PREPARING FOR DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



In preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday, the Lord asked St. Faustina to make a Novena of Prayer from Good Friday to the following Saturday.

These nine days of prayer before Divine Mercy Sunday are like the nine days of prayer in the Upper Room before the day of Pentecost. For each of the nine days our Lord gave St. Faustina a different intention.

Each of us can make a Novena of Prayer for these intentions and others by praying the novena on pages 7 and 8 of this bulletin.

If you are on the St. James email list you will receive the Novena intentions and prayers for each day beginning on Good Friday.

A Special Promise of Mercy

Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the *Diary of St. Faustina*.

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (*Diary* 1109).

Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 300).

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 699).

It's allowed for one to go to confession up to 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday.

From the Pastor's Pen

"He emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance,"
(Philippians 2: 7)

Dear St. James Parish Family,

Fifty years ago at the 1976 Olympics in Montreal gymnast Nadia Elena Comaneci delighted spectators with the perfect score of 10. She was not the first athlete that achieved the perfect score in the games, but she was the first to bring to world attention and realization the very real human possibility of reaching perfection. Ever since then some others of such successfully accomplished feat have been widely broadcast throughout the world. It was an event that triggered many more events of the kind in the coming times.

A couple thousand of years ago there was one perfect sacrifice, already offered up, broadcast in real time every day throughout the world and solemnly commemorated every year ever since. It is the sacrifice of Jesus the Nazorean - the Master, the Rabbi, the Son of Man, the Son of God, the Christ, the Savior of the World. This sacrifice is still offered up this Sunday.

This Sunday is commonly known to us as "Palm Sunday," which signals the last week of the season of Lent, the beginning of the Holy Week which includes the "Triduum"- the three days commemorating the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. From its context and content this day is liturgically named the "Passion Sunday," the suffering and death event that Jesus underwent to complete the mission which he came to earth to do: to sacrifice of himself to save the world.

This sacrificing act is the most perfect sacrifice because it was done by one person once for all, not to be repeated by others but to be shared in by others. As the perpetual one time only and world changing event, it forever triggers the hollowing of the grave of human dead leading to the opening of the gate of heaven for the risen to the everlasting life.

Jesus is the one and the only with the perfect sacrifice. For those who desire to be a part of him, Jesus initiated the act that requires 20/20 vision focusing on *"This is my body, which will be given for you,"* (Continued in the right column)

Meditating Moments



Once again I enter Holy Week with mixed emotions, trepidation and confusion. With you, I receive palms, sing Hosannas, give glory and praise to Jesus. I listen

to the scripture proclaiming His entry into Jerusalem. [As Jesus entered the city, people were waving palm branches, laying their cloaks on the road, and crying out: "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest."] "What were they thinking?" Perhaps Jesus was the one who would overthrow the Roman occupation and reestablish the Davidic throne, reuniting the remnants of the Northern and Southern kingdoms. Were the people ready to sacrifice themselves for the common good?

In our liturgy today, I am confronted with a different reality listening to the crowd answer Pilate's question, "Which of the two do you want me to release to you?" The people scream: "Barabbas!" "What then shall I do with Jesus called Messiah?" "Let him be crucified!" Without hesitation the voices of many who sang Hosannas, now turn into angry voices crying: "Crucify him!" Pondering these words, I am certain there were also frightened confused individuals, especially among Jesus' closest followers, who stood silent wondering, "Why is this happening? — Surely Jesus will save Himself!" NO, Jesus offers Himself, a sacrifice for all, even those who reject Him.

Every year I feel inner turmoil with today's liturgy. Why do I celebrate Jesus, only to reject Him? Am I among those standing in fear and confusion? Am I apathetic to what I witness around me? Do I hesitate to stand in solidarity with Jesus and those He has called me to serve? Do I joyously proclaim my love for Him, while hiding in the shadows, afraid of making waves or being rejected? Unlike the people living in Jesus's time, I know the darkness of His crucifixion is illuminated by His resurrection and promise to be with me always. I must ask myself, therefore, why do I hesitate to proclaim His good news; to stand in solidarity with the poor, forgotten, and disenfranchised? Why am I content to remain within my comfortable cocoon, safe and removed from suffering I do not understand or for which I feel helpless to change? Even writing these words I feel conflict and shame because I so often fail to orient my life toward Jesus; to trust in His love and forgiveness; to let go; to move from my comfort zone into service of His children. I pray for His guidance during this time I am graced to live.

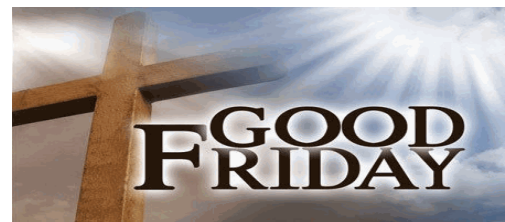

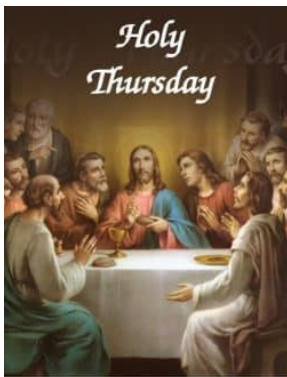

Liturgy of the Word

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Triduum – from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord.

The Holy Thursday and Good Friday services will be live-streamed on Facebook and YouTube.

The Triduum: One Mass ~ Three Days

The Triduum is the holiest time in our Liturgical Calendar. It is the most important part of Salvation History as Christ, in those three days, fulfilled the promise of God when He said He would send a Savior who would reconcile humanity to Himself.

There is but one Mass celebrated over 3 days during the Triduum beginning with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and ending at the close of the Easter Vigil on Saturday

Our Liturgy reflects our solemn, adoring and anguished spirit. *The Mass of the Lord's Supper* on **Holy Thursday** does not "end." There is no "Go forth" or "Thanks be to God." There is only the procession of Christ to His place of repose and the silent, prayerful adoration of the faithful that stay watch with Him as He endures His Passion (akin to the Apostles as Christ led them to the Garden of Gethsemane to keep watch as He began His Agony in the Garden).

On **Good Friday**, there is "no Mass." This is because technically, the Mass from Holy Thursday has not ended.

Finally, on Saturday, we arrive at our **Easter Vigil**. This special vigil is held after sundown. This is significant because this darkness is indicative of the spiritual darkness we are experiencing as we await the Light of the World.

This vigil does not start with the typical "opening Mass prayers" we're used to. Instead, the priest blesses a special fire which is typically made of Holy Oils from the previous year, salt, and twigs. This special fire is the first light we see and is symbolic of the Resurrection. This light is what's used to light our brand new Paschal Candle (the Christ Candle), and after the Candle is lit, the light begins to spread throughout the Church, from member to member, as a flame is passed between individual candles all are given at the opening of Mass.

As this Vigil Mass commences, we finally are able to hear again the priest's command to "Go Forth" and respond with a jubilant "Thanks be to God!" We acknowledge that the sacred Triduum that marks Christ's Sacrifice has reached its fulfillment, and we take our charge to "Go Forth" with zeal. We are charged to take the message of Salvation to all people who still "live in darkness."

So, now you see why there is but one Mass celebrated over these three days.

As these three days recall the three long days of Christ's consummation by the Fire of His Love, it is our opportunity to offer these three days in solidarity with Him.

THE NOVENA TO THE DIVINE MERCY

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on Good Friday. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena. In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her: "On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy. On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

FIRST DAY - GOOD FRIDAY - APRIL 3

Today bring to Me all mankind, especially all sinners, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose very nature it is to have compassion on us and to forgive us, do not look upon our sins but upon our trust which we place in Your infinite goodness. Receive us all into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart, and never let us escape from It. We beg this of You by Your love which unites You to the Father and the Holy Spirit.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon all mankind and especially upon poor sinners, all enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion show us Your mercy, that we may praise the omnipotence of Your mercy for ever and ever. Amen.

SECOND DAY - HOLY SATURDAY - APRIL 4

Today bring to Me the souls of priests and religious, and immerse them in My unfathomable mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from whom comes all that is good, increase Your grace in men and women consecrated to Your service, that they may perform worthy works of mercy; and that all who see them may glorify the Father of Mercy who is in heaven.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the company of chosen ones in Your vineyard upon the souls of priests and religious; and endow them with the strength of Your blessing. For the love of the Heart of Your Son in which they are enfolded, impart to them Your power and light, that they may be able to guide others in the way of salvation and with one voice sing praise to Your boundless mercy for ages without end. Amen.

THIRD DAY - EASTER SUNDAY - APRIL 5

Today bring to Me all devout and faithful souls, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from the treasury of Your mercy, You impart Your graces in great abundance to each and all. Receive us into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart and never let us escape from It. We beg this grace of You by that most wondrous love for the heavenly Father with which Your Heart burns so fiercely.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon faithful souls, as upon the inheritance of Your Son. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, grant them Your blessing and surround them with Your constant protection.

Thus may they never fail in love or lose the treasure of the holy faith, but rather, with all the hosts of Angels and Saints, may they glorify Your boundless mercy for endless ages. Amen.

FOURTH DAY - MONDAY - APRIL 6

Today bring to Me those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Me.

Most compassionate Jesus, You are the Light of the whole world. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who do not believe in God and of those who as yet do not know You. Let the rays of Your grace enlighten them that they, too, together with us, may extol Your wonderful mercy; and do not let them escape from the abode which is Your Most Compassionate Heart.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who do not believe in You, and of those who as yet do not know You, but who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Draw them to the light of the Gospel. These souls do not know what great happiness it is to love You. Grant that they, too, may extol the generosity of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

FIFTH DAY - TUESDAY - APRIL 7

Today bring to Me the souls of those who have separated themselves from the Church.

Most Merciful Jesus, Goodness Itself, You do not refuse light to those who seek it of You. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Church. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart; but bring it about that they, too, come to glorify the generosity of Your mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Son's Church, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces by obstinately persisting in their errors. Do not look upon their errors, but upon the love of Your own Son and upon His bitter Passion, which He underwent for their sake, since they, too, are enclosed in His Most Compassionate Heart. Bring it about that they also may glorify Your great mercy for endless ages. Amen.

SIXTH DAY - WEDNESDAY - APRIL 8

Today bring to Me the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children, and immerse them in my mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You yourself have said, "Learn from Me for I am meek and humble of heart." Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart all meek and humble souls and the souls of little children. These souls send all heaven into ecstasy and they are the heavenly Father's favorites. They are a sweet-smelling bouquet before the throne of God; God Himself takes delight in their fragrance. These souls have a permanent abode in Your Most Compassionate Heart, O Jesus, and they unceasingly sing out a hymn of love and mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon meek souls, upon humble souls, and upon little children who are enfolded in the abode which is the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls bear the closest resemblance to Your Son. Their fragrance rises from the earth and reaches Your very throne. Father of mercy and of all goodness, I beg You by the love You bear these souls and by the delight You take in them: Bless the whole world, that all souls together may sing out the praises of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

SEVENTH DAY - THURSDAY - APRIL 9

Today bring to Me the Souls who especially venerate and glorify My Mercy and immerse them in My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose Heart is Love Itself, receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who particularly extol and venerate the greatness of Your mercy. These souls are mighty with the very power of God Himself. In the midst of all afflictions and adversities they go forward, confident of Your mercy; and united to You, O Jesus, they carry all mankind on their shoulders. These souls will not be judged severely, but Your mercy will embrace them as they depart from this life.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls who glorify and venerate Your greatest attribute, that of Your fathomless mercy, and who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls are a living Gospel; their hands are full of deeds of mercy, and their hearts, overflowing with joy, sing a canticle of mercy to You, O Most High! I beg You O God: Show them Your mercy according to the hope and trust they have placed in You. Let there be accomplished in them the promise of Jesus, who said to them that during their life, but especially at the hour of death, the souls who will venerate this fathomless mercy of His, He, Himself, will defend as His glory. Amen.

EIGHTH DAY - FRIDAY - APRIL 10

Today bring to Me the souls who are in the prison of purgatory, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You Yourself have said that You desire mercy; so I bring into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls in Purgatory, souls who are very dear to You, and yet, who must make retribution to Your justice. May the streams of Blood and Water which gushed forth from Your Heart put out the flames of Purgatory, that there, too, the power of Your mercy may be celebrated.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls suffering in Purgatory, who are enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. I beg You, by the sorrowful Passion of Jesus Your Son, and by all the bitterness with which His most sacred Soul was flooded: Manifest Your mercy to the souls who are under Your just scrutiny. Look upon them in no other way but only through the Wounds of Jesus, Your dearly beloved Son; for we firmly believe that there is no limit to Your goodness and compassion. Amen.

NINTH DAY - SATURDAY - APRIL 11

Today bring to Me the souls who have become lukewarm, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy

Most compassionate Jesus, You are Compassion Itself. I bring lukewarm souls into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart. In this fire of Your pure love, let these tepid souls who, like corpses, filled You with such deep loathing, be once again set aflame. O Most Compassionate Jesus, exercise the omnipotence of Your mercy and draw them into the very ardor of Your love, and bestow upon them the gift of holy love, for nothing is beyond Your power.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon lukewarm souls who are nonetheless enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Father of Mercy, I beg You by the bitter Passion of Your Son and by His three-hour agony on the Cross: Let them, too, glorify the abyss of Your mercy. Amen.

HOW TO PRAY THE CHAPLET OF THE DIVINE MERCY

Our Father .. Hail Mary ...The Apostles' Creed

On the large bead after each decade:
