From the Pastor's Pen

In His public ministries, Jesus walked among the people of Israel, preaching the word, working miracles of life, and reaching out to the need with care and compassion. Crowds followed Him. People wanted to be in his presence, wanted Him always to be with them. Yet he was human, subject to death as every human being is. His death came when He was too young, a death by violence; but death did not claim Him. He rose in a glorious manner, embraced with amazement and joy. Yet his bodily presence as the Risen Lord would not be permanent. He needed to ascend to the Father.

Today the Church celebrates that wondrous event we call the "Ascension." To ascend literally means "to go up." We don't know and can't know what this "up" means. We would not say that the risen Lord Jesus is present somewhere at "home" in a distant universe. Rather it makes more sense to say that Jesus is in a spiritual state of being with the Father and the Holy Spirit. This way of being is beyond our comprehension. It is a mystery. Somehow Jesus is with the Father but also present to us. As we heard the words of Jesus in last Sunday's gospel passage, "I will not leave you orphans." And as St. Paul says (2 Cor 5,7) "we walk by faith, not by sight."

There is a special way that the presence of Jesus remains with us: that all believers live spiritually with the presence of the ascended Lord Jesus spiritually within them. We who are believers show the presence of the Ascended Lord Jesus by the way that we live, especially by the bond of love. So the feast of the Ascension reminds us and sends us as the revelation of the Ascended Lord, now with us in our acts of compassion and love. Today we reaffirm our resolve to be ambassadors of the Ascended Lord.

My prayers are with you each day.

It reminds Americans of the sacrifices made by our veterans while protecting our freedoms.

Meditating Moments



Quite a few years ago when photographs were taken for our Parish directory, there was also an image made of Jesus' face which was a mosaic of the pictures of

parishioners. I remember staring at that image and looking for my family's picture and those of people who became Catholic during my ministry as director of the Christian Initiation of Adults. Remembering this photo/mosaic image brought to the forefront of my mind many visual experiences of Jesus in art. In our worship space there are two profound images: the transfigured Jesus and the crucified Jesus. If you walk downstairs from this space you will see a three dimensional image of the child Jesus with His parents and further down a representation of the resurrected Jesus. Perhaps these images evoke a powerful sense of the first century Jesus to you; one familiar from reading Christian scriptures. This Ascension Sunday my mental image recalls our parish mosaic and the voice of my companion from a week-long training retreat teaching the varied rites of adult initiation. She told me: "I see the face of Christ when I look into your eyes." I was shocked, yet in retrospect she helped me realize that previous images of Christ from my childhood, were lacking.

For forty days following His death Jesus appeared to His disciples and close followers. Most of them did not initially recognize Him, rather recognition came from familiar experiences, such as the breaking of bread. Somehow, at His ascension, however, the disciples became aware of the His presence differently; through expressing their faith. They encountered Jesus in the poor, the sick, the brokenhearted, those forgotten, cast aside, marginalized, or objectified by the rich and powerful of the time. The disciples ministered to them all. I too am challenged to see the face of Christ Jesus, not simply in an artist's creation, but in the faces of my brothers and sisters. Can I recognize Jesus in the present moment? Can I rejuvenate my faith by letting go of preconceived ideas and biases? I believe Jesus is calling me to open my heart, mind, and soul to lovingly serve those individuals He places before me: the hungry, the lonely, the lost and forgotten, those suffering from isolation, fear, hopelessness, or hatred. I believe Jesus is calling me to listen to anyone who is mourning loss or struggling with their spirituality and faith. Reflecting on the disciples following the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, I realize they needed to free themselves of false images and understandings of Jesus and His message, before they could open themselves to His Spirit. Yes, letting go is also letting Jesus' spirit lead me to new understanding, mission, and life.

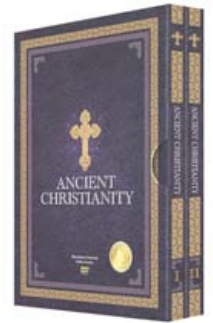

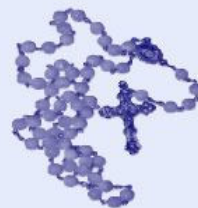
