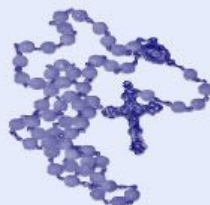
The “Meet Life” Campaign Begins Next Weekend.

How Mother's Day Became A National Holiday

Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia.

Her campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized holiday in the United States began in 1905, the year her mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, died. Anna Jarvis wanted to honor her mother by continuing the work she started and to set aside a day to honor all mothers because she believed a mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world."

In 1908, Congress rejected a proposal to make Mother's Day an official holiday, joking that they would also have to proclaim a "Mother-in-law's Day".

In 1914, Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day, held on the second Sunday in May, as a national holiday to honor mothers.

Meditating Moments



I don't know when, but at some point in life I developed a deep fear of snakes; a hysterical fear that leaves me screaming whenever I see a snake near me. I know such fear is irrational, and one might think by this time in my life I could let it go. At least now I don't run away, screaming for help or try to destroy the snake. Instead I grab a long stick, rake, or broom and try to force the creature to move far away from me. Having said this, I am still overly cautious for weeks approaching the place where I spotted said snake, ever fearful it might return or have friends lurking under rocks.

Throughout my life I have experienced many fears (only fear of snakes seems to persist) such as fear of failure, illness, the inability to physically care for myself, losing loved ones or friends. During my life most of these fears became reality. To my great surprise, however, I survived. In fact, I believed I experienced significant growth and a strange sense of fulfillment, even when life's realities failed to meet my dreams, goals and expectations.

St. John of the Cross explains fulfillment as reaching a point in life when we reach "our deepest center." He describes this center as the optimum point of human growth, the deepest maturity, before we begin to die. Initially reading his words was very confusing, until I reached into my scientific background. Thinking of plants, I realize that the ultimate point of growth is not the flowering, but the production and distribution of seed. Hence, I ask myself what is the point of ultimate growth for me? Jesus' life provides a window into my answer. Jesus gave himself; he lost everything, pronouncing "It is finished." Jesus gave His life so that you and I might live. Jesus gave His life so that we might experience His Holy Spirit, that the entire world might experience His spirit. When will I reach that point of ultimate fulfillment? I am not speaking about my eventual earthly death, rather I am speaking and praying for a time when I give everything to Christ; when I release my fears, frustrations, pains, and anxiety. A time when I not only express my beliefs, but when I live those beliefs fully and completely, when I finally release all the pent up anger and what-ifs, when I embrace my brothers and sisters with the love and compassion of Jesus, when I let go of faulty expectations, and when I finally embrace God's love, mercy, and forgiveness, not only for myself but for others I have falsely judge unworthy. I know I have yet to find my deepest inner center but I know Jesus is there, waiting for me to release my fears, frustrations, and disappointments to His healing love.

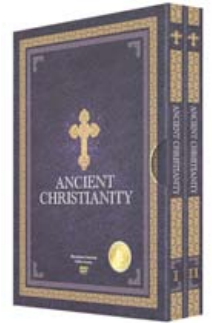

*Our Lady of Fatima
Feast Day
May 13*

May 13 is the anniversary of the first apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children in the small village of Fatima in Portugal in 1917. She appeared six times between May 13, 1917 and October 13, 1917.

Perhaps the most well known utterance of the apparition of Our Lady at Fatima was her confident declaration that "My Immaculate Heart will triumph". Prior to his becoming Pope Benedict XVI, the then Cardinal Ratzinger interpreted this utterance as follows: "The Heart open to God, purified by contemplation of God, is stronger than guns and weapons of every kind."

The fiat of Mary, the word of her heart, has changed the history of the world, because it brought the Saviour into the world – because, thanks to her Yes, God could become man in our world and remains so for all time. The Evil One has power in this world, as we see and experience continually; he has power because our freedom continually lets itself be led away from God.

But since God himself took a human heart and has thus steered human freedom towards what is good, the freedom to choose evil no longer has the last word. From that time forth, the word that prevails is this: "In the world you will have tribulation, but take heart; I have overcome the world" (Jn 16:33).

The message of Fatima invites us to trust in this promise.
