graces. The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary

1. The prophecy of Simeon
2. The flight into Egypt
3. The loss of the Child Jesus in the temple
4. Mary meets Jesus on the way to Calvary
5. Mary stands at the foot of the cross
6. Mary receives the dead body of Jesus
7. Jesus is placed in the tomb

Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can.

Our Lady's Sorrows are commemorated on the liturgical calendar twice a year - the Friday before Palm Sunday and September 15.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Palm Sunday



Next weekend, churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that

day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a *lulav*, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the *lulav*, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the *Hoshanot*, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, we use palm branches to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion?

SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION OF OUR LORD ~ MARCH 25



The Annunciation (from Latin annuntiatio), also referred to as the Annunciation to the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Annunciation of Our Lady, or the Annunciation of the Lord, is the Christian celebration of the announcement by the Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary that she would conceive and become the mother of Jesus, the Jewish messiah and Son of God, marking His Incarnation. Gabriel told Mary to name

her son Jesus, meaning "YHWH is salvation".

According to Luke 1:26, the Annunciation occurred "in the sixth month" of Elizabeth's pregnancy with John the Baptist.

This event is served with the Feast of the Annunciation on March 25, an approximation of the northern vernal equinox nine full months before Christmas, the ceremonial birthday of Jesus.

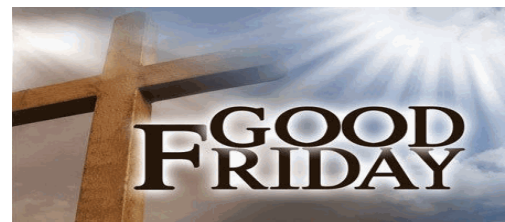
