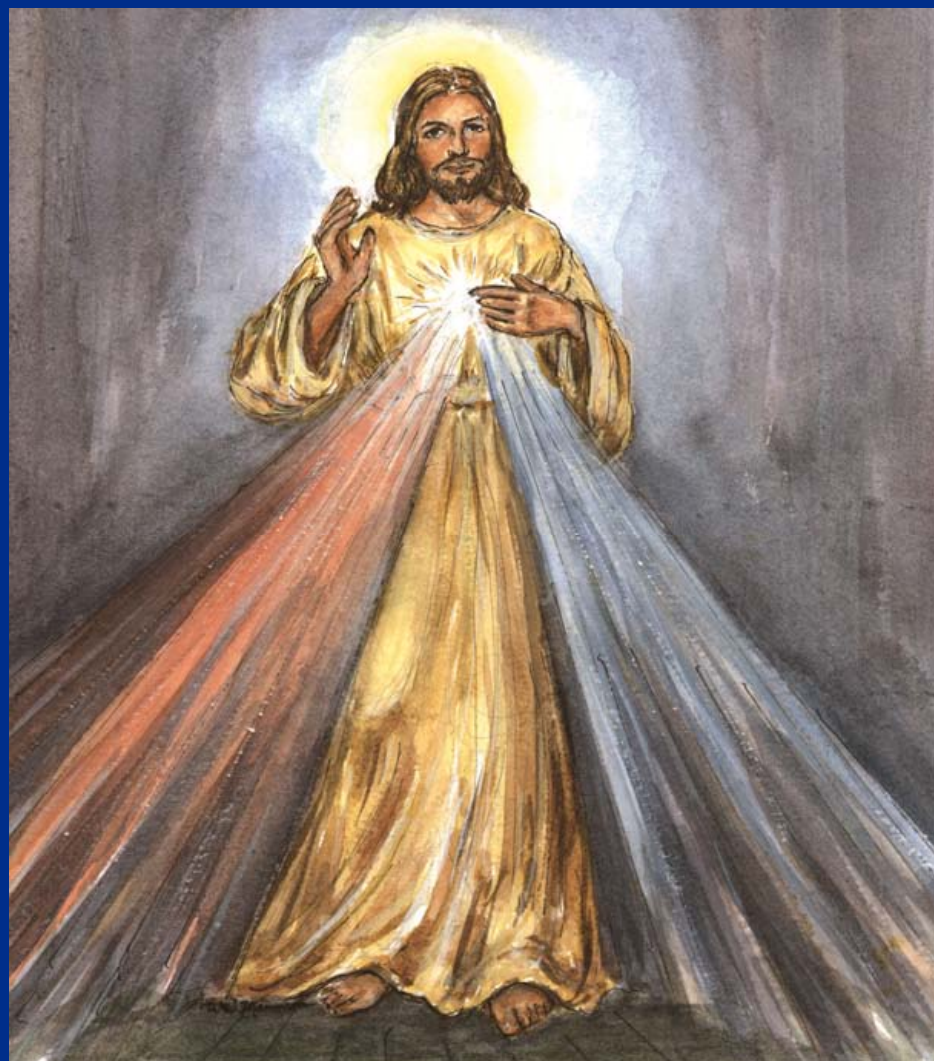

3. If the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph, report the suspected abuse to the Diocesan Ombudsman, at 816.213.6024 or ombudsman@diocesekcsj.org.

From the Pastor's Pen

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead," (1 Peter 1:3)

Dear Saint James Parish Family,

Scriptures proclaimed today give us a glimpse into the believers' noticeable activities following Jesus' resurrection. Adhering to the teachings of the Apostles they gathered to pray in the temple area, began a system of helping the needy, and celebrated the Eucharistic liturgy in their homes. We continue these practices here at Saint James, but in ways that became modified through history in response to needs of the time and local circumstances. The Eucharist liturgy is celebrated in church but we participate from our own homes via livestreams. Times and circumstances change; certain activities and behaviors we are accustomed to also change! The Apostolic Tradition of celebrating the resurrection of Jesus, however, continues.

This second Sunday of Easter, also known as Sunday of Divine Mercy, was established on 30 April of 2000 by Pope John Paul II. God's mercy as manifested in the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ has already been granted to us through our having been baptized in Christ. The Spirit of the resurrected Christ breathed on the Apostles then also breathes on us now as we adhere to the teachings of the Apostles. Our issue at hand today is how confident and trustful are we in God's Mercy. We are tested by the quick and stealthy spreading of incurable diseases – some of which are still in lack of proven remedies, of fear of significant economic downfalls, and of unverifiable but fast spreading rumors, albeit true or untrue. A vast majority of us are still dealing with a pervasive but perduring disease: the infectious "Thomas-itis".

The only known effective remedy, proven throughout the ages, is the Spirit whom Jesus breathed on the Apostles, the Spirit imparted upon and confirmed in the baptized. *"Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."* (John 20:22-23) As we implore God's Mercy, may we find ourselves actively living in this Apostolic Tradition; and may this Spirit live in us, work through and with us so that we may see and truly acknowledge the presence of the resurrected Christ in our present day world.

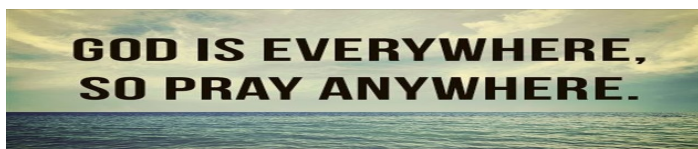

Meditating Moments



For me, Lent and Holy week always evoke powerful feelings and emotional responses. This year has been no different. During Lent I participated in a group study at the

Precious Blood Renewal Center of Pope Leo XIV's Apostolic Letter, "*Dilexi te*" [I Have Love You] and presented a retreat at St. James Parish working through Fr. Mike Schmitz's book *A World Undone — Finding God When Life Doesn't Make Sense*. Although these two experiences may seem unrelated given the titles, in fact they were quite complementary. In both cases I found myself not only seeking God's forgiveness for times when I failed to share the love of Christ, but also asking for guidance in my faith journey: "Where do I go from here? How am I being called to serve? What burdens and fears are holding me stagnant with my false sense of security and rightness in the way I live and in my egotistical thoughts?"

On Holy Thursday I heard Jesus' words to His disciples: "Do as I do." I know it is not enough to profess my faith. Jesus calls me to act, to serve my brothers and sisters. I found myself wondering, "How can I be God's servant, ministering to those in need?" On Good Friday I joined fellow worshipers singing "Where you there?" I think a better question for me is "Am I there? Am I part of the crowd, in the present moment, crying for Jesus to be crucified?" I believe that He is always present with me, even at times when I am alone and struggling. The issue that brings great sorrow is not so much events of 2000 years ago, rather what group or groups am I associated with that continue to crucify Jesus? Believing that Jesus is present in me, I must also accept the fact that He is present in the lost, forgotten, disenfranchised, objectified, or anyone facing unfathomable living conditions. Believing thusly, why do I continue to assume there are "those people" rather than recognizing my brothers and sisters as neighbors, loved by God? Have I lost the ability to feel empathy and compassion without attaching conditions; to fight for justice and equality for the economically poor, the immigrant, the prisoner, those with disabilities, anyone needing physical care or struggling with mental illness, children who feel misunderstood, elderly who feel abandoned, or one of God's children who endures or survived abuse? At the Easter Vigil I celebrated resurrection and new birth. Yet I continue, even as I write these words, to struggle with the meaning of resurrection and new birth in my life. Although, I do not feel lost or hopeless because I know God will lead me into a new way of living and serving. I also feel, however, that I must begin by surrendering my mind and heart to the teachings of Jesus Christ and the challenges of leaders such as Pope Leo XIV
