We are All Called to Protect God's Children and Youth

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

As we celebrate Easter and the beginning of Spring, it's a good time to re-energize our efforts against child sexual abuse and recommit ourselves to strengthening the safety net of protection for children.

Please join the efforts of the Diocese's Office of Child and Youth Protection by increasing awareness about child sexual abuse and by offering care for those who suffer. In our parish, employees and volunteers, have received training that makes them aware of the presence of sexual abuse, challenges in identifying, reporting and helping victims, and ways to protect our children and youth from ever experiencing such trauma.

Meditating Moments

After 30 years of preparing adults to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, although this year I am neither a catechist, sponsor, or leader, the Easter Vigil is still a time of great joy for me, witnessing reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and first Eucharist by our Elect. Reflecting on the Vigil liturgy, filled with significant symbolism, I am reminded of the change that takes place sacramentally at baptism, which is rather dramatically represented by the different garments worn by the Elect.

As each person enters the baptismal waters, he/she wears a dark garment (representing human sinfulness).



We believe that as the waters of baptism flood over the individual he/she is sacramentally cleansed of their past sins. Returning to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and first Eucharist, the Neophyte wears a white garment, signifying their new

life in Christ. (Traditionally, this white garment is an Alb which is the baptismal garment of all Christians, ordained and laity. The Alb represents purity and unity with Christ's body, the Church.) Although this symbolism is powerful, I ask myself how this outer garment reflects the life I live in the present? Do I live my baptismal promises? Is it hypocritical for me to wear an Alb? I must conclude that wearing an Alb as my outer garment to reflect my baptism and life in Christ is meaningless if my inner garment, my real identity and capacity to act with a loving heart, remains soiled and covered with my sinfulness, pride, ego, and need to live comfortably while forgetting the central message of the gospel; Loving God is witnessed in loving and serving others especially the poor.



In Matthew 25 I am reminded to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit the prisoner, the lost and forgotten. To live my baptismal promises I must put the needs and welfare of others before embellishing my life with luxuries, excesses of any kind. God does not ask me to give up what I need to live, but God does require me not to hoard my time, talents, and wealth. The gifts with which God continues to grace my life are meant to be shared with others. There are times when I feel overwhelmed realizing the pain so many experience, the struggles to survive, to be seen, and to be loved. I realize I cannot reach everyone, but I do know if I am to wear my metaphorical Alb on the outside, I must continually clean the garment I wear within. I must trust God to lead me into ministry through which I love and serve my brothers and sisters.

A Special Promise of Mercy

Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the *Diary of St. Faustina*:

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (*Diary* 1109).

Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 300).

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 699).

It's allowed for one to go to confession up to 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday

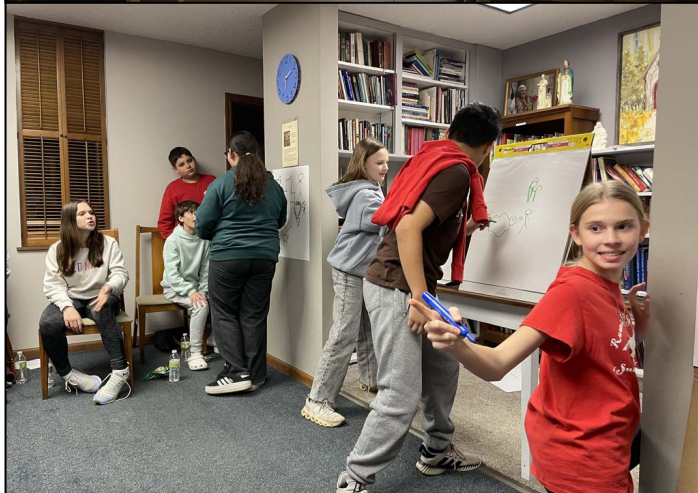
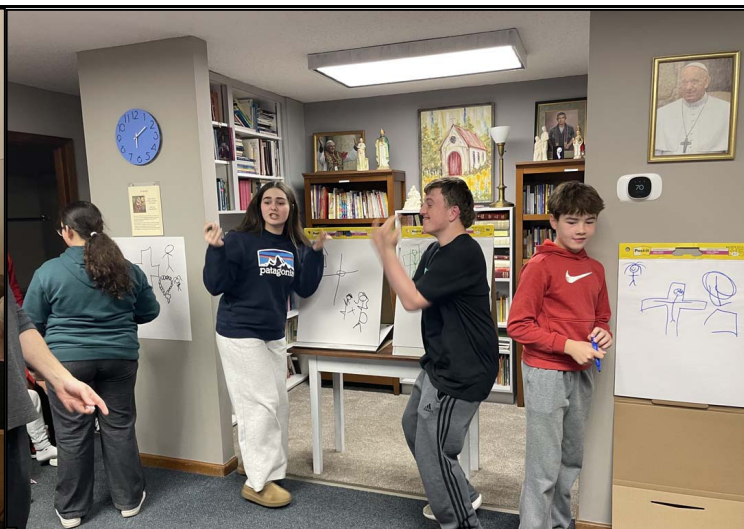
On Friday, March 13th we had the opportunity to spend extended time with the teens of our parish. As I write this, I am still smiling from the fun and experiences we had together.
