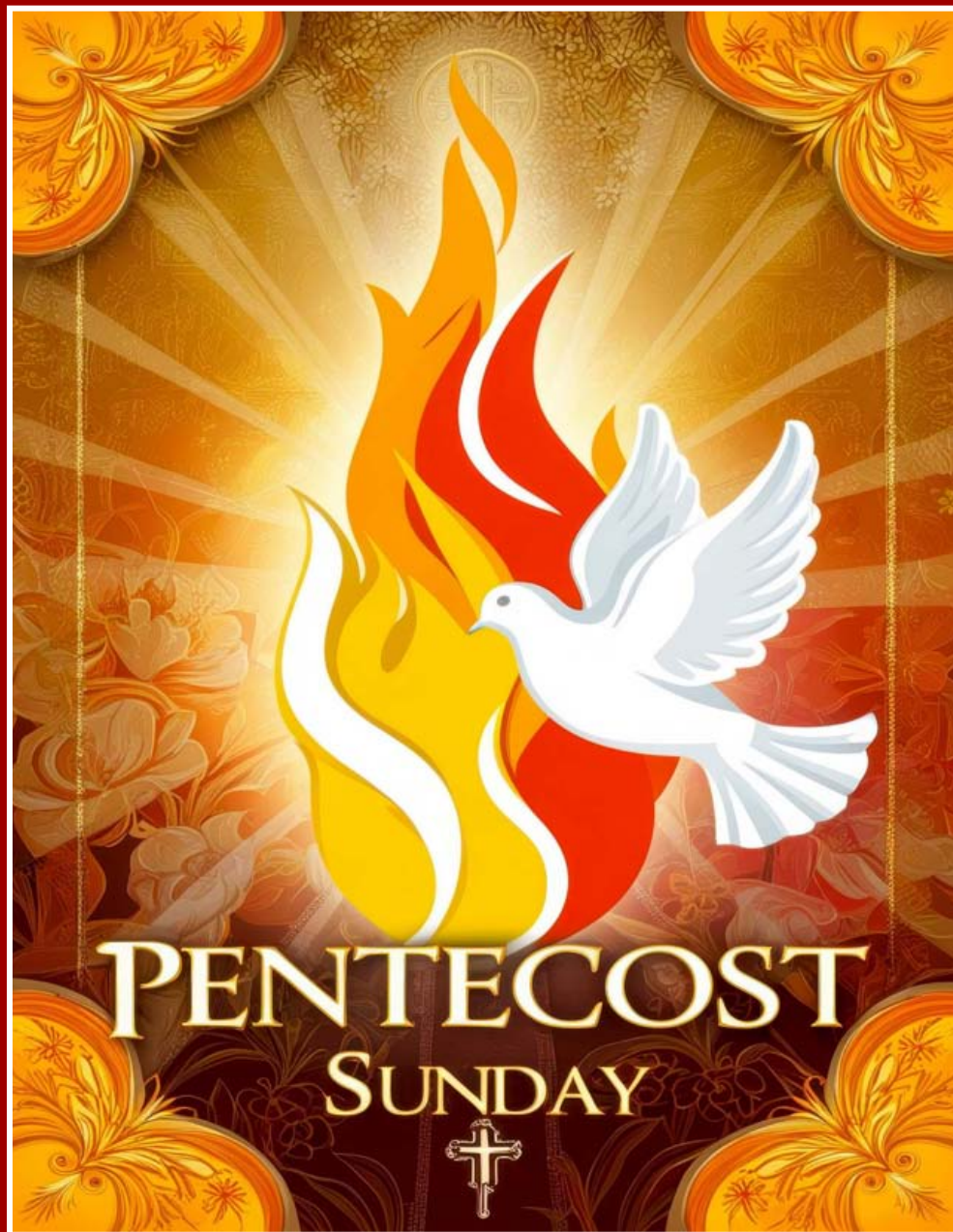

From the Pastor's Pen

"Come, Holy Spirit, come and renew the face of the earth."

As we raise our voice responding to what we heard in the first reading (Acts 2:1-11) **"Come, Holy Spirit, come and renew the face of the earth"** could we imagine the members of Saint James Community gathering in church to celebrate this reception of God's gifts: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord? It could very well be what's happening at each of the Masses we celebrate here. According to Saint Paul in the second reading, "to each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." More essential now than any other times in our lives, we need all benefits, pooled together, to rebuild our world with the Holy Spirit residing in us and acting through us. And through these all together benefits that we are able to rise beyond the present world predicaments to proclaim **"Jesus is Lord."** (cf. 1Corinthians 12:3b)

The current concerns: security in gathering spaces (church, school, shopping), consequences of war and armed conflicts being waged in our world, rising cost of living, fear of infectious diseases, unusual changes in weather, and apprehension of not knowing what's happening next ..., should motivate and compel us to plead for the Holy Spirit to renew the face of the earth. Did Jesus not say *"When two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them"*? (Matthew 18: 20) On this day, as we gather to pray, whether in small group in parish church/chapel/shrine or at home in private gatherings, may we open up our very own selves to breathe in the very precious gift that Jesus imparts, *"Peace be with you!"* This peace is more than just absence of wars or conflicts, more than just being free from worries and anxieties; it is the completeness and wholeness of being empowered by the Advocate to go forth to do greater things (cf. John 14:26ff).

Embraced in Jesus' Peace and equipped with the renewed gifts of the Holy Spirit may we carry on our tasked mission with mercy, compassion, patience, understanding, and gentleness.

Meditating Moments



I am not a person who spends much time on either my cell phone or computer. I do not use social media or scroll through the internet. I don't subscribe to podcasts and only rarely do I watch YouTube videos. I prefer libraries, books, old fashion literature searches, live music,

visits to museums, art galleries, historical sites, and authentic people. My children and grandchildren imply that I am locked in another age, hiding from the modern world and its technology. Perhaps that is true, but I also know where and how I find peace and joy.

Recently my youngest granddaughter won an award for one of her paintings, which featured the face of a teenage girl being pulled by many outside influences: church, school, parents, peers, expectations, and our culture. She told me the painting was a reflection of herself and her search for identity. I confessed, I had been there too.

I spent much of my life trying to please other people and fulfill their expectations. I was in graduate school when a friend told me: "It's okay to be yourself. Quit trying to please others, living their expectations for you. Be kind, loving, embrace your abilities, and be true to yourself." That was the best advice I have ever been given. My transition has been long and at times difficult but I strive to live those words every day. I also think Jesus tells me: *"Be the unique person the Father created you to be. Strive to be loving, forgiving, thoughtful, and present to others. Let the Holy Spirit guide you. Trust in my love! I call you by name and you are mine. I will be with you always."* Thus my guide to finding the authentic Sandra (Sandy) Louise was my friend and angel who Jesus sent into my life. I believe he is strengthened by the Holy Spirit and lives his devout faith. I considered and believed his words, even though contrary to what I heard from others, and I sought Jesus.

Recently Mariann Budde, Bishop of the National Cathedral in Washington D.C. said we should not worry about "what we can do and what we see needs to be done. The line between good and evil runs through the heart [but] God [will] lead me." Listening to her speak reinforced my understanding to embrace my identity and make choices regarding my life. Even when decisions are hard, no one can make them for me, but trusting in Jesus, allowing His spirit to guide me is my true path to inner peace. I know I am loved and forgiven, and at long last, I cherish the person God created. I can live with myself in Jesus' embrace.

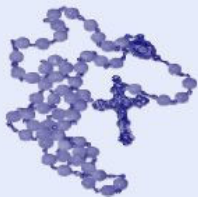

Why We Celebrate Pentecost

Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year, concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the church.



Pentecost celebrates the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

The Holy Spirit gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations

Right after Pentecost Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, preached his first homily to Jews and other non-believers, in which he opened the scriptures of the Old Testament, showing how the prophet Joel prophesied events and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

For this reason, Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church - Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers. The apostles and believers, for the first time, were united by a common language, and a common zeal and purpose to go and preach the Gospel.

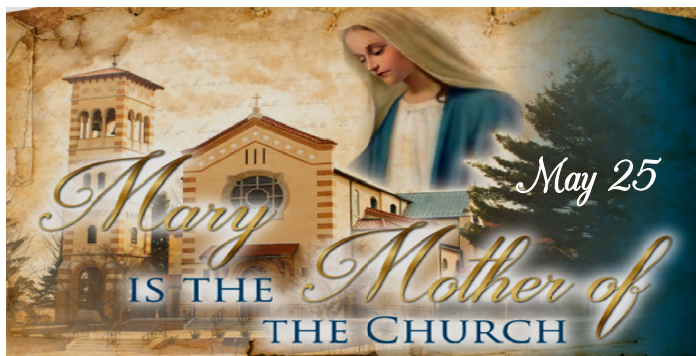
Volunteers Needed to Water Flowers On Our Parish Campus

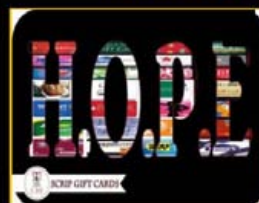


Throughout the centuries, Christians have called upon and honored Mary as their mother.

In 2018, Pope Francis decreed that the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church be inserted into the Roman Calendar on the Monday after Pentecost

In this way, the Church specifically recalls Mary's reception of the Holy Spirit with the Apostles at Pentecost, as well as her desire to protect all who come to her Son in His Holy Church. The many mysteries of Jesus' life that Mary pondered were brought to full understanding in her heart at Pentecost. As the Church was fully established in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, strengthening the Lord's followers to believe in and to proclaim the Gospel, the Blessed Mother was there as the foremost example of what it means to fully say yes to Jesus.

Novena Honoring the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus ~ June 3 - 11



Bishop Johnston is asking our parish's participation in this Novena by committing to completing 250 hours of adoration for our Nation and 250 Works of Mercy during the 9 days leading up to the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 12.

Next weekend Prayer Cards will be available in the Gathering Space along with sign-up sheets for your commitment to participating in this Novena.

We need at least 20 people to commit to adoration every day for 1 ½ hours or at least 30 people to commit to one hour a day during the 9 days of the novena and at least 30 people to commit to one Works of Mercy during the 9 days of the novena. *(see the Works of Mercy and ideas of how to fulfill in next column)*

Corporal Works of Mercy:

1. Feed the hungry: Provide food to those in need.
2. Give drink to the thirsty: Offer water to the parched.
3. Clothe the naked: Donate clothes.
4. Shelter the homeless: Offer a place to stay.
5. Visit the imprisoned: Spend time with those in prison.
6. Care for the sick: Attend to those who are ill.
7. Bury the dead: Ensure the deceased are laid to rest.

Spiritual Works of Mercy:

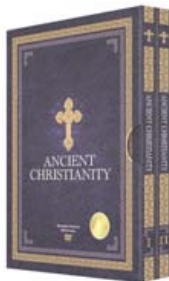
1. Instruct the ignorant: Teach those who lack knowledge.
2. Counsel the doubtful: Offer guidance to the uncertain.
3. Admonish the sinner: Encourage repentance gently.
4. Bear wrongs patiently: Endure wrongs without retaliation.
5. Forgive willingly: Let go of grudges.
6. Comfort the afflicted: Support those who are suffering.
7. Pray for the living and the dead: Intercede through prayer
