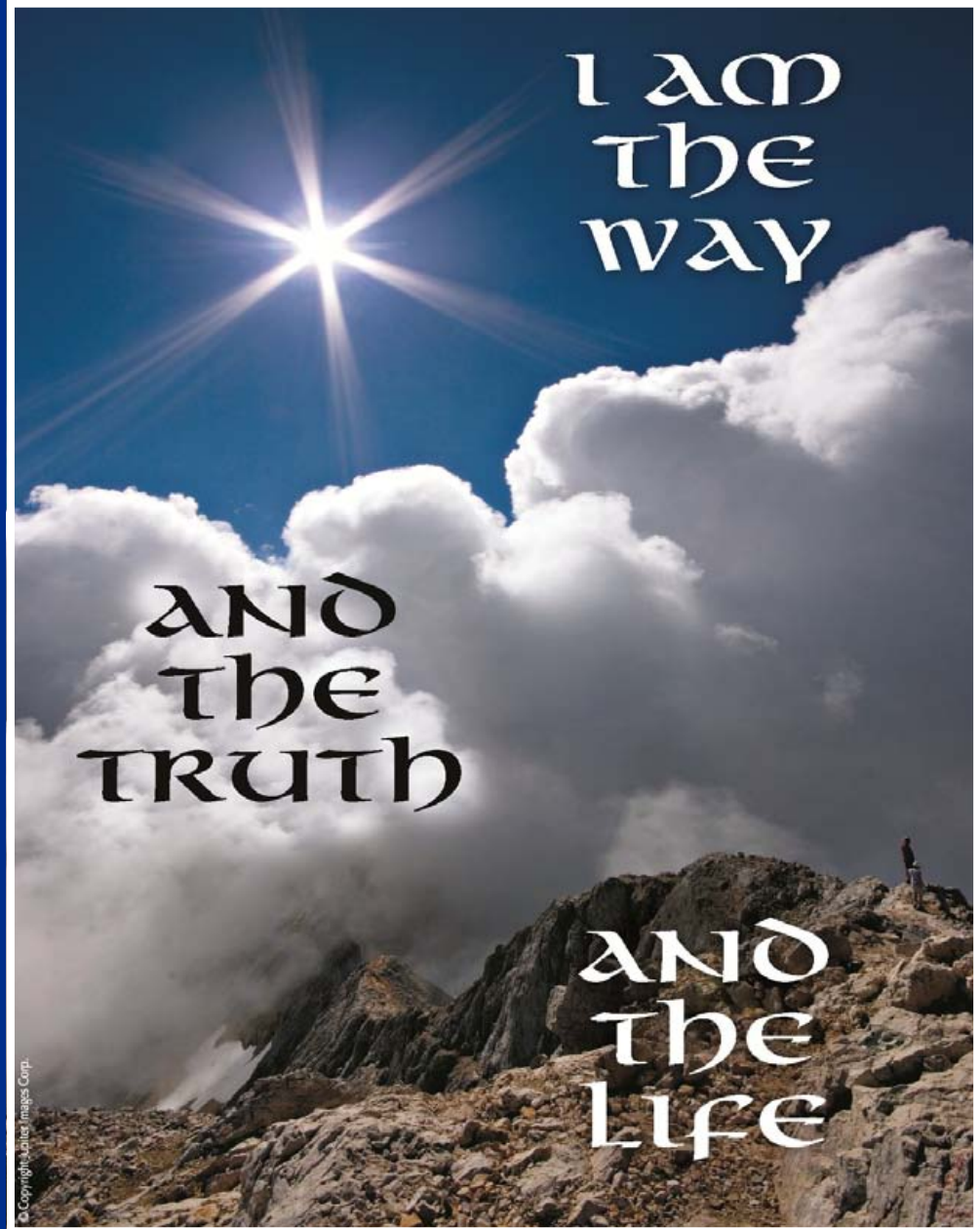

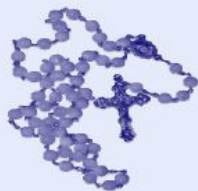

Meditating Moments



Recently while watching one of the programs I enjoy on the BBC, I heard this quote: "Wanting what everyone else wants is a luxury you cannot afford." After hearing these words I spoke with several friends asking for their thoughts. Initially, most answers were connected to the idea of living within

one's means; using monetary assets to provide for necessities; simplifying life; placing importance on forming and strengthening relationships over acquiring "things". While I agree with these thoughts, I, being the odd person I am, had a different idea / understanding of this quote. As you might guess from the illustration above, I am a person who always felt outside the norm, never quite fitting in with social groups or even sometimes my own family, peers, and close friends. Somehow, hearing this quote gave me comfort and fits with my belief that I am made in the image and likeness of God, uniquely gifted by grace, and loved by God even when I feel lost.

Within the context of my faith, I believe in the importance of making decisions which are in line with how I feel God is calling me to live, rather than simply following what I perceive are the expectations of others. For many years I struggled to look, act, and live as I felt "expected to live" in the eyes of my parents, extended family, teachers, colleagues, friends, members of my religious community, and our culture. While trying to live-up to what others expected or were doing, I felt lost. In reality, I was lost and didn't know who I was. I asked, "Who is Sandy/Sandra, the person God created and loves." I struggled with finding my place. How did I fit in to the complex puzzle called life? For me, wanting what others wanted or had, became a luxury in which I lost myself, but not a luxury I could afford.

My life journey has not been easy and there are many times when I felt isolated, as though I was swimming against the current. Conversely, my journey has also lead to a stronger relationship with God, through Christ Jesus, which I believe is strengthened by an openness to the Holy Spirit. I now feel joy in expressing my uniqueness, becoming the human God created without feeling bound by a society and culture where I find contradictions, divisiveness, bitterness, and hatred. I am finding hope and peace in trusting God and relying on the message Jesus brings of salvation, love, and service.

I feel blessed by who I am and know that God will continue to lead and love me.

Donate almost anything! The list below is not comprehensive, but may give you some ideas.

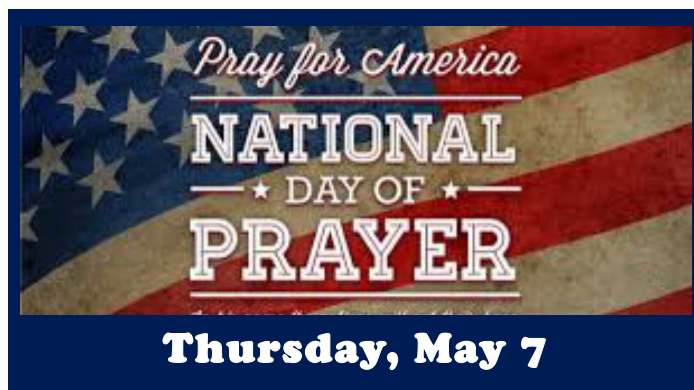

Why May Was Designated As The Month of Mary

A number of traditions link the month of May to Mary. Alfonso (a Spanish king) in the 13th century wrote in his *Cantigas de Santa Maria* about the special honoring of Mary during specific dates in May. Eventually, the entire month was filled with special observances and devotions to Mary.

The origin of the conventional May devotion is still relatively unknown. Herbert Thurston identifies the seventeenth century as the earliest instance of the adoption of the custom of consecrating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin by special observances. It is certain that this form of Marian devotion began in Italy. Around 1739, witnesses speak of a particular form of Marian devotion in May in Grezzano near Verona. In 1747 the Archbishop of Genoa recommended the May devotion as a devotion for the home. Specific prayers for them were promulgated in Rome in 1838.

According to Frederick Holweck, the May devotion in its present form originated at Rome where Father Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus, to counteract infidelity and immorality among the students, made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary. From Rome the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin rite.

In Rome by 1813, May devotions were held in as many as twenty churches. From Italy, May devotions soon spread to France. In Belgium, the May devotions, at least as a private devotion, were already known by 1803. The tradition of honoring Mary in a month-long May devotion spread eventually around the Roman Catholic world in the 19th century together with a month-long devotion to Jesus in June and the Rosary in October.

In his 1965 encyclical, *Mense Maio*, Pope Paul VI identified the month of May as an opportune time to incorporate special prayers for peace into traditional May devotions. Pope Pius XII, recognizing traditional precedents, proclaimed the "Queenship of Mary" through his encyclical, *Ad Caeli Reginam*.

Feast Day of Saints Philip and James May 3



Philip is mentioned as one of the Apostles in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and in Acts. Aside from the lists, he is mentioned only in the Gospel of John. He was called by Jesus Himself and was present at the miracle of the loaves and fishes. According to tradition he preached in Greece and was crucified upside down at Hierapolis under Emperor Domitian.

James, Son of Alphaeus. Nothing is known about him other than his name and that Jesus chose him to be one of the 12 apostles. He is also known as James the Lesser to avoid confusing him with James the son of Zebedee, also an apostle and known as James the Greater.
